PUBLIC HEARINGS

Solar Ordinance

Theisen presented the final draft of the solar ordinance, as revised and approved by the Planning Commission.

A Public Hearing was opened at 6:21 pm.

Evan Carlson, Enterprise Energy, was present to thank staff and the Planning Commission for their thoughtful design of the Ordinance and efforts in such a short amount of time. He expressed that the Ordinance is more restrictive than the current Ordinance, but forward looking and functional.

The Public Hearing was closed at 6:24 pm.

The City Council discussed the Ordinance in depth. Lewandowski requested clarification on energy production reports and the timing of those reports, as well as the definition of "best use" in the Ordinance for development. Elness thanked the Planning Commission for their research and efforts in creating a thoughtful Ordinance and expressed concern over not getting any public input throughout the process. Elness also questioned the decommissioning process, which has not taken place in other communities to date to fully understand. Smith asked clarifying questions around future roadways being considered for setbacks, the financial guarantee being required from developers, terms of underground utilities, use of solar in residential districts, and also expressed a desire to gather public input. Meyer requested clarification on the 10mwh cap and how that was determined, as well as the remaining availability within the community before we achieve the 10mwh (70 acres). Fitzthum thanked the Planning Commission for their efforts and expressed appreciation for the unique Ordinance that focused more on restrictions and less on land use.

The City Council discussed the preference of public input, the best process for public input, and timelines for gathering the public input. Theisen provided clarification that an extension of the Moratorium would be required in order to gather public input. Theisen and Gruber provided timelines of no less than 3 months being needed to provide a survey, gather feedback, and analyze results for Council to make an informed decision on the proposed Ordinance. Fitzthum felt we have had enough public input and there had been enough press on the topic, Meyer felt public input was appropriate but should not require 3 months, Lewandowski requested a survey instead of public open house to expedite the process but overall agreed with desire to gather public input, Smith and Elness advocated for public input that provided an opportunity for the community to have additional awareness of the Ordinance prior to approval.

This is a grant funded position and will require a backfill of the role. He also informed the Council that it will involve mental health check-ins and peer support of the officer selected in order to ensure they remain capable of performing the duties of the job.

Lange also informed the Council that this would be his last meeting, as he took a role in the Black Hills as a City Engineer. He thanked the City for his 1.5 years and introduced Hunter Lunde as his replacement for Sartell.

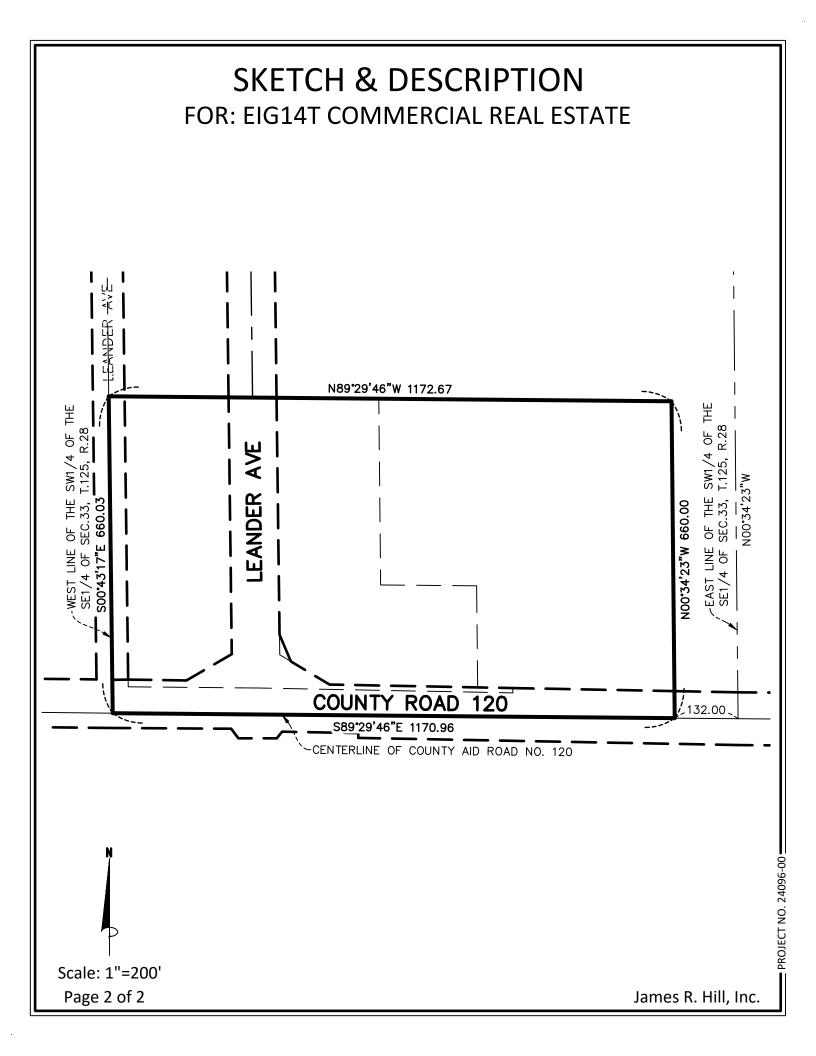

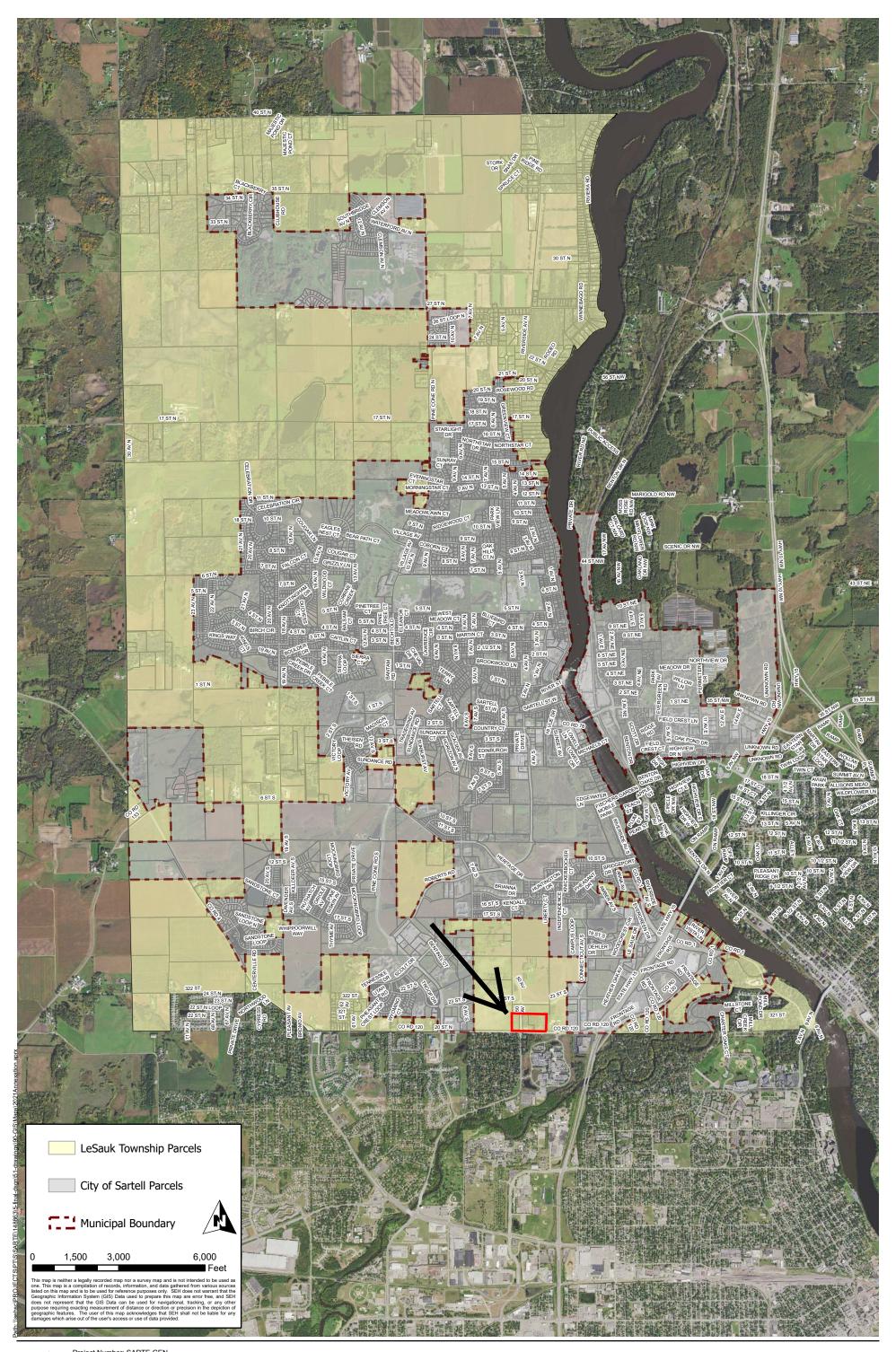

Exhibit B Terms and Conditions of Service

These Terms and Conditions of Service (the "Terms") govern the rights and obligations of Lexipol and Agency under this Agreement. Lexipol and Agency may each be referred to herein as a "party" and collectively as the "parties."

- 1. <u>Definitions</u>. Each of the following capitalized terms will have the meaning included in this Section 1. Other capitalized terms are defined within their respective sections, below.
- 1.1 "Agency" means the department, agency, office, organization, company, or other entity purchasing and/or otherwise subscribing to the Lexipol Services set forth in Exhibit A.
- 1.2 "Agency Data" means data, information, and content owned by Agency prior to the Effective Date, or which Agency provides during the Term of this Agreement for purposes of identifying authorized users, confirming agency or department information, or other purposes that are ancillary to receipt of the Service.
- 1.3 "Agreement" means the combination of the cover sheet (signature page); Exhibit A ("Selected Services and Associated Fees"); this Exhibit B; and any other documents attached hereto and expressly incorporated herein by reference.
- 1.4 "Effective Date" means the date specified on the cover sheet (signature page), or as otherwise expressly set forth and agreed upon by Lexipol and Agency in a writing and defined as the "Effective Date."
- 1.5 "Initial Term" means the period commencing on the Effective Date and continuing for the length of time indicated on Exhibit A. If not so indicated, the default Initial Term is one (1) year from the Effective Date.
- 1.6 "Lexipol Content" means all content in any format including but not limited to: written content, images, videos, data, information, and software multimedia provided by Lexipol and/or its licensors via the Services.
- 1.7 "Services" means all products and services, including but not limited to all software subscriptions, professional services, and ancillary support services, as may be offered by Lexipol and/or its affiliates from time to time.
- **Term; Renewal.** This Agreement becomes enforceable upon signature by Agency's authorized representative, with an Effective Date as indicated on the cover page. 3. Termination.

This Agreement may be terminated by either party, effective immediately, (a) in the event the other party fails to discharge any obligation, including payment obligations, or remedy any default hereunder for a period of more than thirty (30) calendar days after it has been provided written notice of such failure or default; or (b) in the event that the other party makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors or commences or has commenced against it any proceeding in bankruptcy, insolvency or reorganization pursuant to the bankruptcy laws of any applicable jurisdiction.
- 3.3 <u>Effect of Expiration or Termination</u>. Upon the expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason, Agency's access to Lexipol's Services shall immediately cease unless Lexipol has, in its sole discretion, provided for their limited continuation. Lexipol reserves the right to increase fees for Renewal Terms. All fee amounts stated in Exhibit A are exclusive of taxes and similar fees now in force or enacted in the future. Agency is responsible for all third-party fees (e.g., wire fees, bank fees, credit card processing fees). Unless otherwise exempt, Agency is responsible for and will pay in full all taxes related to its receipt of Lexipol's Services, except for taxes based on Lexipol's net income.
- 5. <u>Terms of Service</u>. The following terms and conditions govern access to and use of Lexipol's Services:

- 5.3 Intellectual Property; License. Lexipol's Services and all Lexipol Content are the proprietary intellectual property of Lexipol and/or its licensors, and are protected where applicable by copyright, trademark, and patent laws. Nothing contained in this Agreement or these Terms shall be construed as conferring any right of ownership or use to Lexipol's Services or Lexipol Content. This Agreement shall be construed equally against each party without regard to any presumption or rule requiring construction against the party who drafted this Agreement or any portion thereof.
- 10.3 <u>Invalidity of Provisions</u>. Each provision contained in this Agreement is distinct and severable. A declaration of invalidity or unenforceability of any provision or portion thereof shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. Should any provision or portion thereof be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the parties agree that the reviewing authority should endeavor to give effect to the parties' intention as reflected in such provision to the maximum extent possible.
- 10.4 Compliance: Governing Law. Each party shall maintain compliance with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, and orders relating to its obligations pursuant to this Agreement. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of the state in which Agency is located, without giving effect to any choice of law doctrine that would cause the law of any other jurisdiction to apply.
- **10.5** Assignment. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the other. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement may be assumed by a party's successor in interest through merger, acquisition, or consolidation without additional notice or consent.
- **10.6** <u>Waiver</u>. Either party's failure to exercise, or delay in exercising, any right or remedy under any provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of such right or remedy.
- 10.7 <u>Notices</u>. Any notice required hereunder shall be in writing and shall be made by certified mail (postage prepaid) to known, authorized recipients at such address as each party may indicate from time to time. In addition, electronic mail (email) to established and authorized recipients is acceptable when acknowledged by the receiving party.

Additionally, we are looking to add to our fleet one unmarked vehicle primarily to be used as a task force vehicle for the officer assigned to the CMHTTF, but also as an undercover resource for investigations. Comparable vehicles were priced at another local dealer at almost \$15,000 over the total for both vehicles. The purchase is being made with our one-time public safety aid and meets several of the legislature's goals for the funds. (Community Intervention programs, Community Violence Prevention, Victim Services, and Emergency Services Equipment).

BACKGROUND: The City was approached by Sartell Baseball Association to issue a tax-exempt revenue note to finance the installation of lights at Pinecone Central Park. St. Cloud Financial Credit Union will be the purchaser of the note.

Conduit debt is tax-exempt debt issued in the name of the City on behalf of a private entity, but for which the City has no obligation to pay. The City will charge an issuance fee of ½ of 1% of the original principal amount for non-profit projects. The City also requires that all bond documents related to the issuance of conduit debt be prepared by the City's appointed bond counsel and the borrower shall pay all City costs directly related to the issuance of the bonds.

The proposed issuance falls within our financial policies, and the City's current outstanding conduit debt balances consist of the following entities: Solutions Behavioral Healthcare, Opportunities Matter, Country Manor.

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

We have been asked to serve as Bond Counsel for the proposed issue of a tax-exempt revenue note (the "Note") of the City of Sartell, Minnesota (the "Issuer") to be purchased by St. Cloud Financial Credit Union (the "Lender"). The proceeds of the Note will be loaned by the Issuer to Sartell Baseball Association (the "Borrower") and used to finance the installation of lights for a baseball field located in the City of Sartell (the "Project")

In performing our services as bond Counsel, our client will be the Issuer. Our principal responsibility as Bond Counsel is to provide the Issuer, the Borrower, and the Lender an expert opinion (the "Bond Opinion") as to (i) the validity and enforceability of the Note and the Issuer's obligations under the financing documents, and (ii) exemption of interest on the Note from federal and Minnesota income taxes. We will also assume principal responsibility for drafting the financing documents and any security documents agreed to by the parties. You are also in agreement that we will not be acting as a municipal advisor in regards to this transaction.

The Bond Opinion will be executed and delivered by us in written form on the date the Note is purchased by the Lender and will be based on facts and law existing as of that date. Upon delivery of the Bond Opinion, our responsibilities as Bond Counsel will be concluded with respect to this financing.

In rendering the Bond Opinion, we will rely upon representations of the Issuer and the Borrower set forth in the financing documents, the certified proceedings, and other certifications of public officials, officials of the Issuer and the Borrower, and other persons (including certifications as to the use of Note proceeds and various tax matters) without undertaking to verify the same by independent investigation. As Bond Counsel, we do not review the financial condition

of the Borrower or the financial feasibility of the financing, and we will express no opinion relating to the foregoing.

We understand that the Borrower will be responsible for payment of our fees and disbursements as Bond Counsel. Our fee will be based upon (i) our current understanding of the terms, structure, size, and schedule of the financing represented by the Note and (ii) the time we anticipate devoting to the financing. Such fee may vary: (i) if the principal amount of Note actually issued differs significantly from the current estimated amount, (ii) if the manner in which the Note is marketed (private placement, public offering, etc.) changes, (iii) if material changes in the structure of the financing occur, or (iv) if unusual or unforeseen circumstances arise which require a significant increase in our time or responsibility. If the Note is in fact issued we will submit our statement for services and disbursements to the Borrower at or promptly after the closing.

- Extending the sidewalk from 7th Street North to the sidewalk at Riverview Intermediate School and adding a sidewalk from 5th Street North up to and around the south side of Riverview Intermediate School.

The City was notified in April 2023 that they had been successful in receiving \$389,160 (80% of the construction costs). To meet the funding requirements a Project Memorandum is required along with a specific easement and right-of-way acquisition process. These preliminary design tasks are included in the proposed agreement.

Scope: The Services to be provided by Consultant:

Consultant understands the project scope to include the following:

The City of Sartell received Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) funding to build a separated trail on the south side of Heritage Drive from Amber Avenue South to County Road 1. The grant was a joint application with the school district. The project scope also includes improvements at Riverview School.

The agreement is for the preliminary design, which includes the project memorandum as required by this funding source, right-of-way and easement acquisition coordination services and survey.

Task 1: Project Memorandum

To meet the requirements of the TAP grant funds (\$389,160) a Project Memorandum is required. This task includes using the available information to prepare and get MnDOT's approval of the Project Memorandum.

- Prepare Project Memorandum narrative.
- Prepare Project Figures.
- Prepare preliminary opinion of project costs.
- Solicit environmental reviews and documentation as dictated the Project Memorandum.
- Submit Project Memorandum to MnDOT and respond to agency comments as needed.

Task 2: Right-of-way and Easement Acquisition Coordination

Consultant's scope of easement acquisition services include:

- Prepare Easement Figures and survey legal descriptions.
- Coordinate acquisition needs with Client's appraiser.
- Attend Property owner meetings and assist Client with communications. Assumes up to 10 meetings with property owners.
- Coordinate with the City Attorney for their efforts to obtain signatures and record documents with the County.

Task 3: Survey

Consultant's scope of survey services includes a full topographic survey of the project area.

- Conduct preliminary utility meeting and coordination.

Payments to Consultant for Services and Expenses Using the Lump Sum Basis Option

The Agreement for Professional Services is amended and supplemented to include the following agreement of the parties:

A. Lump Sum Basis Option

The Client and Consultant select the Lump Sum Basis for Payment for services provided by Consultant. During the course of providing its services, Consultant shall be paid monthly based on Consultant's estimate of the percentage of the work completed. Necessary expenses and equipment are provided as a part of Consultant's services and are included in the initial Lump Sum amount for the agreed upon Scope of Work. Total payments to Consultant for work covered by the Lump Sum Agreement shall not exceed the Lump Sum amount without written authorization from the Client.

The Lump Sum amount includes compensation for Consultant's services and the services of Consultant's Consultants, if any for the agreed upon Scope of Work. Appropriate amounts have been incorporated in the initial Lump Sum to account for labor, overhead, profit, expenses and equipment charges. B. Expenses Not Included in the Lump Sum

The following items involve expenditures made by Consultant employees or professional consultants on behalf of the Client and shall be paid for as described in this Agreement.

- 1. Expense of overtime work requiring higher than regular rates, if authorized in advance by the Client.
- 2. Other special expenses required in connection with the Project.
- 3. The cost of special consultants or technical services as required. The cost of subconsultant services shall include actual expenditure plus 10% markup for the cost of administration and insurance.

Braun Intertec Corporation respectfully submits this proposal to complete a geotechnical evaluation for the proposed trail along a portion of Heritage Drive in Sartell, Minnesota.

Project Information

Per the proposal request you provided; we understand the proposed project will include construction of a new trail within the existing ditch on the south side of Heritage Drive. The proposed trail will extend from Amber Avenue South on the west end to County Road 1 on the east. The trail will be bituminous surfaced. Stormwater treatment systems will also be provided as part of the project.

Purpose

The purpose of our geotechnical evaluation will be to characterize subsurface geologic conditions at selected boring locations, evaluate their impact on the project, and provide geotechnical recommendations for the design and construction of the trail and stormwater systems.

Scope of Services

We propose the following tasks to help achieve the stated purpose. If we encounter unfavorable or unforeseen conditions during the completion of our tasks that lead us to recommend an expanded scope of services, we will contact you to discuss the conditions before resuming our services.

Site Access

Based on a site visit, it appears that the borings are accessible to a truck-mounted drill rig. We assume there will be no cause for delays in accessing the boring locations. We are not including tree clearing, debris or obstruction removal or grading of navigable paths.

Depending on access requirements, ground conditions or potential utility conflicts, our field crew may alter the boring locations from those proposed to facilitate accessibility.

Our drilling activities may also impact the vegetation and may rut the surface to access boring locations. Restoration of vegetation and turf is not part of our scope of services.

Staking

We will stake prospective boring locations, as selected by SEH, and obtain surface elevations at those locations using GPS (Global Positioning System) technology. For purposes of linking the GPS data to an appropriate reference, we request that you provide CAD files indicating location/elevation references appropriate for this project, or give us contact information for the consultant that might have such information.

Utility Clearance

Prior to drilling or excavating, we will contact Gopher State One Call and arrange for notification of the appropriate utility vendors to mark and clear the boring locations of public underground utilities. You, or your authorized representative, are responsible to notify us before we begin our work of the presence and location of any underground objects or private utilities that are not the responsibility of public agencies.

Penetration Test Borings

As requested, we will drill 3 standard penetration test borings for the project, extending them to a depth of 14 1/2 feet each. We will perform standard penetration tests at 2 1/2-foot vertical intervals to boring termination depth.

If the borings encounter groundwater during or immediately after drilling of each boring, we will record the observed depth on the boring logs.

If the intended boring depths do not extend through unsuitable material, we will extend the borings at least 5 feet into suitable material at greater depths. The additional information will help evaluate such issues as excavation depth, consolidation settlement, and foundation alternatives, among others. If we identify a need for deeper (or additional) borings, we will contact you prior to increasing our total estimated drilled footage and submit a Change Order summarizing the anticipated additional effort and the associated cost, for your review and authorization.

Borehole Abandonment

We will backfill our boring locations immediately after completing the drilling at each location. Minnesota Statutes require sealing temporary borings that are 15 feet deep or deeper. Based on our proposed subsurface characterization depths, we currently do not anticipate having to seal any of the boreholes.

Over time, subsidence of borehole backfill may occur, requiring releveling of surface grades or replacing bituminous or concrete patches. We are not assuming responsibility for re-leveling or re-patching after we complete our fieldwork.

Sample Review and Laboratory Testing

We will return recovered samples to our laboratory, where a geotechnical engineer will visually classify and log them. To help classify the materials encountered and estimate the engineering properties necessary to our analyses, we anticipate performing 5 mechanical analyses (through a #200 sieve only). We will adjust the actual number and type of tests based on the results of our borings.



Engineering Analyses

We will use data obtained from the boring and laboratory tests to evaluate the subsurface profile and groundwater conditions, and to perform engineering analyses related to pavement design and performance.

Report

We will prepare a report including:

- A sketch showing the boring locations.
- Logs of the borings describing the materials encountered and presenting the results of our groundwater measurements and laboratory tests.
- A summary of the subsurface profile and groundwater conditions.
- Discussion identifying the subsurface conditions that will impact design and construction.
- Discussion regarding the reuse of on-site materials during construction.
- Recommendations for preparing pavement subgrades, and the selection, placement and compaction of fill.
- Recommended R value and pavement design section for the trail.
- Estimated infiltration rates based on the soils encountered and the Minnesota Stormwater Manual.

We will only submit an electronic copy of our report to you unless you request otherwise. At your request, we can also send the report to additional project team members.

Schedule

We anticipate performing our work according to the following schedule.

- Drill rig mobilization within about 2 weeks following receipt of written authorization
- Field exploration 1 day on site to complete the work
- Classification and laboratory testing within 1 week after completion of field exploration
- Preliminary results within 1 week after completion of field exploration
- Report submittal within about 2 weeks of completing the field exploration

If we cannot complete our proposed scope of services according to this schedule due to circumstances beyond our control, we may need to revise this proposal prior to completing the remaining tasks.



Fees

We will furnish the services described in this proposal for a lump sum fee of \$5,865. Please note that our drilling/field services were budgeted to occur within our normal work hours of 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. If conditions occur that require us to work outside of these hours, we will request additional fees to cover our additional overtime costs.

Our work may extend over several invoicing periods. As such, we will submit partial progress invoices for work we perform during each invoicing period.

General Remarks

We will be happy to meet with you to discuss our proposed scope of services further and clarify the various scope components.

We appreciate the opportunity to present this proposal to you. Please sign and return a copy to us in its entirety.

We based the proposed fee on the scope of services described and the assumptions that you will authorize our services within 30 days and that others will not delay us beyond our proposed schedule.

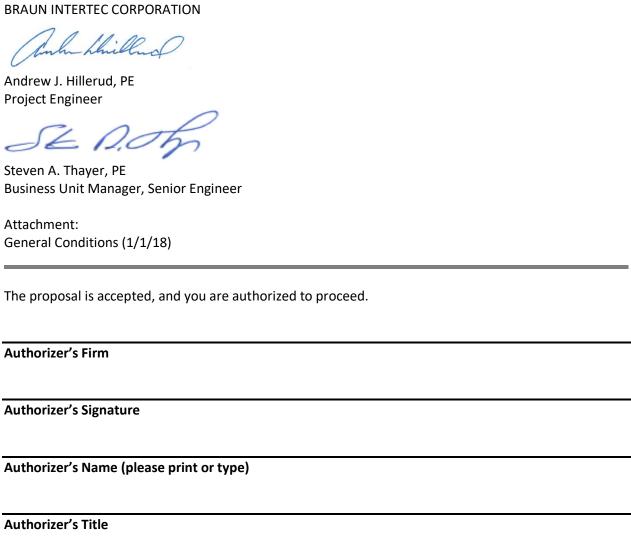

Section 1: Agreement

You accept the inherent risk that samples or observations may not be representative of things not sampled or seen and further that site conditions may vary over distance or change over time.

- **2.4** Our duties do not include supervising or directing your representatives or contractors or commenting on, overseeing, or providing the means and methods of their services unless expressly set forth in this Agreement. We hereby grant you a license to use the reports and related information we provide only for the related project and for the purposes disclosed to us. You may not transfer our reports to others or use them for a purpose for which they were not prepared without our written approval. You agree to indemnify, defend, and hold us harmless from claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorney fees, arising out of such a transfer or use.
- **4.3** If you do not pay for Services in full as agreed, we may retain work not yet delivered to you and you agree to return to us all of our work that is in your possession or under your control.
- **4.4** Samples and field data remaining after tests are conducted and field and laboratory equipment that cannot be adequately cleansed of contaminants are and continue to be your property. They may be discarded or returned to you, at our discretion, unless within 15 days of the report date you give us written direction to store or transfer the materials at your expense.
- **4.5** Electronic data, reports, photographs, samples, and other materials provided by you or others may be discarded or returned to you, at our discretion, unless within 15 days of the report date you give us written direction to store or transfer the materials at your expense.

Any action not brought within that one year time period shall be barred, without regard to any other limitations period set forth by law or statute. We will not be liable unless you have notified us within 30 days of the date of such breach and unless you have given us an opportunity to investigate and to recommend ways of mitigating damages. You agree not to make a claim against us unless you have provided us at least 30 days prior to the institution of any legal proceeding against us with a written certificate executed by an appropriately licensed professional specifying and certifying each and every act or omission that you contend constitutes a violation of the standard of care governing our professional services. Should you fail to meet the conditions above, you agree to fully release us from any liability for such allegation.
- 6.4 For you to obtain the benefit of a fee which includes a reasonable allowance for risks, you agree that our aggregate liability for all claims will not exceed the fee paid for Services or \$50,000, whichever is greater. If you are unwilling to accept this allocation of risk, we will increase our aggregate liability to \$100,000 provided that, within 10 days of the date of this Agreement, you provide payment in an amount that will increase our fees by 10%, but not less than \$500, to compensate us for the greater risk undertaken. This increased fee is not the purchase of insurance.
- 6.5 You agree to indemnify us from all liability to others in excess of the risk allocation stated herein and to insure this obligation. In addition, all indemnities and limitations of liability set forth in this Agreement apply however the same may arise, whether in contract, tort, statute, equity or other theory of law, including, but not limited to, the breach of any legal duty or the fault, negligence, or strict liability of either party.
- **6.6** This Agreement shall be governed, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the state in which our servicing office is located, without regard to its conflict of laws rules. The laws of the state of our servicing office will govern all disputes, and all claims shall be heard in the state or federal courts for that state. Each of us waives trial by jury.

6.7 No officer or employee acting within the scope of employment shall have individual liability for his or her acts or omissions, and you agree not to make a claim against individual officers or employees.

Section 7: General Indemnification

- 7.1 We will indemnify and hold you harmless from and against demands, damages, and expenses of others to the comparative extent they are caused by our negligent acts or omissions or those negligent acts or omissions of persons for whom we are legally responsible. You will indemnify and hold us harmless from and against demands, damages, and expenses of others to the comparative extent they are caused by your negligent acts or omissions of persons for whom you are legally responsible.
- **7.2** To the extent it may be necessary to indemnify either of us under Section 7.1, you and we expressly waive, in favor of the other only, any immunity or exemption from liability that exists under any worker compensation law.
- 7.3 You agree to indemnify us against losses and costs arising out of claims of patent or copyright infringement as to any process or system that is specified or selected by you or by others on your behalf.

Section 8: Miscellaneous Provisions

- **8.1** We will provide a certificate of insurance to you upon request. Any claim as an Additional Insured shall be limited to losses caused by our negligence.
- **8.2** You and we, for ourselves and our insurers, waive all claims and rights of subrogation for losses arising out of causes of loss covered by our respective insurance policies.
- **8.3** Neither of us will assign or transfer any interest, any claim, any cause of action, or any right against the other. Neither of us will assign or otherwise transfer or encumber any proceeds or expected proceeds or compensation from the project or project claims to any third person, whether directly or as collateral or otherwise.
- **8.4** This Agreement may be terminated early only in writing. You will compensate us for fees earned for performance completed and expenses incurred up to the time of termination.
- **8.5** If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, then such provision will be modified to reflect the parties' intention. All remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- **8.6** No waiver of any right or privilege of either party will occur upon such party's failure to insist on performance of any term, condition, or instruction, or failure to exercise any right or privilege or its waiver of any breach.

After careful review and consideration, the council decided to move forward with a phased approach to address the flooding impacts. The council gave direction to proceed with the following tasks:

- Additional analysis / modeling to assess the upstream and downstream impacts of improvement options.
- Complete Survey and Final Design for recommended Alternative 5.
- Start the permitting process for construction of Alternative 5.

The Consultant is proposing to complete the Ditch 13 Improvements as two projects to try and expedite the construction and reduce the risk of further flood related erosion issues in the spring of 2024. This also reduces the chances that spring erosion will drastically alter the existing conditions surveyed the previous fall, potentially leading to construction change orders. The phases are described as follows:

- Project 1: Construct emergency stream stabilization under US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE)
 Nationwide Permit 45.
 - USACE Nationwide Permit 45 permits the repair of uplands damaged by discrete events.
 - Stabilization design will account for change in flow resulting from proposed Alternative 5.
- Project 2: Construct final design of Alternative 5.
 - Construction will be performed under separate environmental permitting and construction contract.

Scope: The Services to be provided by Consultant:

Task 1: Upstream and Downstream Impact Analysis

Consultant's scope of work to include expanding the existing watershed modeling and analysis to assess the downstream impacts to the Mississippi River and the upstream impacts to Bakers Lake

- Up to three alternate options/routes for a new outlet from Bakers Lake. These alternates will utilize the future 15th Street North corridor if grades allow and include additional storage where appropriate.
- Alternative 5, as described above, and 2022 North Central Watab Watershed Study, including the stabilization of Ditch 13 from 13th Avenue North to 2 ½ Street North.
- Up to two alternate options to re-route drainage to the south and provide additional storage.
- Up to two options to mitigate downstream flood impacts, with the following goals:
 - o Limit erosion and flooding impacts along Ditch 13 and Watab River to the Mississippi.
 - Protection of existing lift station.
 - o Reduction of flooding of Pinecone Road and 2 ½ Street North.
- Meetings:
 - o Consultant will meet with City staff to review analysis results (assumes 2 meetings).
 - Consultant will attend a council workshop/meeting to review analysis results and obtain direction to move forward.
- Deliverables:
 - Summary report of the alternative(s) analysis parameters, analysis results, and recommendations for future flood mitigation project phases.
 - Flood impact maps for each alternative.

Task 2: Topographic Survey

Consultant's scope of survey services includes a full topographic survey of the project area for the design of Alternative 5 and stabilization of Ditch 13:

- Place Gopher State One-Call utility locate request.
- Preliminary utility meeting and coordination.
- Topographic survey of the project area.
- Spot survey for downstream and upstream impact analysis.

Task 3: Ditch Stabilization Design

Consultant's scope of work to include preliminary design of the bank stabilization. This preliminary design will be used to pursue an emergency permit for bank stabilization. Consultants scope includes the following:

- Site visit to walk the ditch and identify location and severity of erosion along Ditch 13.
- Perform slope stability assessment based on site visit observations and watershed model updates.
- Develop preliminary (30%) ditch stabilization design concept to be used for emergency stabilization.

- Agency coordination.

Additional Services:

Services from Consultant not listed above, if required or requested, can be provided to the Client at our normal hourly rates.

Assumptions:

- No wetland impacts will occur for project construction. If the final design process indicates wetlands will be impacted, that service will be provided on an hourly basis.
- Soil borings and geotechnical evaluation services will be paid directly by the client. Consultant will assist

Payments to Consultant for Services and Expenses Using the Hourly Basis Option

The Agreement for Professional Services is amended and supplemented to include the following agreement of the parties:

A. Hourly Basis Option

The Client and Consultant select the hourly basis for payment for services provided by Consultant. Consultant shall be compensated monthly. Monthly charges for services shall be based on Consultant's current billing rates for applicable employees plus charges for expenses and equipment.

B. Expenses

Their costs are not included in the hourly charges made for services but instead are reimbursable expenses required in addition to hourly charges for services and shall be paid for as described in this Agreement:

- 1. Transportation and travel expenses.
- 2. Long distance services, dedicated data and communication services, teleconferences, Project Web sites, and extranets.
- 3. Lodging and meal expense connected with the Project.
- 4. Fees paid, in the name of the Client, for securing approval of authorities having jurisdiction over the Project.
- 5. Plots, Reports, plan and specification reproduction expenses.
- 6. Postage, handling and delivery.
- Expense of overtime work requiring higher than regular rates, if authorized in advance by the Client.

- 9. All taxes levied on professional services and on reimbursable expenses.
- 10. Other special expenses required in connection with the Project.
- 11. The cost of special consultants or technical services as required. The cost of subconsultant services shall include actual expenditure plus 10% markup for the cost of administration and insurance.

C. Equipment Utilization

The utilization of specialized equipment, including automation equipment, is recognized as benefiting the Client. The Client, therefore, agrees to pay the cost for the use of such specialized equipment on the project. Consultant invoices to the Client will contain detailed information regarding the use of specialized equipment on the project and charges will be based on the standard rates for the equipment published by Consultant.

The Client shall pay Consultant monthly for equipment utilization.

 - The procedures will be performed in accordance with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) Managing Stormwater Sediment Best Management Practice Guidance (May 2017) or MPCA Guidance.
 - Up to three samples will be collected at each of the pond locations.
- Consultant will retain Pace Analytical testing laboratory to complete sediment sample testing.
 - Laboratory analysis will be completed for up to ten (10) sediment samples.
 - Samples will be submitted for chemical analyses for arsenic, copper, carcinogenic Polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbon (PAHs), noncarcinogenic PAHs, and RCRA Metals analysis.
- Consultant will prepare a report documenting sampling methods, comparing sample results to current MPCA Soil Reference Values (SRV's) and provide recommendations regarding disposal or potential reuse of the sediment in reference to MPCA Guidance and solid waste disposal requirements.

Payments to Consultant for Services and Expenses Using the Lump Sum Basis Option

The Agreement for Professional Services is amended and supplemented to include the following agreement of the parties:

During the course of providing its services, Consultant shall be paid monthly based on Consultant's estimate of the percentage of the work completed. BACKGROUND: The Minnesota Legislature recently enacted 2023 Minnesota Session Law, Chapter 63 – HF No. 100 with outlined legislation relating to the legal use of cannabis including, but not limited to, the establishment of the Office of Cannabis Management (OCM), legalizing and limiting the possession and use of cannabis and certain hemp products by adults, providing for licensing, inspection, and regulation of cannabis businesses and hem businesses, taxing the sale of certain cannabis products, establishing grant and loan programs, amending criminal penalties, providing for expungement of certain convictions and providing for temporary regulation of certain edible cannabinoid products.

Given the uncertainty regarding the model ordinances to be developed by the OCM and the broad scope of changes to Minnesota law, the City may adopt an interim ordinance for the purposes of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens. This interim ordinance may regulate, restrict, or prohibit the operation of cannabis businesses within the City of Sartell until January 1, 2025.

Title 7, Chapter 9, prohibits the use of tobacco and e-cigarettes on city-owned property, which includes parks. The Minnesota Legislature recently legalized the use of cannabis under certain circumstances outlined by State Statute. The City has determined that more stringent regulations are needed to prevent the use of cannabis products within City parks to ensure the health, safety, and well being of all of those who patronize the parks, protect patrons from smoke and vapors in the air, pollution on the ground, and non-age-appropriate cannabis use.

AN INTERIM ORDINANCE IMPOSING A MORATORIUM ON THE OPERATION OF CANNABIS BUSINESSES

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Legislature recently enacted 2023 Minnesota Session Law, Chapter 63 – H.F. No. 100 (the "Act"), which outlined legislation relating to the legal use of cannabis including, but not limited to, the establishment of the Office of Cannabis Management ("OCM"), legalizing and limiting the possession and use of cannabis and certain hemp products by adults, providing for the licensing, inspection, and regulation of cannabis businesses and hemp businesses, taxing the sale of certain cannabis products, establishing grant and loan programs, amending criminal penalties, providing for expungement of certain convictions and providing for temporary regulation of certain edible cannabinoid products;

WHEREAS, the Act allows local units of government, like the City of Sartell (the "City"), to regulate cannabis businesses by: (1) requiring local registration of certain cannabis businesses operating retail establishments, (2) adopting reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of cannabis businesses, provided that such restriction do not prohibit the establishment or operation of cannabis businesses, (3) limiting the number of certain cannabis businesses based on the population of the community, and (4) prohibiting the operation of cannabis business within 1,000 feet of a school, 500 feet of a day care, residential treatment facility, or an attraction within a public park that is regularly used by minors, including a playground or athletic field;

WHEREAS, the Act requires the OCM, which was established effective July 1, 2023, to work with local governments to assist in developing model ordinances for reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of cannabis businesses. The Act also requires the OCM to establish additional rules and regulation relating to the operation of cannabis businesses;

WHEREAS, the City will benefit from reviewing and analyzing the OCM's model ordinances, rules, and regulations before making any decisions related to the regulation of cannabis businesses within the City;

WHEREAS, the Act, by enacting Minn. Stat. § 342.13(e), allows a local unit of government that is conducting studies or has authorized a study to be conducted or has held or scheduled a hearing for the purposes of considering adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of cannabis businesses to adopt an interim ordinance applicable to all or part of its jurisdiction for the purpose of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens. The interim ordinance may regulate, restrict, or prohibit the operation of cannabis businesses within the jurisdiction of a local unit of government until January 1, 2025;

WHEREAS, given the uncertainty regarding the model ordinances to be developed by the OCM and the broad scope of the changes to Minnesota law brought about by the Act, the City desires to adopt an interim ordinance for the purpose of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens;

WHEREAS, the City desires to conduct a study for the purpose of considering the adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation

of cannabis businesses as well as the other regulations local units of government may adopt under the Act; and

WHEREAS, the City, after providing at least ten (10) days published notice, held a public hearing regarding the consideration and adoption of an interim ordinance prohibiting the operation of cannabis businesses within the City until January 1, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Sartell City Council adopts the following findings:

- 1. The recitals above are incorporated into the findings.
- 2. The City desires to foster growth and development of businesses within the City and acknowledges the changes brought by the Act to potential cannabis businesses.
- 3. The City has determined to undertake a study to consider: (1) the impact of cannabis businesses on the growth and development of the City; and (2) any reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner to protect the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of the City's citizens.
- 4. The City Council needs an opportunity to conduct a study focusing on the appropriateness of cannabis businesses, codify appropriate ordinance revisions, consider model ordinances to be developed by the OCM, and schedule any public hearings, if necessary.
- 5. The City desires to impose a moratorium on the operation of cannabis businesses within the City until January 1, 2025 in order to adopt regulations and ordinances consistent with state law and guidance, facilitate further consideration of compatibility with future planning and development within the City, and determine if it is reasonable to adopt restrictions on the time, place, and manner on the operation of cannabis businesses.
- 6. An interim ordinance, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 342.13(e), is necessary to allow the City time to update its ordinances and regulations, ensure compliance with state law, and protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of the City's citizens.
- 7. An interim ordinance temporarily prohibiting the operation of cannabis businesses within the City until January 1, 2025 is necessary to protect the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of the City's citizens.
- 8. The City intends to lift or scale back the moratorium as quickly as new ordinances and regulations are adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 342.13(e), the Sartell City Council hereby ordains:

Section 1. Interim Ordinance.

1. Definitions. For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms mean:

Act: The 2023 Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter 63 (H.F. No.

100).

Cannabis Business(es): A business as defined in Minn. Stat. § 342.01, subd. 14.

City: The City of Sartell.

Edible Cannabinoid Product: A product as defined in Minn. Stat. § 151.72, subd. 1(c)

OCM: The Office of Cannabis Management, establish as set forth

in Minn. Stat. § 342.02, subd. 1.

Ordinance: This interim ordinance, which is adopted pursuant to Minn.

Stat. § 342.13(e).

- 2. Study Authorized. The City Council hereby authorizes and directs the City Administrator to have City staff and consultants conduct a study regarding the adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses, as well as the other potential local regulations allowed under the Act, and report to the City Council on the potential regulation of Cannabis Businesses. The study shall include, but is not limited to, the model ordinances and regulations the OCM is directed to draft under Minn. Stat. § 342 and any other matters staff may determine are relevant to the City Council's consideration of regulating Cannabis Businesses. City staff can then make recommendations to the City Council as to if and what types of regulations should be adopted.
- **3. Moratorium.** A moratorium is hereby imposed regarding the operating of Cannabis Businesses within the City. During the term of this Ordinance, no business, person, or entity may establish or operate a Cannabis Business within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City. The City shall not accept, process, or act on any application, site plan, building permit, zoning requires, or other approval, including any requested confirmation, certification, approval, or other request from the OCM or other governmental entity requested the City review any application or proposal for a business proposing to engage in the operation of a Cannabis Business.
- **4. Violation.** During the term of this moratorium, it is a violation of the Ordinance for any business, person, or entity to establish or operate a Cannabis Business within the City.
- **5. Enforcement and Penalty.** The City may enforce this Ordinance by injunction or any other appropriate civil remedy in any court of competent jurisdiction. A violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor. Each day a violation occurs shall be considered a separate offense. A violation may result in the City reporting the violation to the OCM if relevant to the OCM licensing.
- **6. Exceptions.** The moratorium imposed by this Ordinance does not apply to: (1) the continued operation of a business as part of the Medical Cannabis Program administered by the Minnesota Department of Health that was lawfully operating within the City prior to July 1, 2023; or (2) the lawful sale of Edible Cannabinoid Products in compliance with Minnesota Statutes, section 151.72. Nothing in this Ordinance exempts a business, person, or entity that is selling Edible Cannabinoid Products from having to comply with all requirements and prohibitions of applicable laws and ordinances.

- **7. Duration.** This Ordinance shall become effective on the first day of publication after adoption and shall remain in effect until January 1, 2025. This Ordinance may be repealed earlier upon the effective date of an ordinance adopting or amending reasonable restrictions on the time, place and manner of the operation of a Cannabis Business within the City or by resolution of the City Council terminating this Ordinance prior to the expiration date.
- **8. Severability.** Every section, provision, and part of this Ordinance is declared severable from every other section, provision, and part thereof. If any section, provision, or part of this Ordinance is held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not invalidate any other section, provision, or part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Summary Publication.

At least four-fifths of the City Council's member direct the City Administrator to publish only the title and summary of this Ordinance as follows:

"AN INTERIM ORDINANCE IMPOSING A MORATORIUM ON THE A ON THE OPERATION OF CANNABIS BUSINESSES. It is the intent and effect of this Ordinance to prohibit the operation of cannabis businesses until January 1, 2025 so the City of Sartell can study the effects of such activities, the appropriateness of existing regulations and designations, and ensure that regulations and designations are consistent with existing law and adequately protect the public health, safety, and welfare."

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 7, CHAPTER 9 OF THE SARTELL CITY CODE

WHEREAS, Title 7, Chapter 9 of the Sartell City Code prohibits the use of tobacco and e-cigarettes on city-owned property, which includes parks; and

WHEREAS, the regulation of the City's parks is within the City's police powers; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota legislature recently legalized the use of cannabis under certain circumstances outlined by State statute; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that more stringent regulations are needed to prevent the use of cannabis products within the City parks to ensure the health, safety, and wellbeing of all those who patronize the parks to protect patrons from smoke and vapors in the air, pollution on the ground, and non-age-appropriate cannabis use, as allowed by Minnesota Statute § 412.491; and

WHEREAS, by amending Title 7, Chapter 9 of the City Cide, the City's parks can be used to promote the public's health, welfare, safety, recreation, and enjoyment by preventing the inhalation of smoke and fumes from cannabis products that are smoked, preventing the ingesting and additional maintenance of pollution caused by cannabis products and wrappers that are discarded on the ground, and prevent the consumption of cannabis products by children, who are not allowed to consume cannabis products.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Sartell City Council hereby ordains:

1. <u>City Code Revisions:</u> The following changes shall be made to the City of Sartell's City Code (additions shown in underline and deletions shown in strikethrough):

CHAPTER 9 TOBACCO, AND E-CIGARETTE, AND CANNABIS FREE SECTION:

7-9-1: General Conditions

7-9-2: Penalty

7-9-31: GENERAL CONDITIONS

- A. Tobacco and E-Cigarette Use on City-Owned Property is prohibited. This includes parks, trails, greenways, and other outdoor spaces, per Resolution 108-2016.
- B. The use of cannabis products on any City-Owner Property is prohibited. This includes parks, trails, greenways, and other outdoor spaces. For the purpose of this Section, a cannabis product is any product made out of cannabis concentrate, a product infused with cannabinoid, including but not limited to tetrahydrocannabinol, extract or derived from cannabis plants or cannabis flower, and edible cannabis products.

7-9-42: PENALTY: Any person violating any provision of this Chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to penalty as provided in Section 1-4-1 of this Code.

2. This Ordinance shall be effective upon publication.

DRIVEWAY, SIDEWALK, CURB OR GUTTERS/APRON, RAIN GARDEN, SURFACING OF BOULEVARDS

7-8-1: Permits Required, Exceptions

7-8-4: Regulations

7-8-1: **PERMITS REQUIRED, EXCEPTIONS**

- A. No person shall construct or repair any driveway, sidewalk, curb or other impervious surfacing within the public right-of-way outside the normal vehicle traveled area, on or within any public street, alley or other public property without first obtaining a permit from the city.
- B. Permits will not be required for the initial construction of streets, curb and gutter, aprons, driveways and sidewalks within new subdivisions.

7-8-2: **GENERAL CONDITIONS**

- A. If a driveway location is changed, any and all existing driveway cuts and aprons will be removed and replaced with barrier curb and gutter.
- B. All replacement concrete or bituminous street surfacing, concrete curbs or gutters, sidewalks, apron, shall be constructed in accordance with the current standards for such construction as used by the City on its construction projects and such special requirements established by the City.
- C. Rain gardens located in the right of way shall be maintained by the adjacent property owner. The gardens should be cleaned at least once per year to remove weeds, debris, and excess sediment that has accumulated. Should the regular maintenance not be completed, the city will undertake the maintenance and the costs of this work will be billed to the property owner. Filling of the rain garden within the right of way is not allowed except in those instances where the property owner submits an application requesting a detailed review by the Public Works and Engineering staff. The granting of the removal of the rain garden will only occur if the location of the rain garden is deemed to not be a critical location for the overall functioning of the City storm sewer system. If filling of the rain garden is approved, the property owner, at their own cost, will be responsible for removal of the existing curb cut and installing the full-back curb in its place in order to keep water within the street's curb and gutter. Property owners wishing to create or add a new rain garden within the right of way will need to submit a rain garden application to the City for review and approval. New rain garden locations will be considered and approved on a case-by-case basis. The rain garden application fee and all installation costs shall be the responsibility of the applicant.

7-8-3: **BOND, INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS**

- A. Corporate Surety Bond: Any permittee except a public utility corporation shall file with the Clerk-Treasurer a corporate surety bond in the amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) conditioned that the permittee will:
 - 1. Perform work in connection with the excavation in accordance with applicable ordinances and regulations;
 - 2. Indemnify the City and hold it harmless from all damage caused in the execution of such

- work; and
- 3. Pay all costs and damages suffered by the City by reason of the failure of the permittee to observe the terms of applicable ordinances and regulations or because of negligence in the execution of the work.

The bond shall be approved as to form and legality by the City Attorney.

B. Liability Insurance: Any permittee except a public utility corporation shall furnish proof that the permittee has in existence an insurance policy protecting permittee from liability to the public, including the City, in an amount equal to the maximum claim the City might be required to pay under Minnesota Statutes chapter 466. (Ord. 85-1, 7-8-1985).

7-8-4: REGULATIONS AND GENERAL CONDITIONS

The director of Public Works is authorized to enact reasonable rules and regulations, which shall include the following:

- a. The Property Owner is responsible for any maintenance and/or repairs to the sidewalk(s) located on the Property.
- b. All work shall be performed by a licensed contractor and in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the director.
- c. Payment of permit fees, as determined by council resolution, and payment of all additional costs of inspection incurred by the department.
- d. During construction, the work are shall be guarded by day with suitable barriers and by night with flashing yellow lights to prevent injury or damage to persons or property.
- e. The contractor shall assume full responsibility for all damages to persons or property arising out of the construction, reconstruction or repair of the improvements.
- f. All work shall be performed in accordance with all applicable laws or regulations.
- g. Materials, methods of construction, minimum and maximum width of driveways and sidewalks, shall be subject to the approval of the director.
- h. All driveway aprons shall be concrete construction.
- i. Driveways that lead to new or altered parking areas on private property must comply with applicable zoning requirements.
- j. Duty to correct defects. The permittee shall correct defects in patching, or restoration performed by the permittee or its agents. The permittee, upon notification from the Director, shall correct all restoration work to the extent necessary. The work shall be completed within 10 calendar days of the receipt of the notice from the Director.
- k. Failure to restore. If the permittee fails to restore the right-of-way in the manner and to the condition required by the Director, or fails to satisfactorily and timely complete all restoration required by the Director, the City at its option may do the work. In that event the permittee shall pay to the city, within 30 days of billing, the cost of restoring the right-of-way. If the permittee fails to pay as required, the city may exercise its rights under the construction performance bond.

BACKGROUND: 814 Services LLC has requested \$22,000 to help cover the platting fees which include trunk storm, water, sanitary, and park dedication fees. The approximate cost of this would be less than \$22,000, however without receiving the plat to verify the total buildable area, the request amount is the highest in which the fees would be. The developer provided a site plan which shows a lot that is approximately 1.25 acres in size, the total buildable area will be less than that which would drop the amount closer to the maximum allowable amount under the financial policies of \$20,000.

The developer is proposing an 11,680 square foot daycare center which will service approximately 170 children and have staff of approximately 30 people. According to the financial policy, if the proposed center will provide 150-200 childcare openings, and follow the minimum staff-to-child ratios then they would be eligible for up to \$20,000. The final amount shall be determined at the discretion of the City Council.

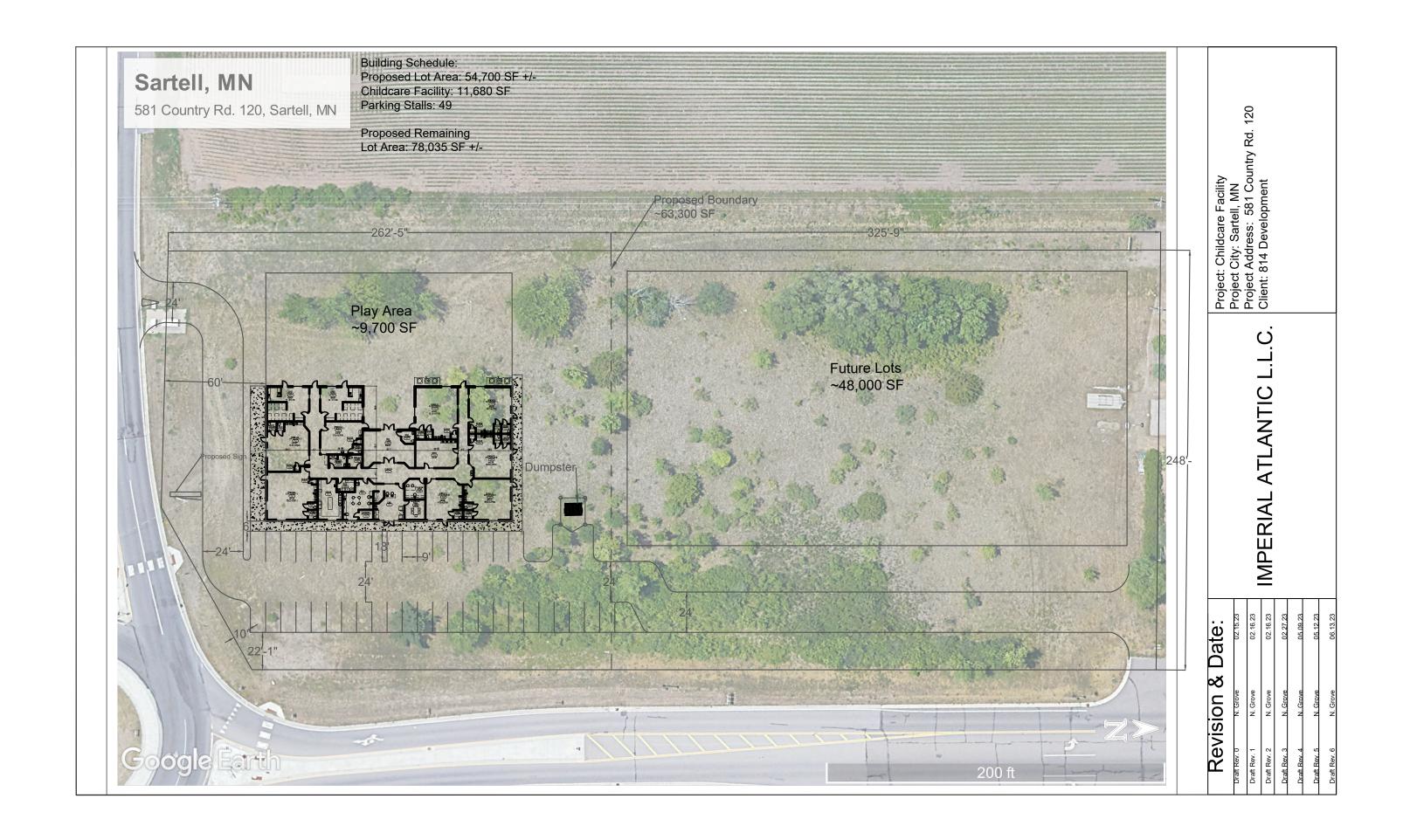

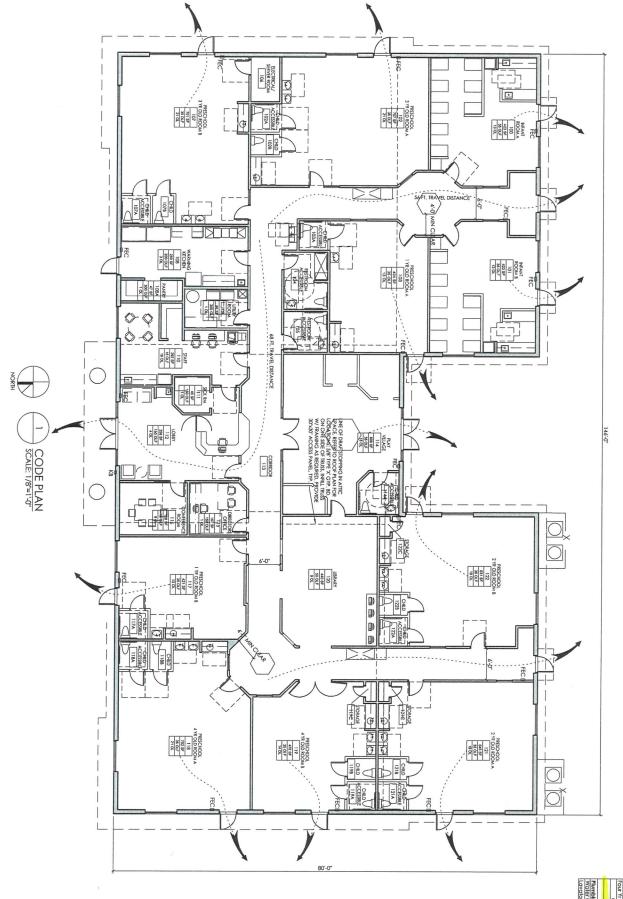

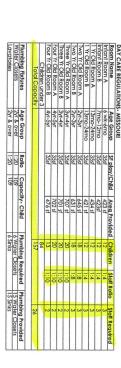

Payments to Consultant for Services and Expenses Using the Lump Sum Basis Option

The Agreement for Professional Services is amended and supplemented to include the following agreement of the parties:

A. Lump Sum Basis Option

The Client and Consultant select the Lump Sum Basis for Payment for services provided by Consultant. During the course of providing its services, Consultant shall be paid monthly based on Consultant's estimate of the percentage of the work completed. Necessary expenses and equipment are provided as a part of Consultant's services and are included in the initial Lump Sum amount for the agreed upon Scope of Work. Total payments to Consultant for work covered by the Lump Sum Agreement shall not exceed the Lump Sum amount without written authorization from the Client.

The Lump Sum amount includes compensation for Consultant's services and the services of Consultant's Consultants, if any for the agreed upon Scope of Work. Appropriate amounts have been incorporated in the initial Lump Sum to account for labor, overhead, profit, expenses and equipment charges. The Client agrees to pay for other additional services, equipment, and expenses that may become necessary by amendment to complete Consultant's services at their normal charge out rates as published by Consultant or as available commercially.

B. Expenses Not Included in the Lump Sum

The following items involve expenditures made by Consultant employees or professional consultants on behalf of the Client and shall be paid for as described in this Agreement.

- 1. Expense of overtime work requiring higher than regular rates, if authorized in advance by the Client.
- 2. Other special expenses required in connection with the Project.
- 3. The cost of special consultants or technical services as required. The cost of subconsultant services shall include actual expenditure plus 10% markup for the cost of administration and insurance.

The Client shall pay Consultant monthly for expenses not included in the Lump Sum amount.

Braun Intertec Corporation respectfully submits this proposal to complete a geotechnical evaluation for the proposed street and utility improvements along portions of the referenced streets.

Project Information

Per the email request from April Ryan, SEH, we understand the proposed project will include the installation of new sanitary sewer, storm sewer and watermain along portions of the roads indicated above. These portions of roadways will also be reconstructed as bituminous-surfaced roads.

Purpose

The purpose of our geotechnical evaluation will be to characterize subsurface geologic conditions at selected boring locations, evaluate their impact on the project, and provide geotechnical recommendations for the design and construction of the utilities and roads.

Scope of Services

We propose the following tasks to help achieve the stated purpose. If we encounter unfavorable or unforeseen conditions during the completion of our tasks that lead us to recommend an expanded scope of services, we will contact you to discuss the conditions before resuming our services.

Site Access

Based on performing the borings in the exiting pavements, it appears that the site is accessible a truck-mounted drill rig. We assume there will be no cause for delays in accessing the boring locations. We are not including tree clearing or obstruction removal.

Depending on access requirements potential utility conflicts, our field crew may alter the boring locations from those proposed to facilitate accessibility.

Staking

We will stake prospective boring locations and obtain surface elevations at those locations using GPS (Global Positioning System) technology.

Utility Clearance

Prior to drilling or excavating, we will contact Gopher State One Call and arrange for notification of the appropriate utility vendors to mark and clear the boring locations of public underground utilities. You, or your authorized representative, are responsible to notify us before we begin our work of the presence and location of any underground objects or private utilities that are not the responsibility of public agencies.

Penetration Test Borings

We propose to drill 35 standard penetration test borings for the project, extending 5 borings to 10 feet, 15 borings to 20 feet, and 15 borings to 24 1/2 feet. We will perform standard penetration tests at 2 1/2-foot vertical intervals to a depth of about 15 feet, and at 5-foot intervals at greater depths.

If the borings encounter groundwater during or immediately after drilling of each boring, we will record the observed depth on the boring logs.

If the intended boring depths do not extend through unsuitable material, we will extend the borings at least 5 feet into suitable material at greater depths. The additional information will help evaluate such issues as excavation depth, consolidation settlement, and foundation alternatives, among others. If we identify a need for deeper (or additional) borings, we will contact you prior to increasing our total estimated drilled footage and submit a Change Order summarizing the anticipated additional effort and the associated cost, for your review and authorization.

MDH Sealing Record

We are planning the deepest borings to be at least 15 feet and less than 25 feet. Therefore, the Minnesota Statutes require us to complete a Sealing Record after our completion of the borings. Our proposal includes the fees for the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) Sealing Record.

In the event we extend our borings to a depth of 25 feet or greater, the MDH requires us to complete and submit a Sealing Notification Form for the project. The submission of the Sealing Notification Form will require a signature from the property owner (or agent).

Borehole Abandonment

We will backfill our boring locations immediately after completing the drilling at each location. Minnesota Statutes require sealing temporary borings that are 15 feet deep or deeper. Based on our proposed subsurface characterization depths, we will seal 667 1/2 linear feet of borehole with grout.

Upon backfilling or sealing boring locations, we will fill holes in pavements with a temporary patch. Over time, subsidence of borehole backfill may occur, requiring releveling of surface grades or replacing bituminous or concrete patches. We are not assuming responsibility for re-leveling or re-patching after we complete our fieldwork.



Sample Review and Laboratory Testing

We will return recovered samples to our laboratory, where a geotechnical engineer will visually classify and log them. To help classify the materials encountered and estimate the engineering properties necessary to our analyses, we anticipate performing 20 moisture content tests, 10 mechanical analyses (through a #200 sieve only), and 4 organic content tests. We will adjust the actual number and type of tests based on the results of our borings.

Engineering Analyses

We will use data obtained from the boring and laboratory tests to evaluate the subsurface profile and groundwater conditions, and to perform engineering analyses related to pavement design and performance.

Report

We will prepare a report including:

- A sketch showing the boring locations.
- Logs of the borings describing the materials encountered and presenting the results of our groundwater measurements and laboratory tests.
- A summary of the subsurface profile and groundwater conditions.
- Discussion identifying the subsurface conditions that will impact design and construction.
- Discussion regarding the reuse of on-site materials during construction.
- Recommendations for preparing utility and pavement subgrades, and the selection, placement and compaction of fill.
- Recommended R-value for pavement design and recommended pavement layer thicknesses.

We will only submit an electronic copy of our report to you unless you request otherwise. At your request, we can also send the report to additional project team members.

Schedule

We anticipate performing our work according to the following schedule.

- Drill rig mobilization within about 2 to 3 weeks following receipt of written authorization
- Field exploration 5 days on site to complete the work
- Classification and laboratory testing within 1 to 2 weeks after completion of field exploration
- Preliminary results within about 2 weeks after completion of field exploration



Report submittal – within about 3 weeks after the field exploration

If we cannot complete our proposed scope of services according to this schedule due to circumstances beyond our control, we may need to revise this proposal prior to completing the remaining tasks.

Fees

We will furnish the services described in this proposal for a lump sum fee of \$29,380. Please note that our drilling/field services were budgeted to occur within our normal work hours of 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. If conditions occur that require us to work outside of these hours, we will request additional fees to cover our additional overtime costs.

Our work may extend over several invoicing periods. As such, we will submit partial progress invoices for work we perform during each invoicing period.

General Remarks

We will be happy to meet with you to discuss our proposed scope of services further and clarify the various scope components.

We appreciate the opportunity to present this proposal to you. Please sign and return a copy to us in its entirety.

We based the proposed fee on the scope of services described and the assumptions that you will authorize our services within 30 days and that others will not delay us beyond our proposed schedule.



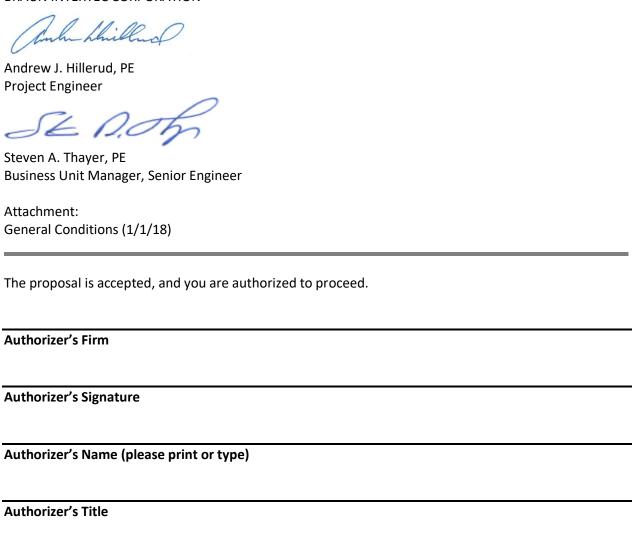

Section 1: Agreement

- 1.1 Our agreement with you consists of these General Conditions and the accompanying written proposal or authorization ("Agreement"). This Agreement is the entire agreement between you and us. It supersedes prior agreements. It may be modified only in a writing signed by us, making specific reference to the provision modified.
- **1.2** The words "you," "we," "us," and "our" include officers, employees, and subcontractors.
- 1.3 In the event you use a purchase order or other documentation to authorize our scope of work ("Services"), any conflicting or additional terms are not part of this Agreement. Directing us to start work prior to execution of this Agreement constitutes your acceptance. If, however, mutually acceptable terms cannot be established, we have the right to terminate this Agreement without liability to you or others, and you will compensate us for fees earned and expenses incurred up to the time of termination.

Section 2: Our Responsibilities

- **2.1** We will provide Services specifically described in this Agreement. You agree that we are not responsible for services that are not expressly included in this Agreement. Unless otherwise agreed in writing, our findings, opinions, and recommendations will be provided to you in writing. You agree not to rely on oral findings, opinions, or recommendations without our written approval.
- 2.2 In performing our professional services, we will use that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised under similar circumstances by reputable members of our profession practicing in the same locality. If you direct us to deviate from our recommended procedures, you agree to hold us harmless from claims, damages, and expenses arising out of your direction. If during the one year period following completion of Services it is determined that the above standards have not been met and you have promptly notified us in writing of such failure, we will perform, at our cost, such corrective services as may be necessary, within the original scope in this Agreement, to remedy such deficiency. Remedies set forth in this section constitute your sole and exclusive recourse with respect to the performance or quality of Services.
- 2.3 We will reference our field observations and sampling to available reference points, but we will not survey, set, or check the accuracy of those points unless we accept that duty in writing. Locations of field observations or sampling described in our report or shown on our sketches are based on information provided by others or estimates made by our personnel. You agree that such dimensions, depths, or elevations are approximations unless specifically stated otherwise in the report. You accept the inherent risk that samples or observations may not be representative of things not sampled or seen and further that site conditions may vary over distance or change over time.

- **2.4** Our duties do not include supervising or directing your representatives or contractors or commenting on, overseeing, or providing the means and methods of their services unless expressly set forth in this Agreement. We will not be responsible for the failure of your contractors, and the providing of Services will not relieve others of their responsibilities to you or to others.
- **2.5** We will provide a health and safety program for our employees, but we will not be responsible for contractor, owner, project, or site health or safety.
- **2.6** You will provide, at no cost to us, appropriate site safety measures as to work areas to be observed or inspected by us. Our employees are authorized by you to refuse to work under conditions that may be unsafe.
- 2.7 Unless a fixed fee is indicated, our price is an estimate of our project costs and expenses based on information available to us and our experience and knowledge. Such estimates are an exercise of our professional judgment and are not guaranteed or warranted. Actual costs may vary. You should allow a contingency in addition to estimated costs.

