Rules of Conduct for Public Comment at Council Meetings*

Members of the public may speak at a Council meeting upon recognition by the Mayor. Public comment may only occur during periods designated on the agenda for public comment or a public hearing. A person may speak for up to two (2) minutes during each of the two public comment periods on agenda items or non-agenda items. Waivers of the time requirement may only be granted in the discretion of the Mayor, and waivers to speak at a time other than a designated comment period may only be granted by the Council. Any person wishing to make a presentation longer than two minutes or requiring audio-visual equipment is asked to contact the City Clerk requesting to appear on a future agenda.

A person may only address Council from the podium. Only one person may occupy the podium at a time. All remarks are to be directed to the Mayor and Council. Speakers are not to engage in direct dialog with other meeting attendees.

Any person who violates the Rules of Conduct, disturbs the peace at the meeting, and/or interferes with the meeting may be warned, ordered to be seated, removed, and/or ticketed.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Carl Richards of 390 Lenox stated on the south side of this lot that city hall sits on, was 3 lots that were sold to the city by Julie Zemke, the former City Clerk. He further stated there are 2 large walnut trees that are rotten at the bottom, and he thinks the liability for the city is high if they're not taken care of. He then stated at 501 S Lafayette there are walnut trees as well, but they are white walnut trees, not black. He then said he knows the book store was sold, and they are doing a lot of work in there, but he hasn't been told what kind of business it will be. Mr. Richards then stated there were a group of wild turkeys on Dixboro Road and he has never seen that before, but they will move on at a later time.

DISCUSSION- Downtown

Nate Mack, the Downtown Development Authority Director explained a shop small business event through Oakland County that South Lyon will be participating in. He stated for the month of November people can take a selfie in front of a small business and submit it and there will be 2 cash prizes. First place is \$1,000 and second place will be \$500.00. He stated he received 1,000 small bags and a frame people can hold to take the selfie. He then stated this is the last week for the Farmers Market. He then thanked Diana for the great work she did in doubling the vendors. He then stated they are continuing to

discuss the Winter Farmers Market that will be held at the VFW Hall. He stated as of now, Diana has 32 vendors for November 19th. He then reminded everyone of the Downtown Trick or Treat this Thursday and the Pup parade. Registration for the pup parade will be at 6pm. He then thanked Council for approving the road closures for Ladies Night Out which is November 11th and he said SLARA will have daycare from 5-9pm for \$36.00. Councilmember Dilg asked if they limited the number of children for the daycare? Mr. Mack said they did not. She then asked how the prize for the selfies will be determined. Mr. Mack stated he believes it will be a random drawing. She then asked him if he has considered doing a survey of the vendor for Farmers Market to see how successful they are, or if there are any changes they would like to see made. Mr. Mack stated he has not, but possibly in the future. Councilmember Kivell asked if there will be food vendors at the winter Farmers Market. Mr. Mack stated they are looking for food vendors right now. Councilmember Hansen stated he was happy to hear that the electric charging stations are moving forward. He then asked if there is any prep work the city can do such as ordering signs. Mr. Mack stated we can do that. Councilmember Mosier stated she thinks it would be a good idea to have some kind of survey for the Farmers Market vendors as well. We should find out what they think should be changed, or what they think is working.

FIRE CHIEF REPORT

Fire Chief Thorington stated they have had 872 incidents to date. He also stated the ladder truck is mostly ready and they are going for final inspection tomorrow. He stated they are looking into selling the current ladder truck. He further stated the floors are completed at the Fire Station and they look great. Councilmember Kennedy asked if they have smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors for our residents. Chief Thorington stated they have a hand full of smoke detectors, but they don't have any carbon monoxide detectors.

POLICE CHIEF REPORT

Lieutenant Baaki stated they are having a drug take back day on the 29th of this month from 10am to 2pm. He said they will collect them and turn them in to the DEA for disposal. He also stated they are having the Witches Hat Run on the 29th and trick or treating will be on Halloween from 6pm-8pm and they will have cars driving around handing out candy. Councilmember Kurtzweil stated she ran into a family moving here from New York. She said they listed the benefits of moving to South Lyon and the number one reason was safety. She said they drove around and seen people leaving bicycles outside their homes, and leaving their cars outside of their garages, and again, safety was their number one reason for moving here. Councilmember Kivell stated this isn't specific to us, but it is bad that people put their old medication down toilets and he is glad we are being responsible. Lieutenant Baaki stated it is very effective, we have people come in weekly. Councilmember Kennedy stated this event is for unused prescription drugs to keep them out of the hands of children and others, but they have taken other medications as well.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Resignation of Chris Sovik as Police Chief

City Manager Zelenak stated last year, Chief Sovik announced that he would be retiring in the fall of 2022. The city has received notification from Chief Sovik that his last day will be November 30th. He then personally thanked Chief Sovik for his 30+ years of service to the community and his leadership, experience and humor will be missed by everyone who had the chance to work with him. He further stated the city will be hiring a new Police Chief, and he has been speaking with Lieutenant Baaki about

the position and based upon those discussions, it is his intention to promote Lieutenant Baaki to be the new Police Chief for the City of South Lyon beginning December 1st.

2. First Reading of Ordinance to amend the South Lyon Code of Ordinances, Chapter 34, Article II Downtown Development Authority Ordinance

City Manager Zelenak explained the TIF public act 57 of 2018 provides that the Chief Executive Officer shall make appointments to fill vacancies on the DDA MCL 125-4304(1)(f). The DDA bylaws provide that the Chief Executive Officer of the city shall make appointments to fill vacancies on the DDA. Section 4.2 of the City Charter provides that the mayor is the Chief Executive Officer. The DDA ordinance Chapter 32, Article II, defines the City Manager to make appointments to fill vacancies on the DDA. This amendment reconciles the DDA Ordinance with the (aet)and updates references to the Act. CM 10-5-22 MOTION TO APPROVE FIRST READING.

