- He requested a future agenda item to engineer, bid, and construct drainage channel along Allen's Creek between Rexville Road and the I-10 Feeder Road.
- He requested a future agenda item to discuss the Sealy Community Foundation returning \$60,000 to the City of Sealy.
- He requested an executive session to discuss the purchase of land/real estate for Allen's Creek widening.

Councilwoman Sullivan

- She requested a presentation and discussion regarding the platting process. She thinks this will be beneficial for both council members and citizens.
- She said there was a reference to changes to the landscape ordinance. She would like staff to provide copies of the legislative changes

Councilwoman Vrablec

• She agreed that there needs to be a future workshop to discuss zoning.

Councilman Noack

- He requested a future agenda item to review and approve the food establishment ordinance with a new rating system.
- He requested a future agenda item to discuss the drainage between Kloecker Road and the Retreat at Sealy. He wants to make sure the e-mails between himself and Mike Zapalac and attachments are included in the meeting packet.
- He would like a work flow chart that shows the platting process.
- He would like an update regarding changes to the Sealy Oaks plans. He said this can be provided in the weekly city manager report.
- He would like the mayor, city manager and city attorney to put together a document that spells out what council can an cannot do regarding land use. He believes this will help clear up citizens' concerns and would be a good educational tool.

Mayor Whitehead

• She said there is exciting news regarding a kick off meeting this upcoming Friday, July 17th for the \$195,000 grant that was received.
