PUBLIC HEARINGS:

1) Site Plan Review Ordinance

Chairman Lanam opened the public hearing at 7:14pm.

There were no comments from the public.

Chairman Lanam closed the public hearing at 7:15pm.

Avantini stated he made the changes based on the last conversation. All of the data from the city's engineer has not been put in yet but will be as soon as it is ready. That data will be entered prior to City Council's review.

Avantini reviewed the changes made from the original ordinance.

Chubb stated there appeared to be a lot of sketch plans to review. Avantini stated it was broken into sections to reinforce the expectations. Chubb stated there are ADA requirements that may be designed based which he would like to review. There was a general discussion regarding what will come to the Commission and what will be handled administratively and how those decisions will be made. Kurtzweil expressed concern about relinquishing too much of the review process. It was decided there would be a monthly report that will include summaries of all administrative decisions that will be presented to the Commissioners. The report can be scaled back or more detailed as the new process moves forward.

2) Donation Bin Ordinance

there. Kurtzweil asked if the box owners could be required to register with City Hall. Avantini stated no one would be grandfathered in. Lanam stated the property owner would be held accountable for having more than two. Avantini stated no one wants to prevent charities from collecting but the city does need to be kept clean.

There was a general discussion regarding fees and enforcement. Delaney stated the ordinance would be enforceable to the property owner via tickets and fines, if applicable.