3. Discussion of potential uses for ARPA funds

City Manager Zelenak explained that the city will be receiving funds as part of the American Rescue Act. He stated he has met with department heads to see if there are potential uses for these funds within each department. The city still hasn't received definitive uses of the funds, but a discussion is necessary. Finance and Benefit Administrator Tiernan stated she has been able to find some information on what other communities have used the funds for. Infrastructure, safe drinking water and additional pay for first responders have been approved. Councilmember Dilg stated she spoke with Elissa Slotkin and she promised we would receive a phone call with additional information on what the funds can be used for. Councilmember Kivell asked about the mandated reflective street signs. City Manager Zelenak stated we currently have those, but he will check into it. Councilmember Kivell stated there are a lot of places where you can't really see the signs and they aren't as noticeable. Councilmember Kennedy asked about fixing the bridge by Oak Creek as well as 2 other walking bridges throughout the trails. Ms. Tiernan stated we are classified as non-entitlement and we know infrastructure is allowed. Councilmember

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Hansen asked about the city getting Wi-Fi in our parks for the public. Ms. Tiernan stated you would have to have the funds to continue the program after the funds are spent. She then stated the funds must be spent by 2026. Councilmember Kurtzweil asked if the funds can be used to improve the Farmers Market. Ms. Tiernan stated the funds have been approved in other communities, more classified as a DDA project. City Manager Zelenak stated funds can be used to improve the parking lot and facades throughout the city. There would have to be guidelines for the improvements so we aren't giving funds to a business that will then just leave the city. Councilmember Kurtzweil stated we should start outlining where the funds will go. Ms. Tiernan asked each councilmember to email the city manager their top 2-3 items they would like to see the money spent on. City Manager Zelenak stated he will make a list of the department head suggestions along with Councils suggestions. He reminded everyone the bridge on the trail by Oak Creek alone is a \$200,000 project. Mayor Pelchat stated he agrees that the funds should be spent where the public can see the improvements. He further stated the bridge is a good idea and he thinks some of the city's older buildings could use some improvements as well as security for our employees. Ms. Tiernan stated the funds can be used for infrastructure in those buildings, as well as security items including IT. Mayor Pelchat stated there are more and more phishing scams out there. Councilmember Kennedy stated there is a ten million dollars grant through SEMCOG for trails and another one for recreational parks. Councilmember Kivell stated he would like to see more consideration for developing 390 S Lafayette. City Manager Zelenak stated parks improvements and enhancements are allowable uses. He also stated that the SEMCOG grants are matching grants, so we would have to match the ten million dollars. He further stated we could look at widening the trails from 8 feet to 12 feet. Councilmember Dilg asked about using some of the funds as bonus funding. Ms. Tiernan stated you can use the funds as communities did in 2020 for extra pay for tirst responders, Police and Fire. She further stated it could be used to recruit and encourage people to stay working for the city. She stated they could be paid at the normal rate, then after so many days they could be given a signing bonus. She further stated some communities used it to raise their wages, but you will have to keep funding it after the funds are spent in 2026. City Manager Zelenak stated thean be used for purchasing emergency response equipment as well. That also helps with recruiting new employees by having the best equipment.

BUDGET- No discussion was held

PUBLIC COMMENT

Carl Richards of 390 Lenox stated there is a new director at Providence, and Dr. Shepherd will be his new doctor.

He stated half of the staff quit last year, which he's never heard of before. He then stated he spoke with Tom Slater from the tube mill, and they have settled their union contract for the next four years. He said they need more employees.

MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Zelenak stated we will be discussing raising the purchasing limit at a future meeting. He further stated at a meeting in November we will have a resolution before Council for the road bond which will enable the city to do a publication of notice of sale in January and closing of the bonds in February for use this coming spring/summer. He then explained the renovations are continuing at city hall, and they will begin the parking lot next week. He also stated the last phase of the DPW yard paving project has begun. He further stated he has been in discussions with Parks and Recreation regarding the lack of a name for the proposed new park on S. Lafayette. He stated they were discussing possibly naming it Lafayette Park, or Thompson's Corners. Councilmember Kennedy asked if he had any information on the new lids for the garbage cans downtown. City Manager Zelenak stated he will discuss that with Nate.

Councilmember Kurtzweil asked the city manager what his opinion is on the rapid transit tax and how it will affect our residents. City Manager Zelenak stated they are proposing a .95 mill on all Oakland County taxpayers. It will generate 65 million dollars the first year. We utilize Peoples Express for our residents. He stated our County Commissioner voted no on the ballot proposal language because he doesn't think it benefits the communities he represents. They have not given anyone much information and they don't have a back-up plan if it doesn't pass and the original smart mill will not be renewed. This mill is for everyone in Oakland County. He stated if passed, they will receive \$450,000 from South Lyon. There is not enough detail to even show how the money will be used. Mass transit is a good thing but he doesn't see any benefit to the city or its residents. Councilmember Kurtzweil stated our seniors are very worried about it. That will be a very large tax increase for 10 years and they don't allow communities to opt out. The service run will be out of Pontiac. She stated this will be devastating. She further stated she heard some of the money will be going to Detroit Councilmember Kivell stated the historical obstacle had always been Farmington because they wouldn't allow SMART to end up working in their jurisdiction, so everyone on the west side thought they were safe from having not having people from other communities getting access to be able to come into their community on public transportation. Obviously, the people at Oakland County think that is a step in the right direction. He would like the city to entertain the idea of entertaining what we could end up getting from it by exhaustively trying to expand that rather than saying we're going to end up pitching in that money and not get anything. City Manager Zelenak stated they have talked about expanding that, but they have not defined this area as an area of expansion. They've been looking at the other area of the county It is very hard for a voter to show them the benefit is to our community when we don it know what it is going to be yet. It is very disappointing that they are telling people to vote yes, when they can't show what the benefit will be. Councilmember Kurtzweil stated it is her understanding there isn't a board in place to oversee it. So, they'll be collecting money for 3 years and just let it sit in their bank. There is no plan. She further stated this is tough. She feels bad for Lyon Township, they are looking at several tax increases for the library, Fire and now possibly the transit tax. City Manager Zelenak stated that \$450,000 could really enhance our city instead of giving it to the county.

COUNCIL ©ØMMENTS

Councilmember Dilg stated reminded everyone to get registered to vote and to get out and vote. It is an important Election and everyone needs to vote. She also asked everyone to read and understand the proposals.

Councilmember Hansen apologized for missing the last meeting but he was ill. He then stated he likes the new video system and he was able to watch the council meeting and get caught up in HD and the cameras are working amazingly. He then stated he attended the first German fest with the Chamber of Commerce and several councilmembers. It was a great first event. He stated it was well attended with over 75 business members and local professionals enjoying some great German food at the South Lyon Hotel and some great music. He gave kudos to the chamber for putting on the event and stated it was good to see so many people in attendance. He then reminded everyone that the war in Ukraine is still going on, and we are at day 242, and if everyone is able to do their part, even if its as small as buying a pint of beer at the Witches Hat that benefits world food bank or even just making a direct donation to benefit the people of Ukraine. We're all thinking about them in our thoughts and hearts and he hopes it ends sooner than it continues.

Councilmember Kurtzweil stated she would like to echo Councilmember Hansen's comments about Ukraine. She stated she quit watching the news for a while and just turned it on recently, and the news just doesn't get any better. But what it does is reinforce how lucky we are to live in this country. We

may disagree with one another, and sees things differently, but we are extremely fortunate group of individuals that live in the greatest country. She stated she can go home at night and not worry about someone dropping a bomb, she can walk freely in the streets without being mugged. This is a great country and we need to fight for what is good in this country and accept the diverse opinions and understand we don't all speak with one voice, we speak with many voices and at the end of the day, we are all Americans. She then stated she had a great time at the South Lyon Hotel and she was there twice last week, and the German fest was absolutely very good, she enjoyed it and Cory did a great job. She stated she also attended comedy night which was fundraiser for Active Faith and that was also packed and the Hotel is doing a great job. She then thanked Cory and his crew and they are up to full staff. She then reminded everyone of their Halloween party on Saturday October 29th and everyone will be in full costumes for the contest and it will be a wild night.

Councilmember Kennedy congratulated the South Lyon High School Girls Swim and Dive Team for finishing in 1st place in the Lakes Valley Conference with a 5.0 standing. He also wished them the very best as they move on to the Conference Competition on November 4-5! I know that the South Lyon Community is certainly hoping they'll go all the way. He then welcomed two new businesses to the City of South Lyon. The first is Painted Croc Pottery and Art Studio that opened in King Plaza. They offer paint your own pottery along with other crafting projects and have something for all ages. So, he hopes everyone will make plans to stop in soon. He then stated the second new business is Mark Pagels, Edward Jones Financial Adviser who recently opened his own office in Brookdale Plaza. Mark is a longtime resident of the South Lyon community and has been providing financial advice for a number of years. So, if you're looking for advice for dealing with the challenges in the current economy, stop by and talk with Mark. He then reminded everyone of the Downtown Trick or Treat on Thursday, October 27th from 6-8pm as well as the Pup Pawrade. So, put on your costumes and come downtown for an evening of fun. He then stated Diane's Doll House is scheduled to reopen on November 25th, so that will be great news for the holiday season:

Councilmember Mosier also reminded everyone to vote. She then stated she also attended the Chamber event German Best and it was a lot of fun and she hopes to attend a few more. She then stated this week is the last Farmer's Market for the season and most of the vendors dress up for Halloween and they'll be passing out candy so she hopes everyone will bring the kids out.

Councilmember Kivell he hopes everyone enjoys themselves Halloween and its always a lot of fun to see all the little kids walking around in their costumes, it really is awesome.

Mayor Pelchat stated he hopes they can have some nice weather for downtown trick or treating as well as on Halloween. He then stated Friday night was the South Lyon and South Lyon East football game and it was incredible. The atmosphere was awesome. Congratulations to the Cougars, they won 27 to 21 and their reward for that is they will get a rematch with the Lions on Friday at South Lyon East. If you missed last weeks game, he encouraged everyone to go and get there early. It was great. Anytime they play each other, the student's section is a lot of fun. The winner will get the Milford team next. He then reminded everyone that sometimes people need help, whether it is Active Faith or another charity, he hopes everyone can donate. He said he tries to annually donate to the Heat and Warmth Fund through DTE and Consumers that helps people keep their heat on.

PERSON PLACING ITEM ON AGENDA: City Attorney

AGENDA TOPIC: Second reading of Ordinance to amend the South Lyon Code of Ordinances, Chapter 34, Article II, Downtown Development Authority Ordinance.

EXPLANATION OF TOPIC: The Recodified Tax Increment Financing Act, Public Act 57 of 2018 (the "Act"), provides that the Chief Executive Officer shall make appointments to fill vacancies on the DDA. MCL 125.4304(1)(f). The DDA by-laws provide that the Chief Executive Officer of the City shall make appointments to fill vacancies on the DDA. Section 4.2 of the City Charter provides that the Mayor is the Chief Executive Officer.

The Downtown Development Authority Ordinance, Chapter 32, Article II, defines the City Manager as the Chief Executive Officer and, as such, authorizes the City Manager to make appointments to fill vacancies on the DDA.

This Amendment reconciles the DDA Ordinance with the Act, and updates references to the Act.

ORDINANCE NO. __-22 CITY OF SOUTH LYON OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF SOUTH LYON CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 34 – COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, ARTICLE II – DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, TO IDENTIFY THE CURRENT APPLICABLE STATE LAW AND TO CORRECT TO REFERENCE TO CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AS BEING THE MAYOR

THE CITY OF SOUTH LYON ORDAINS:

<u>PART I.</u> Amendment of Section 34-32 - Amendment to Code. Chapter 34 – Community Development - Article II – Downtown Development Authority, Section 34-32 – Definitions is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 34-32. Definitions.

The terms used in this article shall have the same meaning as given to them in Act 197 57 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1975 2018 or as hereinafter provided in this section unless the context clearly indicates to the contrary. As used in this article:

Act 19757 means Act No. 19757 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 19752018 as now in effect or hereafter amended.

* * *

Chief executive officer means the eity manager mayor of the City of South Lyon.

* * *

Development plan means a plan developed by the downtown development authority pursuant to Act 19757.

PART II. Amendment of Section 34-33 - Amendment to Code. Chapter 34 – Community development - Article II – Downtown Development Authority, Section 34-33 – Determination of necessity is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 34-33. - Determination of necessity.

The city council hereby determines that it is necessary for the best interests of the city to halt property value deterioration and increase property tax valuation where possible in the downtown business district of the city to eliminate the causes of that deterioration, and to promote economic growth by establishing a downtown development authority pursuant to Act 197-57-.

PART III. Amendment of Section 34-34 - Amendment to Code. Chapter 34 – Community Development - Article II – Downtown Development Authority, Section 34-34 – Creation of Authority is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 34-34. - Creation of authority.

There is hereby created, pursuant to Act <u>197-57</u>, a downtown development authority for the City of South Lyon, Michigan. The authority shall be a corporate public body and shall be known and exercise its powers under the title of the "South Lyon Downtown Development Authority." The authority may adopt a seal, may sue and be sued in any court of this state, and shall possess all of the powers necessary to carry out the purpose of its incorporation as provided by this article and Act <u>197</u> <u>57</u>. The enumeration of a power in this article or in Act <u>19757</u> shall not be construed as a limitation upon the general powers of the authority.

PART IV. Amendment of Section 34-35 - Amendment to Code. Chapter 34 – Community Development - Article II – Downtown Development Authority, Section 34-35 – Description of downtown district is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 34-35. - Description of downtown district.

The downtown district in which the authority shall exercise its powers as provided by Act 197 57 shall consist of the territory in the city described in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof, subject to such changes as may hereinafter be made pursuant to this article and Act 197 57.

PART V. Amendment of Section 34-36 - Amendment to Code. Chapter 34 – Community Development - Article II – Downtown Development Authority, Section 34-36 – Board of Trustees is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 34-36. - Board of trustees.

The authority shall be under the supervision and control of a board of trustees consisting of the city manager of the City of South Lyon, and eight members appointed by the eity manager mayor of the City of South Lyon, subject to approval by the city council. At least five of the members shall be persons having an interest in property located in the downtown district. At least one of the members shall be a resident of the downtown district, if the downtown district has 100 or more persons residing within it. Of the members first appointed, two shall be appointed for one year, two for two years, two for three years, and two for four years. A member shall hold office until the member's successor is appointed. Thereafter, a member shall serve for a term of four years. An appointment to fill a vacancy shall be made by the eity manager mayor of the City of South Lyon for the unexpired term only. Members of the board shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses. The chairperson of the board shall be elected by the members of the board.
PART VI. Amendment of Section 34-38 - Amendment to Code. Chapter 34 – Community Development - Article II – Downtown Development Authority, Section 34-38 – Director, bond of director is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 34-38. - Director; bond of director.

If a director is employed as authorized by section 5 205 of Act 197 57, he shall post bond in the penal sum of 5,000.00 as required by said section of said statute. The premium of the bond shall be deemed an operating expense of the authority, payable from funds available to the authority for expenses of operation.

<u>PART VII.</u> Should any division, section, subsection, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or in part, shall not be affected other than the part invalidated.

PART VIII. Savings Clause. The amendment of the City of South Lyon Code of Ordinances set forth in this Ordinance does not affect or impair any act done, offense committed, or right accruing, accrued, or acquired or liability, penalty, forfeiture or punishment, pending or incurred prior to the amendment of the City of South Lyon Code of Ordinances set forth in this Ordinance.

<u>PART IX.</u> Repealer. All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

<u>PART X.</u> Effective Date; Publication. This Ordinance shall take effect upon the later of ten (10) days after adoption or upon publication thereof as provided by the Charter of the City of South Lyon.

Dear Paul:

I have enclosed a Bond Authorizing Resolution to be considered for approval by the City Council at its regular meeting on Monday, November 14th. The Resolution authorizes the issuance of the first series of Bonds for the Street Improvement Project based on the bond proposal approved by the City's voters at the election in August 2022. The Bonds will pledge the City's unlimited tax full faith and credit for support of the Bonds and will be paid from the special debt millage levied to pay the debt service on the Bonds.

The Resolution is based on the bond specifications prepared by MFCI, LLC, the City's financial advisor, and sets forth the terms of the Bonds, the form of Bonds and the form of Notice of Sale. The Resolution provides for a competitive public sale of the Bonds, with the option to sell the Bonds through a private placement or negotiated sale if deemed economically advantageous to the City by the City's financial advisor at the time of sale. Given the volatility of interest rates in the bond markets, the Resolution is intended to provide flexibility on the method of sale so that a decision can be made close to the sale date based on market conditions.

The Resolution provides that this first series of Bonds is expected to be issued in an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000, with the final amount determined at the time of the Bond sale based on the estimated interest rates and millage impact. It is expected that the second series of Bonds would be issued in 2026 for the remaining balance of the \$18,865,000 which was approved by the voters. There are various blanks in the Resolution in the form of bond and form of Notice of Sale that are intended to be in blank as those items will be completed in the final forms of those documents.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING 2023 UNLIMITED TAX GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member ______ and supported by Member ______:

WHEREAS, the qualified electors of the City of South Lyon, County of Oakland, State of Michigan (the "City"), at the election duly called and held on August 2, 2022, did by more than the required majority of those voting approve the following proposition:

Street Improvements Bond Proposal

Shall the City of South Lyon, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the principal sum of not to exceed Eighteen Million Four Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$18,465,000), and issue its unlimited tax general obligation bonds, payable in not to exceed ten (10) years, to pay the cost of constructing street improvements throughout the City, consisting of paving, repaving, resurfacing, reconstructing and improving streets? If approved, the estimated millage to be levied in 2023 is 1.9946 mills (\$1.99 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and the estimated simple average annual millage rate required to retire the bonds is 4.0894 mills (\$4.09 per \$1,000 of taxable value).

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is necessary at this time to issue the first series of its unlimited tax general obligation bonds in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing street improvements throughout the City, consisting of paving, repaving, resurfacing, reconstructing and improving streets (the "Project") and paying costs incidental to the issuance of the bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. <u>Authorization of Bonds; Bond Terms</u>. Bonds of the City designated 2023 UNLIMITED TAX GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS (the "Bonds") are authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal sum of not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) for the purpose of paying part of the costs of the Project, including the costs incidental to the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds. The issue shall consist of bonds in fully-registered form of the denomination of \$5,000, or multiples thereof not exceeding for each maturity the maximum principal amount of that maturity, numbered consecutively in order of registration, dated as of the date of delivery. The Bonds shall bear interest, mature and be payable at the times and in the manner set forth in Sections 6 and 7 hereof.

The bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates to be determined at the time of the sale thereof, but in any event not to exceed six percent (6%) per annum, payable on October 1, 2023 (or such date as determined at the time of the sale thereof) and semiannually thereafter. The Bonds shall be sold at sale at a price not less than 100% of the principal amount thereof.

The Bonds shall not be subject to optional redemption prior to maturity.

Interest shall be payable to the registered owner of record as of the 15th day of the month prior to the payment date for each interest payment. The record date of determination of registered owner for purposes of payment of interest as provided in this paragraph may be changed by the City to conform to market practice in the future. The principal of the Bonds shall be payable at a Michigan bank or trust company who is selected by the City Manager, City Treasurer or City Clerk (each an "Authorized Officer") at the time of sale of the Bonds and is hereby selected to act as transfer agent for the Bonds (the "Transfer Agent"), provided that in the event that the Bonds are purchased by a single institutional investor the City Treasurer may act as the Transfer Agent.

The Bonds may be issued in book-entry-only form through The Depository Trust Company in New York, New York ("DTC") and each Authorized Officer is authorized to execute such custodial or other agreement with DTC as may be necessary to accomplish the issuance of the Bonds in book-entry-only form and to make such changes in the Bond form within the parameters of this resolution as may be required to accomplish the foregoing.

2. <u>Execution of Bonds</u>. The Bonds of this issue shall be executed in the name of the City with the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk and shall have the seal of the City, or a facsimile thereof, printed or impressed on the Bonds. No Bond executed by facsimile signature shall be valid until authenticated by an Authorized Officer or representative of the Transfer Agent. The Bonds shall be delivered to the Transfer Agent for authentication and be delivered by the Transfer Agent to the purchaser or other person in accordance with instructions from an Authorized Officer upon payment of the purchase price for the Bonds in accordance with the bid therefor when accepted.

3. <u>Transfer of Bonds</u>. The Transfer Agent shall keep the books of registration for this issue on behalf of the City. Any Bond may be transferred upon such registration books by the registered owner of record, in person or by the registered owner's duly authorized attorney, upon surrender of the Bond for cancellation, accompanied by delivery of a duly executed written instrument of transfer in a form approved by the Transfer Agent. Whenever any Bond or Bonds shall be surrendered for transfer, the City shall execute and the Transfer Agent shall authenticate

and deliver a new Bond or Bonds, for like aggregate principal amount. The Transfer Agent shall require the payment by the bondholder requesting the transfer of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the transfer.

Debt Retirement Fund; Unlimited Tax Pledge; Defeasance of Bonds. The City 4. Treasurer is authorized and directed to open a depositary account with a bank or trust company designated by the City Council, to be designated 2023 UNLIMITED TAX GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS DEBT RETIREMENT FUND (the "Debt Retirement Fund"), the moneys to be deposited into the Debt Retirement Fund to be specifically earmarked and used solely for the purpose of paying principal of and interest on the Bonds as they mature. The City hereby pledges its unlimited tax full faith and credit for the prompt payment of the Bonds. Commencing with the year 2023, there shall be levied upon the tax rolls of the City for the purpose of the Debt Retirement Fund each year, in the manner required by the provisions of Act 34, Public Acts of Michigan, 2001, as amended, an amount sufficient so that the estimated collection therefrom will be sufficient to promptly pay, when due, the principal of and interest on the Bonds becoming due prior to the next annual tax levy; provided, however, that if at the time of making any such annual tax levy there shall be other funds available or surplus moneys on hand in the Debt Retirement Fund for the payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds, then credit therefor may be taken against such annual levy for the Debt Retirement Fund.

In the event cash or direct obligations of the United States or obligations the principal of and interest on which are guaranteed by the United States, or a combination thereof, the principal of and interest on which, without reinvestment, come due at times and in amounts sufficient to pay at maturity, the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds, shall be deposited in trust, this resolution shall be defeased and the owners of the Bonds shall have no further rights under this resolution except to receive payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds from the cash or securities deposited in trust and the interest and gains thereon and to transfer and exchange Bonds as provided herein.

5. <u>Construction Fund</u>; Proceeds of Bond Sale. The City Treasurer is authorized and directed to open a separate depositary account with a bank or trust company designated by the City Council, to be designated 2023 UNLIMITED TAX GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS CONSTRUCTION FUND (the "Construction Fund"), and deposit into said Construction Fund the proceeds of the Bonds less accrued interest, if any, which shall be deposited into the Debt Retirement Fund. The moneys in the Construction Fund shall be used solely to pay the costs of the Project and the costs of issuance of the Bonds.

*ADJUSTMENT OF TOTAL PAR AMOUNT OF BONDS AND PRINCIPAL MATURITIES: The City reserves the right to increase or decrease the aggregate principal amount of the bonds after receipt of the bids and prior to final award, if necessary, so that the purchase price of the bonds will provide an amount determined by the City to be sufficient to construct the Projects and to pay costs of issuance of the bonds. The adjustments, if necessary, will be in increments of \$5,000. The purchase price will be adjusted proportionately to the increase or decrease in issue size, but the interest rates specified by the successful bidder for all maturities will not change. The successful bidder may not withdraw its bid as a result of any changes made within these limits.

<u>*ADJUSTMENT TO PURCHASE PRICE</u>: Should any adjustment to the aggregate principal amount of the bonds be made by the City, the purchase price of the bonds will be adjusted by the City proportionally to the adjustment in principal amount of the bonds. The adjusted purchase price will reflect changes in the dollar amount of the underwriter's discount and original issue discount/premium, if any, but will not change the per-bond underwriter's discount as calculated from the bid and initial reoffering prices.

<u>INTEREST RATE AND BIDDING DETAILS</u>: The bonds shall bear interest at rate or rates not exceeding 6% per annum, to be fixed by the bids therefor, expressed in multiples of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1%, or both. The interest on any one bond shall be at one rate only and all bonds maturing in any one year must carry the same interest rate. <u>PURPOSE AND SECURITY</u>: The bonds were authorized at an election held on August 2, 2022 for the purpose of paying part of the costs of constructing street improvements throughout the City. The bonds will be a first budget obligation of the City, payable from the general funds of the City including the collection of ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the City subject to applicable constitutional, statutory and charter tax rate limitations. The rights or remedies of bondholders may be affected by bankruptcy, insolvency, fraudulent conveyance or other laws affecting creditors' rights generally now existing or hereafter enacted and by the application of general principles of equity including those relating to equitable subordination.

<u>GOOD FAITH</u>: A good faith deposit in the form of a certified or cashier's check drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company, or wire transfer, in the amount of one percent (1%) of the final aggregate principal amount of the bonds, payable to the order of the City will be required of the successful bidder. The successful bidder is required to submit its good faith deposit to the City as instructed by the City not later than Noon, prevailing Eastern Time, on the next business day following the sale. The good faith deposit will be applied to the purchase price of the bonds. In the event the purchaser fails to honor its accepted bid, the good faith deposit will be retained by the City. No interest shall be allowed on the good faith check. The good faith check of the successful bidder will be cashed and payment for the balance of the purchase price of the bonds shall be made at the closing

<u>AWARD OF BONDS</u>: The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid produces the lowest true interest cost determined in the following manner: the lowest true interest cost will be the single interest rate (compounded on October 1, 2023 and semi-annually thereafter) necessary to discount the debt service payments from their respective payment date to ______, 2023 (the anticipated delivery date), in an amount equal to the price bid, excluding accrued interest. Each bidder shall state in its bid the true interest cost to the City, computed in the manner specified above.

<u>TAX MATTERS</u>: In the opinion of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C., bond counsel, under existing law, assuming compliance with certain covenants, interest on the bonds is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes as described in the opinion, and the bonds and interest thereon are exempt from all taxation by the State of Michigan or any taxing authority within the State of Michigan except estate taxes and taxes on gains realized from the sale, payment or other disposition thereof.

<u>ISSUE PRICE</u>: The winning bidder shall assist the City in establishing the issue price of the bonds and shall execute and deliver to the City at closing an "issue price" or similar certificate setting forth the reasonably expected initial offering price to the public or the sales price or prices of the bonds, together with the supporting pricing wires or equivalent communications, substantially in the form attached either as Appendix _____ or Appendix _____ of the preliminary Official Statement, with such modifications as may be appropriate or necessary, in the reasonable judgment

of the winning bidder, the City and Bond Counsel.

The City intends that the provisions of Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1(f)(3)(i) (defining "competitive sale" for purposes of establishing the issue price of the bonds) will apply to the initial sale of the bonds (the "Competitive Sale Requirements") because:

- a. the City is disseminating this Notice of Sale to potential underwriters in a manner that is reasonably designed to reach potential underwriters;
- b. all bidders shall have an equal opportunity to bid;
- c. the City anticipates receiving bids from at least three underwriters of municipal bonds who have established industry reputations for underwriting new issuances of municipal bonds; and
- d. the City anticipates awarding the sale of the bonds to the bidder who submits a firm offer to purchase the bonds at the lowest true interest cost, as set forth in this Notice of Sale.

Any bid submitted pursuant to this Notice of Sale shall be considered a firm offer for the purchase of the bonds, as specified in the bid.

In the event that all of the Competitive Sale Requirements are not satisfied, the City shall so advise the winning bidder. The City will <u>not</u> require bidders to comply with the "hold-the-offering price rule," and therefore does not intend to use the initial offering price to the public as of the sale date of any maturity of the bonds as the issue price of that maturity, though the winning bidder, in consultation with the City, may elect to apply the "hold-the-offering price rule" (as described below). Bids will <u>not</u> be subject to cancellation in the event the Competitive Sale Requirements are not satisfied. Unless a bidder intends to apply the "hold-the-offering price rule" (as described below), bidders should prepare their bids on the assumption that all of the maturities of the bonds will be subject to the 10% Test (as described below). The winning bidder must notify the City of its intention to apply either the "hold-the-offering price rule" or the 10% Test at or prior to the time the bonds are awarded.

If the winning bidder <u>does not</u> request that the "hold-the-offering price rule" apply to determine the issue price of the bonds, the following two paragraphs shall apply:

- a. The City shall treat the first price at which 10% of a maturity of the bonds (the "10% Test") is sold to the public as the issue price of that maturity, applied on a maturity-by-maturity basis. The winning bidder shall advise the City if any maturity of the bonds satisfies the 10% Test as of the date and time of the award of the bonds; and
- b. Until the 10% Test has been satisfied as to each maturity of the bonds, the winning bidder agrees to promptly report to the City the prices at which the unsold bonds of that maturity have been sold to the public. That reporting obligation shall continue, whether or not the closing date has occurred, until either (i) all bonds of that maturity have been sold or (ii) the 10% Test has been satisfied as to the bonds of that maturity, provided

that, the winning bidder's reporting obligation after the closing date may be at reasonable periodic intervals or otherwise upon request of the City or bond counsel.

If the winning bidder <u>does</u> request that the "hold-the-offering price rule" apply to determine the issue price of the bonds, then the following three paragraphs shall apply:

- a. The winning bidder, in consultation with the City, may determine to treat (i) pursuant to the 10% Test, the first price at which 10% of a maturity of the bonds is sold to the public as the issue price of that maturity and/or (ii) the initial offering price to the public as of the sale date of any maturity of the bonds as the issue price of that maturity (the "hold-the-offering price rule"), in each case applied on a maturity-by-maturity basis. The winning bidder shall advise the City if any maturity of the bonds satisfies the 10% Test as of the date and time of the award of the bonds. The winning bidder shall promptly advise the City, at or before the time of award of the bonds, which maturities of the bonds shall be subject to the 10% Test or shall be subject to the hold-the-offering price rule or both.
- b. Sales of any bonds to any person that is a related party to an underwriter shall not constitute sales to the public for purposes of this Notice of Sale. Further, for purposes of this Notice of Sale:

- a. "public" means any person other than an underwriter or a related party;
- b. "underwriter" means (A) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract with the City (or with the lead underwriter to form an underwriting syndicate) to participate in the initial sale of the bonds to the public and (B) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract directly or indirectly with a person described in clause (A) to participate in the initial sale of the bonds to the public (including a member of a selling group or a party to a retail distribution agreement participating in the initial sale of the

bonds to the public);

