The City of South Lyon Regular City Council Meeting March 23, 2015

Mayor Tedd Wallace called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Mayor Tedd Wallace requested a moment of silence before he led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance

PUBLIC COMMENT

Charles Spaller of 278 Wellington stated he had sent a letter to Council regarding the Recreation Center. He stated he is a member of the Senior Center and the majority of seniors do not want their taxes raised for the purpose of a Recreation Center; he further stated they oppose McHattie Park as a site for the Recreation Center. Traffic will be an issue, and we will lose too much green space. He stated the seniors are requesting a different location if it is built. He further stated they do not want the senior center moved from the South Lyon High School.

Mayor Wallace stated they will take his comments into consideration.

Carl Richards of 390 Lennox stated he has good news and he has spoken with the railroad and something good will be happening later this year. Mr. Richards stated the Spring clean-up is scheduled for April 12th. Mr. Richards stated the Historical Society is starting a new festival day called Heritage Day Festival.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Second Reading: Amendment to the City of South Lyon Ordinance adding regulations concerning the Medical Use of Marihuana and related land uses and activities

Attorney Wilhelm stated at the last meeting there was a comment made regarding a section in the ordinance regarding the inspection of the facilities by City officials. He has done additional research and the Medical Marihuana Act states having a legistered care giver card does not give probable cause for inspection and that section in the ordinance should be removed. He stated there may be another way for the City to do inspections to ensure the business is staying in compliance, possibly by some way of the special land use issue to ensure the location is in compliance. Councilman Kramer stated he is concerned regarding how we can ensure they are in compliance with the act, more than the law enforcement part of it. He stated he would like some way for the City to ensure compliance, and right now our Ofdinance is silent regarding that. There should be some avenue for us to ensure they are in compliance. Councilman Wedell stated he is concerned with this as well. Some communities are dealing with issues of non-compliance regarding the number of plants allowed, and he would like to see something that will ensure they are in compliance. Councilman Kivell stated the fact they put these metrics in the act, why would the numbers be there if we do not have the ability to ensure they do not have more plants that allowed? We should be able to validate that they are not exceeding the law. Councilman Kivell stated it would be helpful to know what the repercussions are if they are not in compliance, and if they could lose their license. Attorney Wilhelm stated if they violate, we could revoke the special land use. He further stated depending on the violation, it could also be a law enforcement issue. Councilman Kramer stated he would like to see language in the ordinance regulating the zoning use, or land use, in some way to ensure they are in compliance.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Consider recommendation to be the lead applicant on the Joint Safe Routes to School Grant being prepared to improve safety in the 9 Mile and Pontiac Trail area

City Manager Ladner stated she is requesting Council to approve the City to be the lead applicant for the Safe Route to School Grant. She is happy to be a part of this. She and Lyon Township have met with the coordinators from the State and Semcogg and this must be an Act 51 Grant, therefore either the Road Commission or the City will have to be the lead applicant. She stated the Road Commission would prefer the City to take the lead. Mayor Wallace asked if the City will be funding the adding of sidewalks to the Township property. City Manager Ladner stated if the sidewalks in the Township will be funded by their portion, and the City will be funded by our portion. It will be done at unit prices.

2.// Consider resolution of support for the State ballot issue Proposal 1

Mayor Wallace stated the proposal is confusing to many people. He further stated if approved the Proposal will raise the State Sales Tax from 6% to 7% and a portion of the money will be used to fix the roads, and some will go to schools. Mayor Wallace stated he and City Manager Ladner were involved in a phone conference with the Governor and he seemed to have all the right answers as you might expect. He stated Department Head Martin, Councilman Wedell and himself, met with Oakland County and they were told within two years a substantial amount of roads would be improved. Councilman Ryzyi stated everyone knows the roads are terrible, but Council is being asked to take a position on how our residents should vote. He stated he feels voting is a personal thing and government shouldn't be telling people how to vote. He doesn't want to take a position on this proposal. Mayor Wallace stated this is a resolution of support for the Proposal, it would reflect Council being in support of the proposition. Councilman Wedell stated he doesn't understand how restoring the earned income tax credit has anything to do with improving the roads, also on the first and last slide of the power point presentation that was presented by the Road Commission reflects there is no plan B if this proposal fails. He stated it is irresponsible for there not being a plan B, it is also irresponsible for the Legislatures to continuing with this proposal to make the voters make the decision they wouldn't make. He further

stated he would have a hard time supporting this. Councilman Kivell stated our Legislatures failed in not taking leadership in trying to get some answers to take this off the backs of the voters and them making the decisions themselves. He further stated this changes Michigan's constitution to allow this revenue generation and this is something that future Legislatures will have the ability to keep the citizens of Michigan from acting on this to roll it back down if another solution is found.

City Manager Ladner stated is something new for the City. This will allow us for a summer intern to work on particular projects and give them experience working with a governmental body, preparing them for future city staff, department heads and so on. There are several different things we can ask the intern to work on. This is paid for by the MGMLA. They pay us the \$3,000, and then we pay the intern weekly.

