Incident Response for May 2023

Total calls for this period were (124) EMS related calls totaled (83). (60) of those calls Winslow transported. Fire related calls were (7) 2 structure fire and 2 brush or brush and grass mix in Winslow. There were 7 calls for non-emergency service, 7 were for hazardous conditions (4 hazardous condition 1 Gas Leak. 1 tree down. 24 calls for service. 3 Good intent calls. 1.911 complaint.

Mutual Aid calls for May were as follows. Winslow received mutual aid on 1 occasion: In total, Winslow requested 10 paramedic intercepts for the month of May. Waterville responded to 5 of those paramedic intercepts requested and transported with us. Additionally, we received from Delta 5 paramedic intercepts and 5 unanswered due to unavailable units.

Department News.

The month of May was busy for our department. The department continues to actively recruit call force members. With the warmer weather crews are actively training every day. Due to a water contamination issue a "DO NOT DRINK THE WATER" warning was sent out by the KWD. Winslow Fire and Winslow PD handed out 230 cases of water to Winslow residences. The Water was donated by Poland Springs Bottling Company and Maine Water Thank you to Winslow Public Works for transporting the water from Oakland to Winslow.

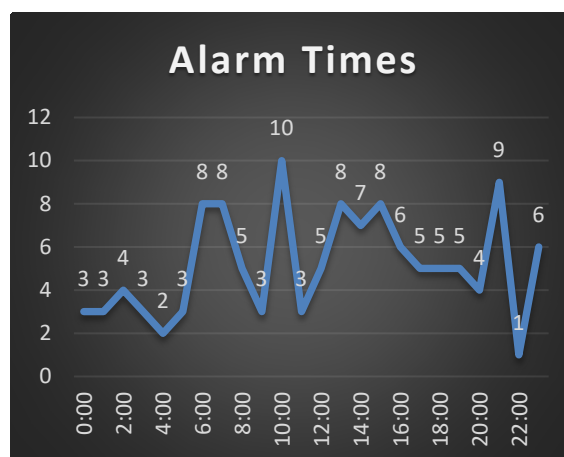
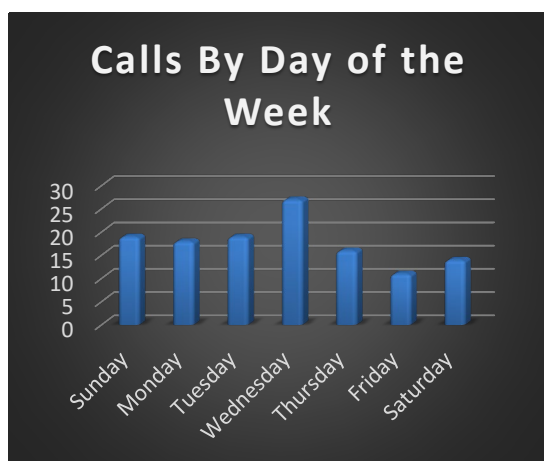
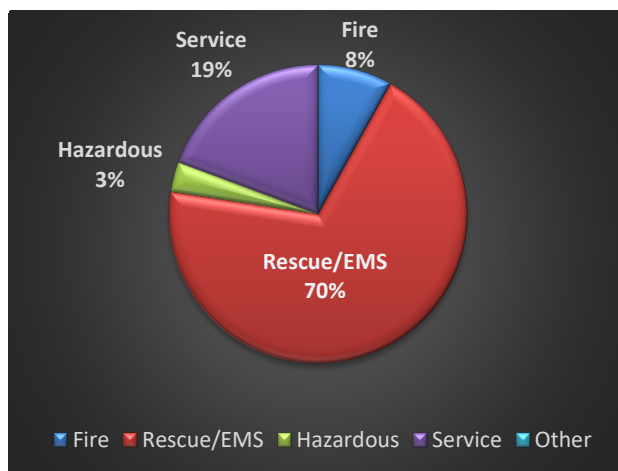

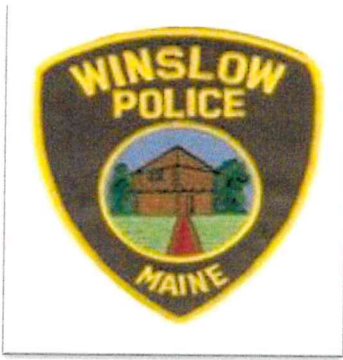
Dear Councilors,

Please accept the following report for May.

- Police Activity Graph for the month of May 2023. Total calls for service 748.
- On Tuesday 05/09/23 I attended a hearing at the Capital in Augusta regarding LD 1828. This bill would allow Waterville dispatch center to get PSAP services. We were advised that Somerset Communications will no longer handle our emergency calls. I got the impression the bill would pass. Having a local dispatch center handle our emergency calls should benefit everyone involved.
- Chaplain Denny is retiring after 12 years. He had responded multiple times to assist both fire and police throughout the years, always willing to help anyone in a crisis. We owe him a great deal of gratitude for his selfless work and dedication to all citizens of Winslow. He will surely be missed.
- Sgt Lund and Jones did a great job defusing a suicidal subject with a gun on 05/11/23 in the evening at 9: PM. This person in a crisis incident was taken into protective custody without anyone getting injured.
- Jonathan Chasse graduated from the Police Academy on Friday 05/19/2023. We are happy to get him back. He will help take some of the burden of being understaffed. Jonathan did a good job in school, graduating in the top third of his class.
- We just filled our non-certified police position with Dylan Rodrigue. This is exciting as we explore an alternative program to attract and hire potential police officers.
- We have two applications to help fill our open patrol slots. We have begun to process both applicants. I am optimistic that we can be fully staffed by fall.
- SRO Officer Ellen Steward attended a two-week MOI school. This is an advanced school that allows her to instruct and train other officers.
- We are nearing the end of the trial period for the new PS Department. I believe we have made positive progress. If anyone would like more details regarding the program, please contact me anytime.
