PROJECTED 2050 POPULATION GROWTH - CITY OF ST. PETE



Workshop Series 2 Theme Implementation

The StPete2050 Phase One online community survey and participant responses have provided information on several important themes related to the future of St. Petersburg.

We want to better understand your opinion of how well each theme has been implemented. Do you think the described theme has been successfully implemented by either the City of St. Petersburg and/or community partners, or is more effort needed? Samples of how the City and community partners have made efforts to implement these themes are listed.

Each table is asked to discuss the theme topic, rate the level of progress attained to date, and then provide any implementation suggestions that should be considered to be more successful in the future. The suggestions you provide will be used to develop the next online community survey.

Arts & Culture

St. Petersburg will continue to be known for its vibrant art and celebrate the wide cultural resources throughout the city.

What We Heard in Phase One:

- The arts are a defining feature of who we are as a city and is a determining factor to many when determining to move to or remain in St. Petersburg.
- There is a worry that as the economy of the city develops, local artists will be priced out of workspaces and housing.
- · While the visual arts are vibrant, more support can be given to the performing arts.

Sample of Previous City / Community Partner Actions:

- Support of the non-profit Arts Alliance for art initiatives, including the Shine Mural Festival with more than 600 murals in the outdoor gallery.
- 'City of the Arts' designation by Mayor's Office that recognizes 11 museums, and their contribution of more than \$76.7M of direct economic impact and more than 2,000 jobs.
- Continued support of public art in Capital Improvement Projects and private development requirements in special districts and downtown development public art fee.
- Dynamic growth and expansion of art and cultural facilities: 11 museums, ArtsXchange facility/campus, Morean Center for Clay, theater/ performance venues (freeFall, American Stage, Palladium, Mahaffey, St. Petersburg Opera), as well as the numerous smaller contributing galleries and home-based studios that add to the artistic fabric.