4. Budget Amendments

City Manager Ladner stated the budget amendments were done to ensure everything is up to date. Councilman Kivell stated he would like to know why there was an increase for Parks and Recreation fuel prices. Mayor Wallace stated they were asked to cut the grass at Volunteer Park more often for the ball fields. City Manager Ladner stated in that department they are already over the amount budgeted. Councilman Ryzyi stated the amended amount for the Cultural Arts Commission has been reduced. He stated the Cultural Arts Commission has done a lot of the City and he feels it is a shame to reduce their budget; they have a lot of good stuff coming in the future. He would like the budget amount to stay the original budget amount. City Manager Ladner stated originally Council only wanted to give the Cultural Arts Commission seed money. The minutes reflected at the time it was commissioned, it was

understood they were not to come back each year for more money. She stated it is Councils choice if they wish to continue to give them funding. She stated they should also keep in mind it is a City Commission and by funding them, we leave ourselves open to other commissions coming forward and asking for funds also. She further stated we do fund the Historical, but that is for them to maintain the historical village that the City owns. Councilman Ryzyi stated the Cultural Arts did a great job raising some money, and it is amazing what they have accomplished and they plan on having future fundraisers, and he thinks we should support this. Councilman Kivell stated he also feels they can be a benefit to our Community, but like other commissions they need to come up with a budget explaining what their intentions are with any money they ask for. Councilman Medell stated the line item that would be removed is for equipment purchases. Mayor Wallace stated they have already made their purchases. Councilman Kramer stated part of the problem is well an interim City Manager and we had to rush a budget through without too much detail, he is supprised because at the beginning it wasn't the intention of Council Members to fund another Commission, now there is interest in funding them. He further stated he doesn't have a problem looking into their funding, but we need to see what they will be spending their money on. He stated this was a big concern when this commission was enacted that they would come back each year for more money. Councilman Kivell stated he doesn't have an issue with giving them money if it is justifiable. He stated he doesn't have a problem with leaving the money for the time being. Councilman Ryzyi stated he isn't apposed to having a detailed plan, but he is not comfortable taking this money out of a budget when the money is already there. Councilman Wedell asked if anyone knows if the Commission plans on spending any money on that equipment. City Manager Ladner stated there is some equipment they would like to purchase. She stated she has spoken with Kelly Smith regarding the Commission making a budget to present to Council for the next fiscal year. Bookkeeper for Mosier stated she spoke with Kelly at length today. She stated they have plenty of money in their account from the revenues they made last year. She stated she suggested different ways they could gain revenue, such as sponsorships, and more advertising for the fundraisers. She stated Kelly seemed open to that. Ms. Mosier stated they are thinking of purchasing a tent as well as a P.A. system. She was just trying to clean up the budget and after reading the minutes from when the Commission was enacted the Chairperson did say they would not come back for more money each year. She thinks they are set for equipment for this year. Councilman Wedell asked where their revenue is reflected in the budget Ms. Mosier stated it is in the General Fund under contribution. Councilman Kivell stated this group sidifferent from other commissions because they are making revenue and he would like to see that as a rolling tally. Ms. Mosier stated she suggested to Kelly that the Commission could become their own entity and they could have their own board decide where the money goes to. Councilman Wedell stated the City Manager is not asking to gut out their entire budget, all the City Manager is asking is to reduce their budget for Equipment purposes not the entire budget. He further stated he is delighted to see the budget amendments being done. He stated the total increase for the General Fund line item is an increase of \$7,700.00, and where is the money coming from for that increase. Ms. Mosier stated it is coming from General Fund.

City Manager Ladner stated she is happy to be back to work and she plans on meeting with Department Heads this week for budget discussions. She is hoping to have it ready for Council at the first meeting in April, because it must be approved by the end of April per Charter. She stated she went with Department Head Martin to look at a few different locations in the community where there is concern with where the road meets the railroad crossing. There is a question regarding if it is railroad property or City property. She stated she has been contacted by Councilman Ryzyi as well as a few residents regarding an issue with the Knolls Development. She stated the project may be red tagged if they don't comply with what was originally agreed upon.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilman Kivell stated he is hoping for warmer weather. Councilman Kivell stated the bike path is in need of repair and we may need to consider repairing portions.

Councilman Ryzyi stated thanked the City Manager for contacting Elkow and thanked Mr. Spaller for attending the meeting and for his comments. He further stated he has received many comments/concerns from residents regarding the discussion of the Recreation Center being built at McHattie Park. He stated most people do not like the idea of it being built there.

Councilman Kramer stated the Recreation Council are doing a feasibility study for the location of the Recreation Center. He further stated they have no interest in ruining McHattie Park. It is a situation where the land is already owned by the City, and there are utilities there. He further stated they have no intention of moving the Senior Center.

Mayor Wallace stated he recently returned from a trip to Denmark where he attended the funeral of the man that attempted to save his life. He further stated he presented a Key to the City to the family, and had lunch with the Mayor.

SOUTH LYON AREA YOUTH ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

THE CITY OF SOUTH LYON

Agreement to appropriate funds for the support of services for the prevention of juvenile delinquency and neglect

THIS AGREEMENT, made this <u>first</u> day of <u>July</u>, 2015, by and between the City of South Lyon, a Michigan municipal corporation of the County of Oakland, State of Michigan, whose address is 335 South Warren Street, South Lyon, Michigan 48178, hereinafter referred to as City, and the South Lyon Area Youth Assistance Program, whose address is 1000 North Lafayette, South Lyon, Michigan 48178, mutually agree as follows:

WHEREAS, the City has determined there is need for certain services to residents, specifically related to the prevention of juvenile delinquency and neglect within the community, and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is impractical at this time to render such services directly utilizing City Personnel and facilities, and

WHEREAS, the City has statutory authority under MCLA 123.461 to operate centers aimed at curbing juvenile delinquency within the community, and

WHEREAS, it is within the public welfare to provide other programs aimed at curbing juvenile delinquency and providing youth involvement, education, and recreation within the City, and

WHEREAS, the Juvenile Court has statutory authority under MCLA 712.2(e) to assist in or establish programs aimed at the prevention of juvenile delinquency and neglect, and

WHEREAS, the South Lyon Area Youth Assistance Program is such a program, established by the Juvenile Court for the County of Oakland, in cooperation with the City of South Lyon, the Township of Lyon, and the South Lyon Community Schools, and

WHEREAS, the South Lyon Area Youth Assistance Program is willing to furnish such services to the City and the City is willing to appropriate funds for the support of such services;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. The South Lyon Area Youth Assistance Program agrees to furnish and the City agrees to appropriate funds for the support of counseling services for the prevention of juvenile delinquency and neglect within the City, and for youth involvement, education, and recreation

programs.

2. This agreement shall become effective on July 1, 2015 and shall terminate on June 30,

2016. The terms of this agreement shall be automatically renewed each year thereafter unless either

party shall notify the other in writing sixty (60) days prior to the anniversary date that it desires to

modify this agreement.

3. The City shall provide the South Lyon Area Youth Assistance Program with the sum



AGENDA TOPIC: Agreement for purchase of Storm Sewer Easement and to pay part of cost to relocate city storm sewer

EXPLANATION OF TOPIC: A city storm sewer without a recorded easement crosses the property located at 150 E. McHattie which is owned by Fagin Family Real Estate, LLC. The occupant of the adjacent parcel, South Lyon Collision, at 200 E. McHattie, which is also owned by Fagin Family Real Estate, LLC, has obtained site plan approval to expand its existing facility on to 150 E. McHattie, but the city storm sewer must be relocated. The parties have discuss the city's purchase of a storm sewer easement for the new storm sewer location and sharing the cost of relocating the city storm sewer.

The proposed agreement between the three parties contains the following primary terms:

- Owner and occupant are responsible for all other costs related to the relocation of the storm sewer and indemnify and hold the City harmless related to the relocation project
- Owner will provide an affidavit verifying no known releases of hazardous materials on either parcel

The Owner and Occupant have signed the proposed agreement.

This correspondence outlines the terms on which the City of South Lyon is willing to contribute toward the cost of relocating the public storm sewer on 150 E. McHattie in connection with South Lyon Collision's expansion project.

As background, South Lyon Collision is located at 200 E. McHattle, tax parcel 21-29-106-003, and it has obtained final site plan approval for an expansion of its business on to the adjacent parcel at 150 E. McHattle, tax parcel 21-29-106-002. Both parcels are owned by Fagin Family Real Estate, LLC. Engineering plans have been approved as well. The proposed expansion would sit on an existing public storm sewer which requires that the storm sewer be relocated. There is no recorded easement to the City for the existing storm sewer.

The City will agree to pay a total of \$22,800 to the Property Owner, Fagin Family Real Estate, LLC, toward the costs of relocating the city storm sewer and a storm sewer easement for the new location which will allow South Lyon Collision's expansion project to proceed. The Property Owner will provide a storm sewer easement to the City and an affidavit verifying that it has no knowledge of the presence or use of any hazardous substances on the parcels on which the storm sewer easement will be located. The consideration for the storm sewer easement will be \$5,800 which is included in the total payment of \$22,800. The City will record the easement and bear the costs associated with the recording including transfer taxes. The City is not responsible for paying any real property taxes or special assessments relating to the parcels or easement. The City will be responsible for obtaining and paying for a title policy if it chooses.

The remaining \$17,000 to be paid by the City will be used by the Property Owner to complete the relocation of the storm sewer per the approved site plan and engineering plans subject to inspects and approvals. The estimated cost of relocating the city storm sewer exceeds \$17,000, and the Property Owner agrees to pay those costs and any other costs related to the relocation of the city storm sewer whether known or unknown. The Property Owner and South Lyon Collision agree to hold the City harmless and indemnify the City from any claims relating to the relocation of the storm sewer – specifically including without limitation claims by contractors. The entire expansion project, including the relocation of the city storm sewer, is subject to permitting, inspection and approval requirements.

If the foregoing terms are acceptable to the Property Owner and South Lyon Collision, please indicate so by having their respective representatives sign below. The City Council will be addressing this matter and the terms outlined above at the April 13, 2015 regular Council meeting.
