12. Discussion and possible action regarding drainage improvements in Westview Subdivision.

City Manager Warren Escovy said homes located on Westview Terrace Drive have experienced some levels of drainage issues since the Westview Village Subdivision was built. He noted there is no drainage easement established at either Westview Terrace Subdivision nor the Westview Village Subdivision. Engineer JJ Kazadifuta with Civil Corp made the recommendation to install inlets and storm sewer pipes and to secure drainage easements. There are two proposals associated with Mr. Kazadifuta recommendation; the associated costs of the two proposals are estimated at \$49,700 and \$62,900.

A property located at 205 Village Drive was not included in either of the two proposals; however, councilmembers would like it to be included with future improvements. Therefore, the associated cost may exceed \$62,900.

Mayor Bilski moved to direct staff to improve the drainage in the Westview Subdivision-Westview Terrace and Westview Village. Councilman Zapalac seconded the motion. Mayor Bilski called for the vote:
