TO: The Honorable Ed Montanari, Chair, and Members of City Council

SUBJECT: A resolution authorizing the Mayor or his designee to accept a \$423,475 grant from the U.S Department of Justice ("DOJ") to aid in the prevention, preparation, and response to coronavirus and execute a grant agreement and all documents necessary to effectuate this transaction; approving a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$423,475 from the increase in the unappropriated balance of the General Fund (0001), resulting from these additional revenues, to the Police Department, Fiscal Support Division (140-1389), PROJECT 17790; and providing an effective date.

EXPLANATION: The City of St. Petersburg ("CITY") applied for a grant in the amount of \$423,475. The City will serve as the representative to this grant and will be responsible for the grant over its three-year life cycle. The City will submit expenditure documentation to DOJ for reimbursement of eligible costs. The grant requires no local matching funds. St. Petersburg Police Department will use the funds to purchase computer equipment to sustain a civilian workforce working remotely, personal protection equipment and overtime allotment for first responders, and air purification equipment for the St. Petersburg Police Department headquarters.

COST/FUNDING/ASSESSMENT INFORMATION: The grant will fund law enforcement initiatives to aid in prevention, preparation, and response to coronavirus effective January 20, 2020 through January 19, 2022. Funds will be available after approval of a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$423,475 from the increase in the unappropriated balance of the General Fund (0001), resulting from these additional revenues, to the Police Department, Fiscal Support Division (140-1389), **PROJECT 17790.**

WHEREAS, pursuant to the grant agreement, the City will submit expenditure documentation to the U.S Department of Justice for reimbursement of eligible costs to support prevention, preparation, and response to the coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$423,475 from the increase in the unappropriated balance of the General Fund (0001), resulting from these additional revenues, to the Police Department, Fiscal Support Division (140-1389), Project 17790 is required.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of St. Petersburg, Florida, that the Mayor or his designee is authorized to accept a \$423,475 grant from the U.S Department of Justice and to execute a grant agreement and all other documents necessary to effectuate this transaction.

Congratulations on your recent award. The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) has been delegated the responsibility for ensuring that recipients of federal financial assistance from the OJP, the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), and the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) are not engaged in discrimination prohibited by law. The Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding (CESF) Program allows eligible states, local units of government, and tribes to support a broad range of activities including preventing, preparing for, and responding to the coronavirus.

All recipients of CESF funding must assist BJA in complying with NEPA and other related federal environmental impact analyses requirements in the use of grant funds, whether the funds are used directly by the grantee or by a sub-grantee or third party.

BJA's expectation is that none of the following activities will be conducted whether under this federal award or a related third party action:

(1) New construction

(2) Any renovation or remodeling of a property located in an environmentally or historically sensitive area, including property (a) listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, or (b) located within a 100-year flood plain, a wetland, or habitat for an endangered species

(3) A renovation that will change the basic prior use of a facility or significantly change its size

(4) Research and technology whose anticipated and future application could be expected to have an effect on the environment

(5) Implementation of a program involving the use of chemicals (including the

identification, seizure, or closure of clandestine methamphetamine laboratories) other than chemicals that are (a) purchased as an incidental component of a funded activity and (b) traditionally used, for example, in office, household, recreational, or education environments.

Consequently, the subject federal action meets the Office of Justice Programs' criteria for a categorical exclusion as contained in paragraph 4(b) of Appendix D to Part 61 of Title 28 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

If, however, award funds are proposed to be used for any of the enumerated projects or activities above, grant recipients must contact their grant manager, and receive written approval prior to commencing that project or activity.