- c. a purchaser of any of the bonds is a "related party" to an underwriter if the underwriter and the purchaser are subject, directly or indirectly, to (i) more than 50% common ownership of the voting power or the total value of their stock, if both entities are corporations (including direct ownership by one corporation of another), (ii) more than 50% common ownership of their capital interests or profits interests, if both entities are partnerships (including direct ownership by one partnership of another), or (iii) more than 50% common ownership of the value of the outstanding stock of the corporation or the capital interests or profit interests of the partnership, as applicable, if one entity is a corporation and the other entity is a partnership (including direct ownership of the applicable stock or interests by one entity of the other); and

<u>"QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS"</u>: The City has designated the bonds as "Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations" for purposes of deduction of interest expense by financial institutions pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

<u>LEGAL OPINION</u>: Bids shall be conditioned upon the approving opinion of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C., attorneys of Detroit, Michigan, a copy of which opinion will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds at the delivery thereof. The fees of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C. for services rendered in connection with such approving opinion are expected to be paid from bond proceeds. Except to the extent necessary to issue its approving opinion as to validity of the above bonds, Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C. has not been requested to examine or review and has not examined or reviewed any financial documents, statements or materials that have been or may be furnished in connection with the authorization, issuance or marketing of the bonds, and accordingly will not express any opinion with respect to the accuracy or completeness of any such financial documents, statements or materials. In submitting a bid for the bonds, the bidder agrees to the representation of the City by Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C., as bond counsel.

<u>DELIVERY OF BONDS</u>: The City will furnish bonds ready for execution at its expense. Bonds will be delivered without expense to the purchaser through DTC in New York, New York, or such other place to be agreed upon. The usual closing documents, including a certificate that no litigation is pending affecting the issuance of the bonds, will be delivered at the time of delivery of the bonds. If the bonds are not tendered for delivery by twelve o'clock Noon, prevailing Eastern Time, on the 45th day following the date of sale, or the first business day thereafter if said 45th day is not a business day, the successful bidder may on that day, or any time thereafter until delivery of the bonds, withdraw its proposal by serving notice of cancellation, in writing, on the undersigned in which event the City shall promptly return the good faith deposit. Payment for the bonds shall be made in Federal Reserve Funds. Accrued interest to the date of delivery of the bonds shall be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

9. <u>Method of Sale</u>. The City Council has considered the option of selling the Bonds through a competitive sale and a negotiated sale, and, pursuant to the requirements of Act 34, Public Acts of Michigan, 2001, as amended ("Act 34"), has determined to proceed with the sale of the Bonds by means of a competitive sale. In the event that the financial advisor determines that a negotiated sale or private placement would be economically advantageous to the City and result in the lowest issuance costs and interest costs for the City, the Authorized Officers are authorized to sell the Bonds at a negotiated sale.

10. <u>Placement or Sale of Bonds; Delegation to Authorized Officer; Sale Order</u>. In the event of a negotiated sale of the Bonds, each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to solicit proposals through a private placement with a qualified bank or other sophisticated institutional investor as purchaser thereof (the "Purchaser") or to select an underwriter to sell the bonds (the "Underwriter"). Each Authorized Officer is individually authorized to negotiate and execute a sale order and/or bond purchase agreement specifying the final terms of the Bonds with the Purchaser or Underwriter and take all other necessary actions required to effectuate the sale, issuance and delivery of the Bonds, subject to the parameters set forth in this Resolution. Each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized and directed to (a) approve the circulation of a preliminary Official Statement describing the Bonds and to deem the preliminary Official Statement "final" for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC"), if required; (b) solicit bids for and approve the purchase of a municipal bond insurance policy for the Bonds, if deemed economically advantageous to the City; (c) apply for ratings on the Bonds; and, (d) do all other acts and take all other necessary procedures required to effectuate the sale, issuance and delivery of the Bonds.

The City agrees to enter into a continuing disclosure undertaking for the benefit of the holders and beneficial owners of the Bonds, if required, in accordance with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the SEC and each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to execute such undertaking prior to delivery of the Bonds.

13. <u>Authorization of Other Actions; Adjustment of Bond Terms</u>. Each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to adjust the final bond details set forth herein to the extent necessary or convenient to complete the transaction authorized herein, and in pursuance of the foregoing are authorized to exercise the authority and make the determinations authorized pursuant to Section 315(1)(d) of Act 34, Public Acts of Michigan, 2001, as amended, including but not limited to, determinations regarding interest rates, prices, discounts, maturities, principal amounts, denominations, dates of issuance, interest payment dates, redemption rights, the place of delivery and payment, and other matters within the parameters described in this resolution. Each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized and directed to take all other actions necessary or advisable, and to

make such other filings with any parties, including the Michigan Department of Treasury, to enable the sale and delivery of the Bonds as contemplated herein.

14. <u>Award of Sale of Bonds</u>. In the event of a competitive sale of the Bonds, each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized on behalf of the City to award the sale of the Bonds to the bidder whose bid meets the requirements of law and which produces the lowest true interest cost to the City computed in accordance with the terms of the Official Notice of Sale as published.

15. <u>Tax Covenant; "Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations"</u>. The City shall, to the extent permitted by law, take all actions within its control necessary to maintain the exclusion of the interest on the Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), including, but not limited to, actions relating to any required rebate of arbitrage earnings and the expenditures and investment of Bond proceeds and moneys deemed to be Bond proceeds. The City hereby designates the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for purposes of deduction of interest expense by financial institutions pursuant to the Code.

16. <u>Bond Counsel</u>. The City recognizes that Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C., has represented from time to time, and currently represents financial institutions and other potential participants in the bond financing process for unrelated projects, any of which might offer to purchase the City's Bonds. The City appoints Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C. as bond counsel for this issue notwithstanding the potential representation of any such bidder regarding any unrelated manner.

17. <u>Municipal Advisor</u>. MFCI, LLC is retained as the registered municipal advisor to the City in connection with the issuance of the Bonds.

18. <u>Rescission</u>. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same hereby are rescinded.

