Bill Burttschell, representing the Greater Sealy Little League, told the council that the Little League has received a large donation of approximately \$400,000 - \$450,000. They would like to use the funds to upgrade and improve the two fields located at the back of the B&PW Park – the Pee Wee field and the T-Ball field, including fencing, grading and removal of roadway near the fields and the placement of a playground in that area. The improvements will be completed by spring.

Councilwoman Lerma moved to accept proposed improvement to replace fencing, grade fields, replace irrigation at the Pee Wee and T-Ball fields as presented. Councilman Hinze seconded the motion. Mayor Pro tem Vrablec called for the vote:
