


Please accept the following report for February.

Chief,

The person that sent the card had reported that she was assaulted here in Winslow inside her residence by her estranged boyfriend. I met the female here at the station and conducted an interview and I instructed her on how to get a protection order. I then set out to find the accused so I could conduct an interview with him. Several attempts were made to interview him and serve him with the protection order but we were unsuccessful. The suspect was aware we were trying to locate him and he was refusing to come forward. I drafted an arrest warrant which was signed and granted for the charge of Domestic Violence Assault. The suspect has a long criminal history of violence and drug charges.

Several days passed. Late one evening the victim contacted police reporting that the suspect was just dropped off at her house and she had been assaulted (again). During this incident he took her phone so she couldn't call police. He then fled the residence on foot. I responded on scene with Officer Theobald and called in a K9 for a track. The track was unsuccessful. It appeared that someone picked up the suspect because the track had gone cold.

A couple days later the victim's mother called the police department asking us to do a welfare check on her daughter. Officer Rousseau and Officer Scott arrived on scene. They located the suspect hiding inside the residence. He was arrested and charged with the arrest warrant for Domestic Violence Assault, a second count of Domestic Violence Assault (for the second episode), Obstructing the Report of a Crime (for not allowing her to call police) and a probation hold because the suspect was already out on probation for felony charges of illegal possession of a firearm. He was also served the protection order that he was avoiding. The suspect is currently in Kennebec County Jail.

The victim dropped off the card to express her appreciation at the efforts of the Winslow Police Department to try and keep her safe.
