## Septage Hauler Disposal Guidelines

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All transporters of hauled waste must adhere to the following guidelines as well as all provisions of *Chapter 25 articles IX and X* of The Municipal Code of Stafford County. In addition, all Septage Haulers and vehicles must adhere to all relevant requirements set forth by the Virginia Department of Health, and the Virginia Department of Transportation. Failure to follow these guidelines may result in the revocation of disposal privileges. These guidelines can be amended by County staff at any time. - Disposal must take place at either Aquia or Little Falls Run Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP).
- Only waste from domestic uses is allowed.
- No waste from industrial activity.
- No sludge from wastewater treatment activities or pretreatment devices will be accepted.
- No waste from grease traps, grease interceptors, or oil and sand interceptors will be accepted.
- No waste containing solids greater than 0.5 inch will be accepted.
- No waste having a pH below 5 or above 11 will be accepted.
- No waste containing high amounts of oils will be accepted.
- No waste containing any substance that either alone or in conjunction with other sources may cause pass through or interference at the WWTP.

Rejection of a hauled load is at the sole discretion of the WWTP manager or other on-site representative.

Stafford requests that septage pumped from tanks north of Potomac Creek should be taken to the Aquia facility, and septage pumped from tanks south of Potomac Creek should be taken to the Little Falls Run facility.

Upon arrival at the WWTP the hauler company representative will:

- Check in with appropriate facility staff.
- Present a sample of load for inspection and testing.
- Completely fill out Septage Disposal Log provided on site to include:
  - Date and Time of disposal.
  - Name of Hauler Company.
  - Driver name.
  - Truck Id# (assigned by Stafford)
  - Address of ALL locations serviced (use multiple lines if necessary).
  - pH (as reported by County staff).
- Hauler representative must rake screen and clean area after disposal, and must immediately notify County staff of any issues during disposal to include spills, backups, or other mechanical issues.
