# 4. Proclamations and Special Recognitions

Mayor Bilski presented a proclamation in honor of Emily Preibisch, who celebrated her 103<sup>rd</sup> birthday on November 26<sup>th</sup>. Her daughter, Donna Preibisch, and friend Keith Oliver accepted it on her behalf.

5. Petition(s) and/or Request(s) from the Public.

Ronnie Smith spoke in opposition of a variance request at 405 Gebhardt Road.

John Sodolak was told that the City is charging \$40/hour for the youth to use lights at the baseball field. He would like council to consider a reduced rate for Sealy residents/local teams. He believes a rate of \$10/hour would be a reasonable charge. Mayor Bilski informed Mr. Sodolak that no fees have been established at this time.

Rosy Bonaccorso said there is a speeding issue on Shadowlake Drive. She would like to see a speed bump installed on this street.

Cynthia Grigar spoke in opposition of a variance request at 405 Gebhardt Road.

7. PUBLIC HEARING: The City Council will hold a public hearing to receive comments concerning amendments to City of Sealy Code of Ordinances, Chapter 87 (Subdivision of Land and Plats)- regarding the approval processes and procedures for amending and minor plats.

Mayor Bilski opened the public hearing at 6:24 p.m.

Edward Zapalac spoke in favor of council assuming the responsibility of minor plat review. He believes this is something elected officials should be looking at, as opposed to this occurring behind closed doors at City Hall. He said being transparent is important.

Roxanna Saldana thanked council for asking all of the right questions; she encouraged them to keep doing that. She wants to avoid future problems and referenced the recent issue at Evlyn Court. She believes council approval of minor plats will create more transparency and thinks only good can come out of this.

Diane Wuthrich reiterated what Mr. Zapalac and Mrs. Saldana previously stated. She appreciates council asking questions. She thanked the councilmembers and mayor for the time, effort and dedication that has been given to the City.

Felicitia Fernandez asked why the ordinance needs to be changed and finds that there is no explanation for this change. She also proposed the installation of a speed bump on Schmidt Road.

Mayor Bilski closed the public hearing at 6:34 p.m.

8. PUBLIC HEARING: The City Council will hold a public hearing to receive comments concerning amendments to City of Sealy Code of Ordinances, Chapter 87 (Subdivision of Land and Plats)- regarding dedication of land for neighborhood parks; reservation of land for public utilities (park land dedication and fees).

Mayor Bilski opened the public hearing at 6:35 p.m.

Edward Zapalac believes this ordinance needs to be reviewed on an annual basis since the price of land is constantly changing. He also said there needs to be a minimum standard established if the homeowner's association is going to manage the park.

Mayor Bilski closed the public hearing at 6:37 p.m.

9. Discussion and possible action to amend Sec. 87-52 of the parkland dedication ordinance. (This is the first of two readings.)

Councilwoman Lerma moved to amend Sec. 87-52 of the parkland dedication ordinance. Councilwoman Vrablec seconded the motion. Mayor Bilski called for the vote:

Councilwoman Sullivan provided council with a spreadsheet outlining her proposed budget amendments and read a statement.

Councilwoman Sullivan moved to prepare an ordinance with the budget amendment changes that she recommended, excluding the EDC fund, reducing travel and training for councilmembers to \$6,000, adding back in the second police officer position so there would be a total of two police officer positions in the current budget, changing city council consultant services from the current budgeted amount of \$110,000 to \$0, and disregarding her suggestion for the planning department consultant services reduction by \$50,000. Councilwoman Lerma seconded the motion. Mayor Bilski called for the vote:

- She wants the recorded videos from council meetings to be posted on the website in a timely manner.
- She would like to make ZOOM participation accessible for in-person meetings.

#### Councilman Noack

- He inquired if the \$0.89 for new meters is already included in the budget and said this charge will need to be updated in impact fees.
- He wants an update from Lawrence Siska regarding whether or not trees have been meeting regulations for the upcoming parade.

#### Councilwoman Vrablec

- She would like staff to send out a Blackboard notification to individuals that reside on the new parade route.
- She would like staff to send a sign-up notification for Blackboard in the utility bills.
- She asked about the bill for the Christmas party and mentioned that council has given donations for parties in the past.

# Mayor Bilski

- She would also like staff to send a sign-up notification for Blackboard in the utility bills.

- She thanked everyone for their hard work.

#### Councilwoman Sullivan

- She asked who council needs to submit their city manager goals to. Lloyd Merrell said to send them to the city secretary.
- She wants the signs on Schmidt Road to be replaced.

• She thanked staff for sending out an insert regarding the utility rate increase.

## Councilman Koy

- He wants an agenda item on January 5<sup>th</sup> regarding water, sewer, gas and garbage services for the EMS and Fire Department. He said the City is currently paying the bill for these services.
- He would like a representative from Emergency Services District No. 2 to give a
  presentation to council.
- He asked if the city manager has spoken with the county judge about a topic that had previously been discussed in closed session.
- He wants an update on the Harvest Moon Apartments.
- He wants all councilmembers to review the comprehensive plan. He thinks a modification to the current comprehensive plan will decrease the price drastically.

#### Councilman Burttschell

- He wants a speed limit sign to be installed on Schmidt Road.
- He thinks staff should have an annual or bi-annual meeting with the county judge and superintendent of the school district to see where everyone is at on a more frequent basis.