AGENDA TOPIC: First reading of amendment of purchasing ordinance to increase the value of purchases requiring Council approval and competitive bidding and to clarify authority for emergency purchases

EXPLANATION OF TOPIC:

At recent City Council Meetings, there have been comments and discussion by Council about increasing the values of purchases requiring Council approval and competitive bidding to eliminate the additional time and cost associated with Departments having to obtain Council approval for routine budgeted purchases of supplies, materials, equipment and services at values that do not warrant the staff costs related to presenting lower value purchases for approval and Council's review and approval.

The proposed ordinance amendment increases the value of purchases requiring Council approval from \$5,000 to \$10,000 (See Section 2-222).

The proposed amendment also increases the value of purchases requiring competitive bidding, as defined in the ordinance (Section 2-224), from \$10,000 to \$15,000. Thus, purchases of up to \$15,000 can be made on the open market and must be supported by 3 written quotes which may be obtained verbally or in writing which is current city practice. Purchases over \$15,000 must be approved by Council and be done by competitive bidding.

The proposed ordinance amendment also amends Section 2-225 increasing the value for reporting to city Council emergency expenditures from \$5,000 to \$10,000.

ORDINANCE NO. __-22 CITY OF SOUTH LYON OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF SOUTH LYON CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 2 – ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE VI – PURCHASING TO INCREASE THE VALUE OF PURCHASES REQUIRING COUNCIL APPROVAL, COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND EMERGENCY PURCHASES.

THE CITY OF SOUTH LYON ORDAINS:

<u>PART I.</u> Amendment of Article VI – Purchasing. The following sections of Chapter 2 – Administration, Article VI – Purchasing, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Lyon, are hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-222. - Purchases or contracts under \$150,000.00.

Purchases of supplies, materials or equipment, the cost of which is less than 150,000.00, may be made in the open market but such purchases shall, except where the manager shall determine that no advantage to the city would result or in the employment of professional services, be based on comparative prices supported by three (3) written quotes and shall be awarded to the lowest competent bidder. The purchasing agent may contact prospective suppliers and vendors and solicit prices and quotes verbally, by telephone, or by written communication. A record shall be kept for six months of all open market orders and the comparative quotes submitted thereon, which records shall be available for public inspection. Purchases or contracts obligating the city in an amount less than 105,000.00 need not have the prior approval of the city council.

Sec. 2-224. - Approval for purchases or contracts over 105,000.00; competitive bidding for purchases or contracts over 150,000.00.

Any expenditure for supplies, materials, equipment, construction project or contract obligating the city, where the amount of the city's obligation is in excess of 105,000.00, shall be first approved by the city council. Where such expenditure or contract exceeds 150,000.00, it shall be subject to competitive bidding as herein prescribed except where the council shall determine that no advantage to the city would result or where the expenditure or contract is for professional services. Where competitive bidding is required, the following procedure will apply.

(1) The purchasing agent shall solicit bids from a reasonable number of such qualified prospective bidders as are known to him by sending each a copy of the notice requesting bids and notice thereof shall be posted in the city hall. Bids shall also be solicited by newspaper advertisement when directed by the city council.

(2) Unless prescribed by the council, the manager shall prescribe the amount of any security to be deposited with any bid, which deposit shall be in the form of cash, certified or cashier's check or bond written by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of Michigan. The amount of such security shall be expressed in terms of percentage of the bid submitted. Unless fixed by the council, the manager shall fix the amount of the performance bond and in the case of construction contracts, the amount of the labor and materials bond to be required of the successful bidders.

(3) Bids shall be opened in public at the time and place designated in the notice requesting bids in the presence of the purchasing agent, the city clerk and at least one other city official, preferably the head of the department most closely concerned with the subject of the contract. The bids shall thereupon be carefully examined and tabulated and reported to the council with the recommendation of the purchasing agent at the next council meeting. After tabulation all bids may be inspected by the competing bidders. In lieu of the procedure for opening bids herein specified, the council may direct that bids be opened at a council meeting.

(4) When such bids are submitted to the council, if the council shall find any of the bids to be satisfactory, it shall award the contract to the lowest competent bidder meeting specifications, unless the council shall determine that the public interest will be better served by accepting a higher bid. Such award may be by resolution or ordinance. The council shall have the right to reject any or all bids and to waive irregularities in bidding and to accept bids which do not conform in every respect to the bidding requirements.

(5) At the time the contract is executed by him, the contractor shall file a bond executed by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of Michigan, to the city, conditioned to pay all laborers, mechanics, subcontractors and materialmen as well as all just debts, dues and demands incurred in the performance of such work and shall file a performance bond when one is required. Said contractor shall also file evidence of public liability insurance in an amount satisfactory to the city manager, and agree to save the city harmless from loss or damage caused to any person or property by reason of the contractor's negligence.

(6) All bids and deposits of certified or cashier's checks may be retained until the contract is awarded and signed. If any successful bidder fails or refuses to enter into the contract awarded to him within five days after the same has been awarded, or file any bond required within the same time, the deposit accompanying his bid shall be forfeited to the city, and the council may, in its discretion, award the contract to the next lower competent bidder meeting specifications, or to another competent bidder meeting specifications if the council shall determine that the public interest will be better served by accepting such other bid, or said contract may be readvertised.

Sec. 2-225. – Emergency purchases.

In the case of any emergency, the city manager or his or her designee, may purchase any supplies, materials, equipment or services, necessary to the continuation of the operation, business, and work of the city or affected department or that is necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare; provided, however, that if such purchase exceeds $\frac{105,000.00}{10,00,00}$, it shall be reported to the city council at the next regular council meeting following such purchase.

PART II. Severability. Should any division, section, subsection, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid, the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or in part, shall not be affected other than the part invalidated.

PART III. Savings Clause. The amendment of the City of South Lyon Code of Ordinances set forth in this Ordinance does not affect or impair any act done, offense committed, or right accruing, accrued, or acquired or liability, penalty, forfeiture or punishment, pending or incurred prior to the amendment of the City of South Lyon Code of Ordinances set forth in this Ordinance.

<u>PART IV.</u> Repealer. All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

<u>PART V.</u> Effective Date; Publication. This Ordinance shall take effect upon the later of ten (10) days after adoption or upon publication thereof as provided by the Charter of the City of South Lyon.
