Dear Council members, the result of the resent public disclosure request regarding the status of the Housing planning process makes it very clear that data is now available and we all need a chance to discuss the priorities and process to come. Without ongoing community engagement at this point much misunderstanding is more likely than consensus over the priorities.

It is my hope that the current program's lack of open public engagement on long term planning will change now. We are missing a critical opportunity right now to improve our future safety and infrastructure buildout while many properties are already In the development process.

I suggest the housing planning process must include improved development standard that meet firewise and safety access standards while providing a mix of options across a diverse income strata.

Dear Twisp Town Council, Mayor, Town Planner and Planning Commission:

- <u>Water</u>. Kudos to council members who dismissed the proposal for leasing water rights out of the valley. If water rights are available to lease in the future, perhaps the town might consult with the Methow Watershed Council or the Water Bank If feasible, I would instead support temporarily leasing rights to valley farmers who find themselves with interruptible rights at critical times. Besides, I think there were one (or two) zeroes omitted from the monetary offer.
- 2. <u>Fire.</u> Has anyone noticed that the proposed Orchard Hills development backs up right against thousands of acres of national forest at high risk of mega-fire in the Twisp River drainage and beyond? I support lowering the proposed density, maintaining the required street widths, and requiring the construction of a second ingress/egress as conditions of approval.
- 3. <u>City Planner Hours.</u> With a veritable tsunami of over 250 new housing units in some level of the conceptual or planning stage, I support a budget amendment action be initiated immediately to re-allocate funds for additional planner hours, and an intense search be undertaken to locate a qualified individual. This might address other concerns: ensuring new projects maintain or enhance existing residents' quality of life; and of avoiding litigation*.
- 4. <u>"Affordable" Housing.</u> This issue is not going away. Besides supporting another extension of the moratorium on new nightly rental accommodations, I support the exploration of methods to ensure that at least some of the new units remain truly affordable for those who live and work here full time. Models functioning like the housing trust, ensuring continued affordability, might help to prevent bidding wars on existing housing stock such as was experienced during the first years of the pandemic, literally snatching dwellings out the reach of many local residents.
- 5. <u>Housing Action Plan</u>. With information starting to materialize from this plan, I support efforts to gather and integrate public input from a broad-base of Twisp residents before the plan is finalized, and before proposed development projects now on the table move forward.

Thank you all for your dedication and hard work on these and many other issues. It seems as though the "fast-forward" button has been pushed, and the future is arriving more quickly than we anticipated.

Either through poor planning, lack of standards or non-enforcement, adequate water infrastructure was not required, leaving residents in years to come without legally mandated water pressure. The remedial cost was eventually should by the town years later. Ironically, this area is adjacent to the Orchard Hills area.

- Plant the right tree species in the right places.
- Plant a diversity of tree species so that no single genera makes up mor than ten percent of the tree population.
- Link with other programs and utilize grants and other funding opportunities to implement projects.

- Keep citizens informed of the benefits and services the tree program provides.
- Provide awareness of the importance of the trees to the community; educate the community on proper tree care; and encourage greater participation in tree steward activities.

Please accept my application for the open seat on the town's planning council. My interest stems from a desire to see Twisp grow in a well-planned manner, designed in collaboration with its residents, to create homes, opportunities, and community for all.

We arrived in Twisp as full-time residents just before the pandemic, intent on building a house in town. While nearly derailing our plans, the pandemic also created opportunity for us through deeper connection with our growing community. Every relationship became very intentional.

During the delay in our project, I became more involved in the building process. Now, I can design a home air system for smoke season, been deep into California fire code, weigh TJIs against trusses, can tile a bathroom, file a BLA, run a mini, and have felt the ebb and flow of local labor.

I also took a deep dive into communities across the county through a film and advocacy project for Okanogan County Public Health. I met people across the socioeconomic and political spectrums, people of varying profession, education, and opportunity. These stories gave me valuable insight into who lives in the county and how their stories are woven into Twisp.

In my three short years here, I've learned we're a small enough community that if something needs to be done, someone from the community must step forward.

This is why I'm applying for the planning council. I am not an urban planner, I am a journalist by profession, and I've seen elsewhere what I'm seeing here: a need to manage growth, develop a cohesive and forward-thinking plan, refine town codes for a future that balances recreation, culture, business, and housing.

I have a strong sense for equity and justice, a desire for compromise and consensus, an attention to detail, critical thinking, the ability to listen and relate, collate and present information, a willingness to recognize a need for expertise, and the ability to create community through grassroots engagement.

Objective:

Produce documentary, character-driven stories of the human condition to engage audiences in solutions.

Narrative:

Over a 20-year journalism career, I have focused on trauma and victimization, developing an ability for relational, intimate documentary work. My photojournalistic style, after years covering news, yields observational and visceral cinematography.

As a non-profit founder, I combined documentary films with sexual violence advocacy work. Later, after covering international human trafficking, I returned to Seattle where I focused on domestic minor sex trafficking. I then reported, directed, and filmed *The Long Night*, a feature-length documentary.

In 2015, *The Long Night* won first prizes at World Press Photo, Pictures of the Year International, and Best of Photojournalism, sweeping the industry. I then turned it into a tool for advocacy and awareness.

Through community and government partnership, I used the film to co-create and cohost a convening with the King County Executive, Sheriff, Prosecutor and 85 high-level staff from all departments. This resulted a tearful declaration for policy change from the Executive followed by substantive change.

Launching a Kickstarter-funded, grassroots impact campaign, I used my nonprofit experience to reach communities nationwide, where the film became an advocacy and training tool for court staff, law enforcement, and survivor advocates. I even screened it to the Washington State Supreme Court Justices and Federal judges while they were weighing the argument that the website <u>backpage.com</u> supported human trafficking.

I was also recognized by the Overseas Press Club, and won grants from the Open Society Foundations, Fledgling Fund, Alexia Foundation, and the Fund for Investigative Journalism. I've produced fundraising, communications, and impact campaigns with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, Casey Family Programs, Drug Policy Alliance, Shultz Family Foundation, Starbucks, and YouthCare. I was nominated for two National News & Documentary Emmy Awards and was a finalist for both the Stanford-Knight Journalism Fellowship and Guggenheim Fellowship.

Hi Randy. I will call in via my cell so that I'll be more likely to be able to make the connection. In the application I filled out I didn't provide much of my relevant experience for the position so I'll provide a very abridged sample now for the Council to have before the meeting.

I worked for more than 44 years for the WA Department of Natural Resources in every program they administer in both the field Regions and headquarters in Olympia.

These programs include wildland fire, upland and aquatic land management, forest practices regulation, wildland recreation, surface mined land reclamation, civil engineering, and forest landowner assistance.

I held nearly every position in the department from field forester to Presiding Officer of Brief Adjudicative Proceedings to Exempt Executive Management positions in the field and in Olympia.

Some of my experience that fits best with the Planning Commission role are as follows:

1. I served on Pierce County's Growth Management committee to provide input/recommendations into their first Comprehensive Plan.

2. I interacted extensively with local and state governments on a multitude of wide ranging issues.

3. Worked with counties and to ensure compliance with the Shorelines Management Act regarding timber the harvesting and land clearing.

4. Adjudicated forest practices permit appeals.
