Mayor Whitehead called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m.

5. Petition(s) and/or Request(s) from the Public.

Michelle Zwicky, a realtor with the Schmidt Road multi-family project, asked that the City Council approve the plans and permits so the project can move forward.

Felicita Fernandez asked what Chapter 28 is referring to on the agenda. She voiced concerns regarding what the Council was changing.

Andy Anderson complimented the Council and Sealy Police Department of the Kid Fish program held at the Park. He said it was a wonderful event and very important for young people.

Berry Lynn, owner of the multi-family development project on Schmidt Road, asked that the Council allow the approval of the plans for the project. He voiced his concerns that another project was granted approval and his project was not.

Vince Wollney, President of the Sealy Chamber of Commerce, spoke in favor of Mr. Lynn's project on Schmidt Road and said this type of development is needed in Sealy.

b. Discuss, consider, and possible action to adopt an ordinance regulating engine brakes. (*This is the second of two readings*).

7. Discussion and possible action regarding operation of the Main Street Program.

Lloyd Merrell told Council that the Sealy EDC board met on Wednesday and approved the acceptance of responsibility of the Main Street Program.

Tim Kirwin said there are steps that need to be taken and before the process can be complete, including by-law changes for EDC and Main Street, and amendments to the City Code of Ordinances regarding the Main Street Board.

Councilwoman Lerma moved to authorize staff to continue in the direction of Main Street Program operating under the Sealy EDC. Councilman Burttschell seconded the motion. Mayor Whitehead called for the vote:

Lloyd Merrell reported that staff is in the process of getting cost estimates and engineering on the proposed downtown revitalization program. He met with the Levine Foundation, and they have committed funds for the program. Robert Worley is going to speak with some of the larger companies in Sealy and request contributions to the project.

Councilwoman Lerma moved to authorize the City Manager to continue with pricing and planning for the Main Street Revitalization Program. Councilwoman Vrablec seconded the motion. Mayor Whitehead called for the vote:
