



community growth. It includes specific analysis and guidance for improving mobility issues; such as on-street parking; one-way streets; and multi-modal streets. It identifies downtown street types and alternative cross section options to include parking; bike lanes and shared streets. Court and Austin Street were identified as priority corridors for future enhancements.

The next step includes implementation and prioritization of projects; review and recommendation by the Master Thoroughfare Plan Task Force; approval by the Planning and Zoning; and a public hearing and adoption of the plan.