Section 3: Your Responsibilities

- **3.1** You will provide us with prior environmental, geotechnical and other reports, specifications, plans, and information to which you have access about the site. You agree to provide us with all plans, changes in plans, and new information as to site conditions until we have completed Services.
- **3.2** You will provide access to the site. In the performance of Services some site damage is normal even when due care is exercised. We will use reasonable care to minimize damage to the site. We have not included the cost of restoration of damage in the estimated charges.
- **3.3** You agree to provide us, in a timely manner, with information that you have regarding buried objects at the site. We will not be responsible for locating buried objects at the site. You agree to hold us harmless, defend, and indemnify us from claims, damages, losses, penalties and expenses (including attorney fees) involving buried objects that were not properly marked or identified or of which you had knowledge but did not timely call to our attention or correctly show on the plans you or others furnished to us.
- **3.4** You will notify us of any knowledge or suspicion of the presence of hazardous or dangerous materials present on any work site or in a sample provided to us. You agree to provide us with information in your possession or control relating to such materials or samples. If we observe or suspect the presence of contaminants not anticipated in this Agreement, we may terminate Services without liability to you or to others, and you will compensate us for fees earned and expenses incurred up to the time of termination.

- **3.5** Neither this Agreement nor the providing of Services will operate to make us an owner, operator, generator, transporter, treater, storer, or a disposal facility within the meaning of the Resource Conservation Recovery Act, as amended, or within the meaning of any other law governing the handling, treatment, storage, or disposal of hazardous substances. You agree to hold us harmless, defend, and indemnify us from any damages, claims, damages, penalties or losses resulting from the storage, removal, hauling or disposal of such substances.
- **3.6** Monitoring wells are your property, and you are responsible for their permitting, maintenance, and abandonment unless expressly set forth otherwise in this Agreement.
- **3.7** You agree to make all disclosures required by law. In the event you do not own the project site, you acknowledge that it is your duty to inform the owner of the discovery or release of contaminants at the site. You agree to hold us harmless, defend, and indemnify us from claims, damages, penalties, or losses and expenses, including attorney fees, related to failures to make disclosures, disclosures made by us that are required by law, and from claims related to the informing or failure to inform the site owner of the discovery of contaminants.

Section 4: Reports and Records

- **4.1** Unless you request otherwise, we will provide our report in an electronic format.
- **4.2** Our reports, notes, calculations, and other documents and our computer software and data are instruments of our service to you, and they remain our property. We hereby grant you a license to use the reports and related information we provide only for the related project and for the purposes disclosed to us. You may not transfer our reports to others or use them for a purpose for which they were not prepared without our written approval. You agree to indemnify, defend, and hold us harmless from claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorney fees, arising out of such a transfer or use.
- **4.3** If you do not pay for Services in full as agreed, we may retain work not yet delivered to you and you agree to return to us all of our work that is in your possession or under your control.
- **4.4** Samples and field data remaining after tests are conducted and field and laboratory equipment that cannot be adequately cleansed of contaminants are and continue to be your property. They may be discarded or returned to you, at our discretion, unless within 15 days of the report date you give us written direction to store or transfer the materials at your expense.
- **4.5** Electronic data, reports, photographs, samples, and other materials provided by you or others may be discarded or returned to you, at our discretion, unless within 15 days of the report date you give us written direction to store or transfer the materials at your expense.

Section 5: Compensation

- **5.1** You will pay for Services as stated in this Agreement. If such payment references our Schedule of Charges, the invoicing will be based upon the most current schedule. An estimated amount is not a firm figure. You agree to pay all sales taxes and other taxes based on your payment of our compensation. Our performance is subject to credit approval and payment of any specified retainer.
- **5.2** You will notify us of billing disputes within 15 days. You will pay undisputed portions of invoices upon receipt. You agree to pay interest on unpaid balances beginning 30 days after invoice dates at the rate of 1.5% per month, or at the maximum rate allowed by law.
- **5.3** If you direct us to invoice a third party, we may do so, but you agree to be responsible for our compensation unless the third party is creditworthy (in our sole opinion) and provides written acceptance of all terms of this Agreement.
- **5.4** Your obligation to pay for Services under this Agreement is not contingent on your ability to obtain financing, governmental or regulatory agency approval, permits, final adjudication of any lawsuit, your successful completion of any project, receipt of payment from a third party, or any other event. No retainage will be withheld.
- **5.5** If you do not pay us in accordance with this Agreement, you agree to reimburse all costs and expenses for collection of the moneys invoiced, including but not limited to attorney fees and staff time.
- **5.6** You agree to compensate us in accordance with our Schedule of Charges if we are asked or required to respond to legal process arising out of a proceeding related to the project and as to which we are not a party.
- 5.7 If we are delayed by factors beyond our control, or if project conditions or the scope or amount of work changes, or if changed labor conditions result in increased costs, decreased efficiency, or delays, or if the standards or methods change, we will give you timely notice, the schedule will be extended for each day of delay, and we will be compensated for costs and expenses incurred in accordance with our Schedule of Charges.
- **5.8** If you fail to pay us in accordance with this Agreement, we may consider the default a total breach of this Agreement and, at our option, terminate our duties without liability to you or to others, and you will compensate us for fees earned and expenses incurred up to the time of termination.
- **5.9** In consideration of our providing insurance to cover claims made by you, you hereby waive any right to offset fees otherwise due us.
- Section 6: Disputes, Damage, and Risk Allocation 6.1 Each of us will exercise good faith efforts to resolve disputes without litigation. Such efforts will include, but not be limited to, a meeting(s)

- attended by each party's representative(s) empowered to resolve the dispute. Before either of us commences an action against the other, disputes (except collections) will be submitted to mediation.
- 6.2 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, neither party hereto shall be responsible or held liable to the other for punitive, indirect, incidental, or consequential damages, or liability for loss of use, loss of business opportunity, loss of profit or revenue, loss of product or output, or business interruption.
- **6.3** You and we agree that any action in relation to an alleged breach of our standard of care or this Agreement shall be commenced within one year of the date of the breach or of the date of substantial completion of Services, whichever is earlier, without regard to the date the breach is discovered. Any action not brought within that one year time period shall be barred, without regard to any other limitations period set forth by law or statute. We will not be liable unless you have notified us within 30 days of the date of such breach and unless you have given us an opportunity to investigate and to recommend ways of mitigating damages. You agree not to make a claim against us unless you have provided us at least 30 days prior to the institution of any legal proceeding against us with a written certificate executed by an appropriately licensed professional specifying and certifying each and every act or omission that you contend constitutes a violation of the standard of care governing our professional services. Should you fail to meet the conditions above, you agree to fully release us from any liability for such allegation.
- 6.4 For you to obtain the benefit of a fee which includes a reasonable allowance for risks, you agree that our aggregate liability for all claims will not exceed the fee paid for Services or \$50,000, whichever is greater. If you are unwilling to accept this allocation of risk, we will increase our aggregate liability to \$100,000 provided that, within 10 days of the date of this Agreement, you provide payment in an amount that will increase our fees by 10%, but not less than \$500, to compensate us for the greater risk undertaken. This increased fee is not the purchase of insurance.
- 6.5 You agree to indemnify us from all liability to others in excess of the risk allocation stated herein and to insure this obligation. - **8.2** You and we, for ourselves and our insurers, waive all claims and rights of subrogation for losses arising out of causes of loss covered by our respective insurance policies.
- **8.3** Neither of us will assign or transfer any interest, any claim, any cause of action, or any right against the other. Neither of us will assign or otherwise transfer or encumber any proceeds or expected proceeds or compensation from the project or project claims to any third person, whether directly or as collateral or otherwise.
- **8.4** This Agreement may be terminated early only in writing. You will compensate us for fees earned for performance completed and expenses incurred up to the time of termination.
- **8.5** If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, then such provision will be modified to reflect the parties' intention. All remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- **8.6** No waiver of any right or privilege of either party will occur upon such party's failure to insist on performance of any term, condition, or instruction, or failure to exercise any right or privilege or its waiver of any breach.

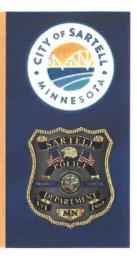
Incident Types (Top 15)

Department Updates

- SPD is moving forward with assigning a 2nd officer to the St. Cloud Police SWAT team. Giving us an opportunity to build on recruitment and retention efforts through additional duty assignments, as well as continuing the strengthening of the bond with SCPD and their response to critical calls within our city. The invaluable skills learned in this assignment also bring leadership and critical tactics to everyday patrol responses. The selection process will be completed by the end of August.
- Updates to the personal appearance policies for SPD have begun. This is most noticeable in the
 approval of beards, but we have also started to test different weight bearing vests / body armor.
 We are in the early stages of redesigning our patch, and with that will engage retired officers and
 community entities to build out a display of SPD historical items in our front lobby area.
- We have informally begun the process of reviewing how we engage with the community regarding special events. This includes national night out, SALT, Coffee and Conversation, PAL, and possible additional new programming. In the upcoming months we will review the effectiveness of these programs and make sure that we are engaging with the community in all age groups, and across different interests and platforms. This could include combining some current initiatives or adding new ones as we move forward. During the process we will look to formalize a group for reviewing this and engage with stakeholders, other city departments and community organizations.

Recaps and Reports

- After acceptance by the council for the CMHTTF position last month. Officer Brennan Olson was selected for the post. He went through an interview process for the position with 3 other officers and panel members from SCPD and the Stearns County Attorney's Office.
- National Night Out was on Aug 1st. SPD staff visited 19 total community events throughout the city.
- Officer Logan Eck has been on-boarded and is currently in the FTO process. We hope to have him on solo patrol by mid-fall.

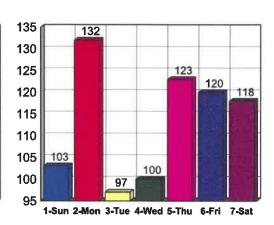
