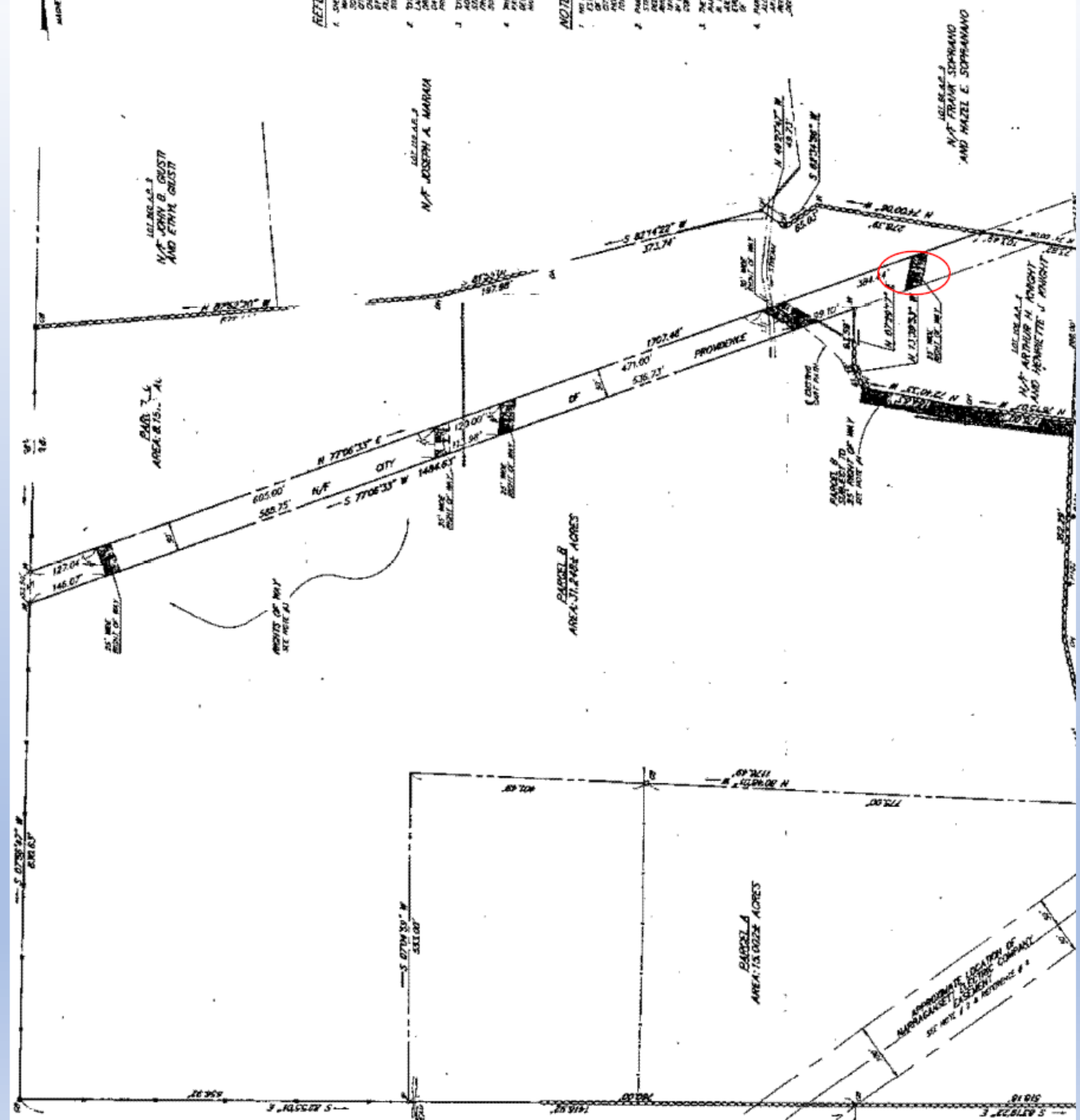

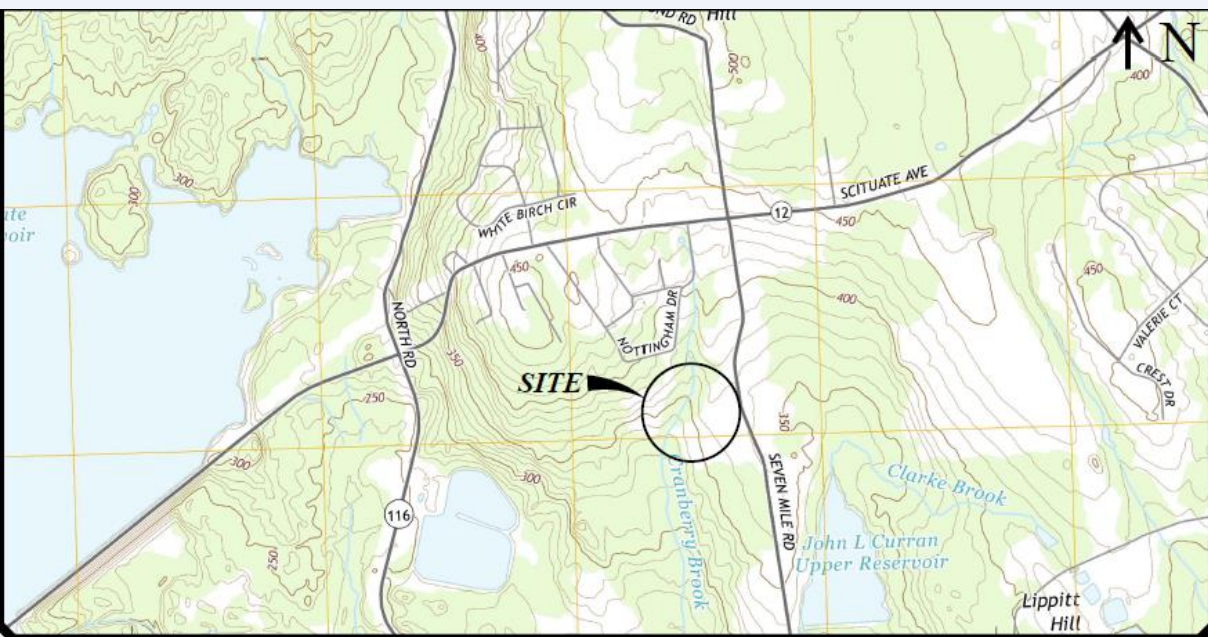

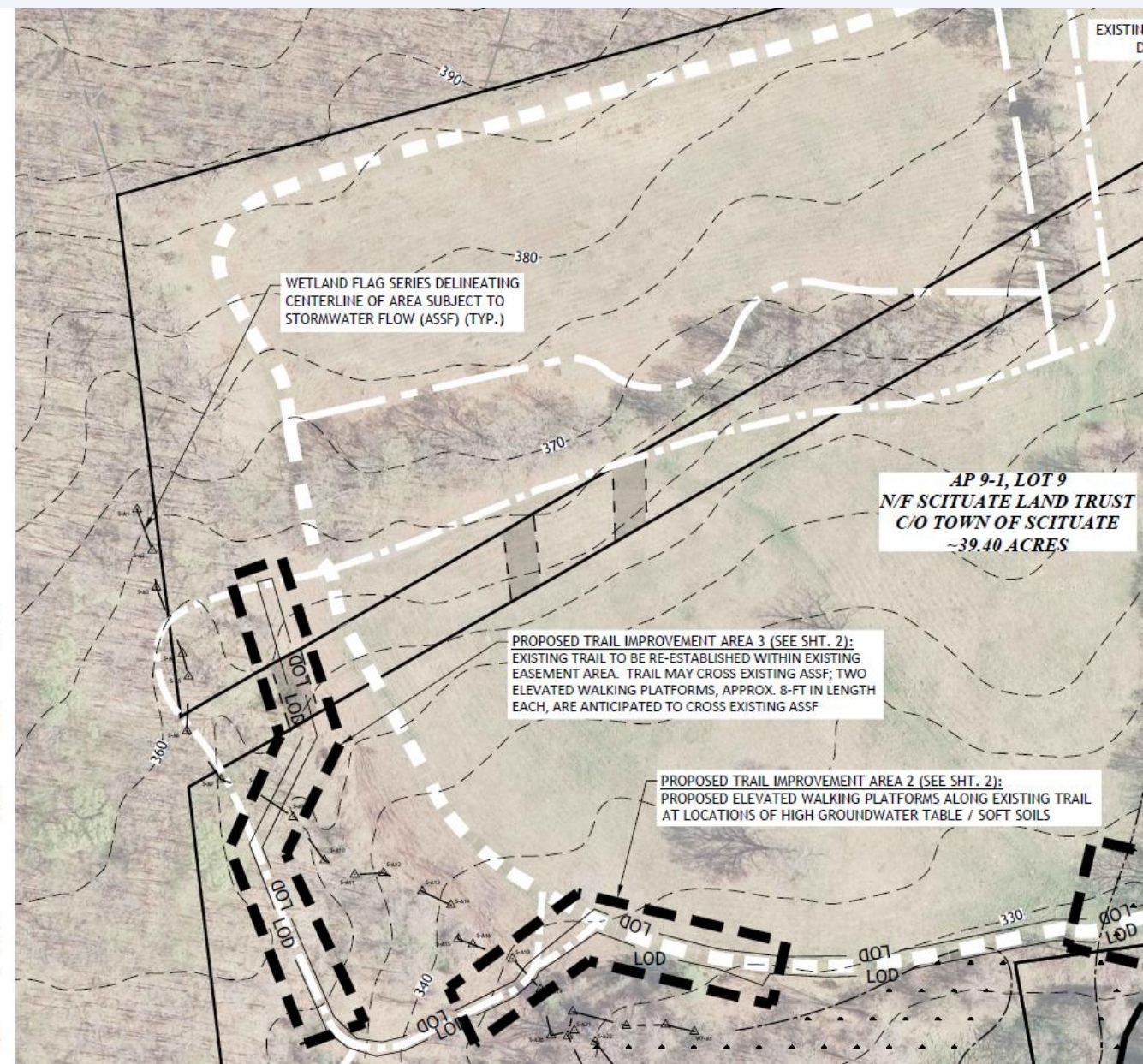

#### Background

Mile-a-minute (*Persicaria perfoliata*) is a trailing vine with barbed stems and triangular leaves. In contrast to other invasive vines, mile-a-minute is an herbaceous annual, meaning it dies each fall and new plants grow from germinating seeds in the spring. Originally from India and East Asia, this species was first reported in York County,

### 19. 30x30 Initiative: Protect 30% of the Country's Land by 2030

Leading scientists around the world have determined we can: sustain the earth's natural system which provide us with clean air and water; [slow](#) climate change; and protect nearly 75% of plant and animal species by conserving at least 30% of our land base by 2030. President Biden's [executive order on Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad](#) embraces that goal. According to RIDEM, nearly 18 % of Rhode Island is currently protected (91,000 acres). Private land conservation by land owners and Land trusts play an important role in reaching this goal in Rhode Island. (Note: Rhode Island is the 2nd most densely developed state. New Jersey, which is the most densely developed state has already conserved more than 30% of their state with their farmland conservation program a key to their accomplishments.)
