



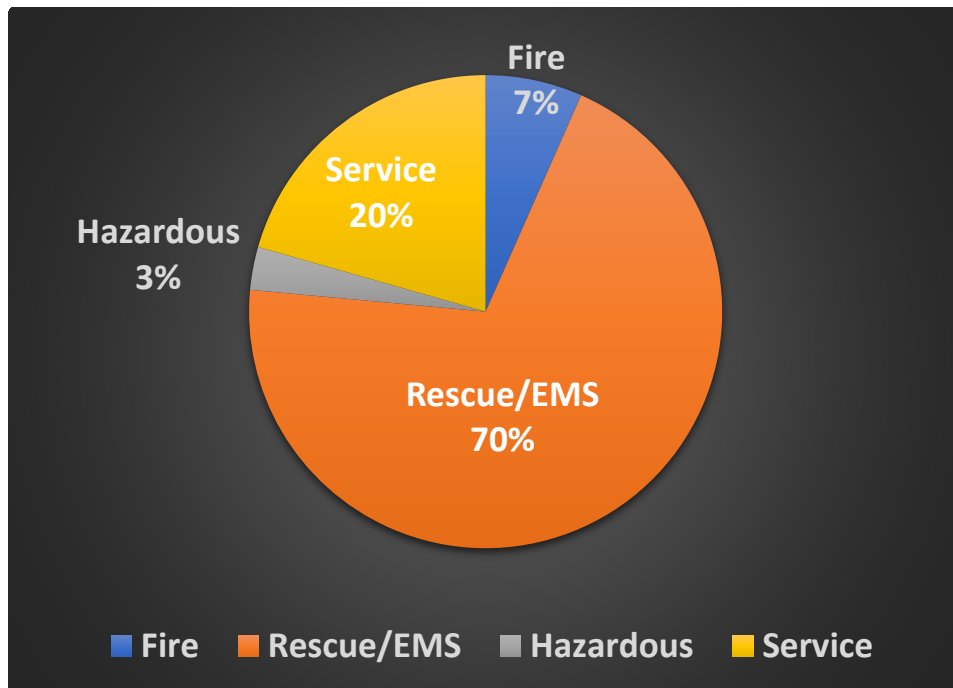

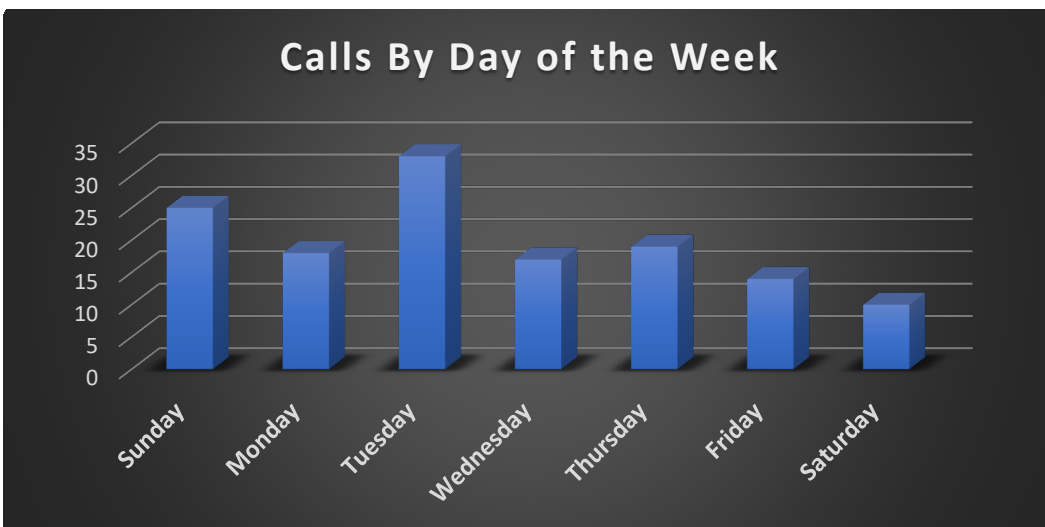
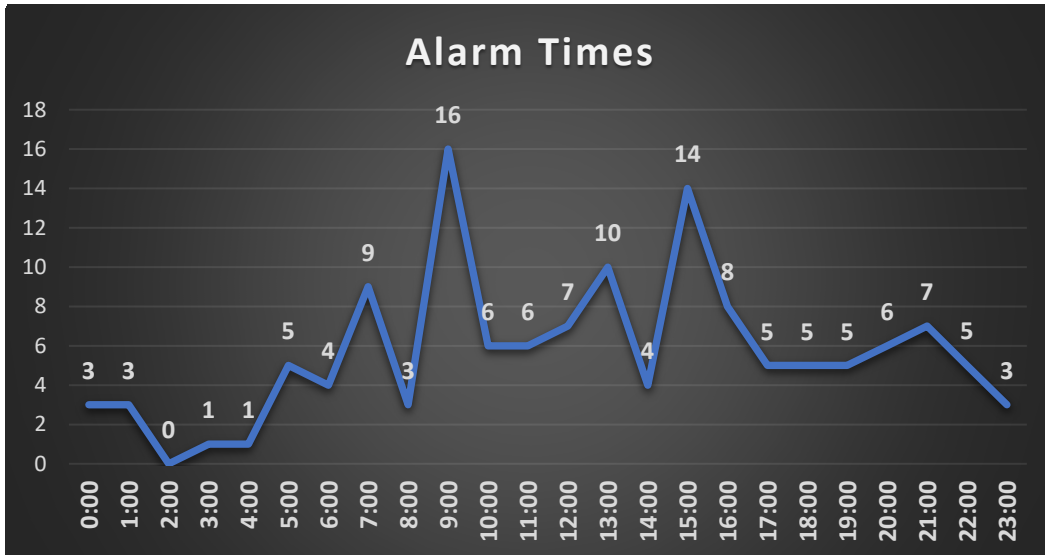
Town Council Monthly Briefing October 2023

Incident Response for October 2023

Total calls for the month were 136, 9 Fire-related calls, 95 EMS related calls, with 52 of them being EMS transports, 4 Hazardous Condition calls and 28 Service-related calls.

Mutual Aid calls for October were as follows. Winslow requested 14 paramedic intercepts for the month. Delta was not able to respond to 10 of those requests as they had no units available. Winslow Fire received mutual aid 3 times in the month of October for EMS related calls. Winslow provided mutual aid 10 times for the month of October. 3 fire calls to Waterville, 5 fire calls to Fairfield, 1 fire call to Albion, and 1 EMS intercept to Unity.

As you can see, we had a busy month in October. Besides the calls for service the Department provided Fire Safety to 480 children at Winslow Elementary School as well as a few daycares in town.

We also did live fire training as a department using the new Training site in Fairfield. This incorporated all aspects of a real fire scenario using hose line deployments, SCBA, Search, Incident command as well as Pump Operations and drafting.

A new Deputy Chief was selected as well. Lieutenant Mike Murphy was appointed the new Deputy Chief on Oct. 20th and started his new duties on Monday October 23rd.

Also, with cold weather fast approaching we encourage everyone to inspect and clean your chimneys, fireplaces, and any heat appliances that you may use. Please change your smoke detectors batteries and test them. Always have a plan in case of a fire. Also, check your fire extinguishers.
