Transportation Benefit District

A Transportation Benefit District (TBD) is authorized by Washington State giving the town the opportunity to fund transportation improvements within the town's limits. TBD projects range in scope from new road construction, to the rehabilitation and maintenance of existing infrastructures. If approved by voters, the sales tax increase authorizes an independent taxing area in the Town of Twisp to fund local transportation projects. The sales tax increase (0.2% or two cents on a \$10 purchase) would leverage funds from all those who shop and dine in the Town, allowing for the shared cost of street improvements between residents, non-residents, and tourists. If the sales tax increase is approved by voters, the revenue will be tracked and audited through Town budget process. Contact the Clerk/Treasurer at 997-4081 with any questions.
