Subject: RE: Satellite Beach Contamination Concerns

Hi Ms. Barker,

South Patrick Shores Subdivision was assessed by the EPA CERCLA (also known as Superfund) program in 1991 and 1992. At that time, based on the results of the assessment, EPA determined at the area did not qualify for inclusion on the Superfund National Priorities List. South Patrick Shores is on EPA's inventory of sites (call SEMS or Superfund Enterprise Management System) due to the fact that it was evaluated. However, South Patrick Shores is not a "Superfund Site," meaning South Patrick Shores was not added to the National Priorities List and is not subject to a cleanup under EPA's CERCLA authorities.

I will send the Screening Site Inspection report (1992) and related file material in a separate email, as they are too large to include here. It is my understanding that FDEP has provided this information to Brevard County.

If you would like to discuss the Site Investigation report, or have new information that may impact the conclusion, please let me know.
