In order to comply with Michigan State Tax Commission recommendations, the Vienna Township Assessment department will be reviewing 20% of the parcels located within Vienna Township each year. Starting April 1<sup>st</sup>, Kevin MacDermaid and/or Ryan MacDermaid will be conducting physical inspections of properties in the Township. This includes measuring the exterior of the house and other structures on the property, taking pictures and interviewing owners to obtain interior characteristics of the structures. At no time will they request to enter your house or any buildings on your property. They will be displaying Vienna Township ID badges, which has their name and picture on them. You may also request to view their Michigan Driver's License to aid in identifying them. Please direct any questions or concerns to the Vienna Township Office.

Happy fall everyone! I hope you had a great summer and found some time to relax and enjoy family and friends. As I've mentioned in previous articles, this off election year has been somewhat relaxed and fairly uneventful for the Clerk's office. It has been a time to catch up on tasks that were put off last year due to the many elections and has also allowed us time to receive and be trained on the new election equipment recently purchased. In August, Clerks and Deputy Clerks from around the County spent 2 ½ days unpacking and testing 1,234 pieces of new equipment to be used by every Municipality in Genesee County for future elections beginning either this November or next year. The new equipment includes ballot scanners, touchwriters (ADA voting machines), printers, tables, ballot boxes and ballot box canvas bags. It was a daunting task, but, it was teamwork at its best and rewarding in the end. Training for Clerks and Deputy Clerks on the new equipment was held in September and each Municipality will now schedule training for their election workers prior to their next election. I think voters will find the equipment to be very similar in operation to the old equipment and election workers will see improvements. Security has been improved and election results will now be transmitted by cellular service providing much quicker race results on election night. The new equipment is replacing 12 year old technology and is slated to be used for at least the next 10 years. Several Municipalities in the County have elections this November, but, Vienna Township does not. The next election for Township residents will occur in 2018, possibly as early as May, but, definitely in August and November where, at the least, you will be asked to elect a new Governor for the State. These next few months would be a great time to check the State website to see if you are registered to vote and if not, do so then, that way you will be able to vote in our next election. There's not much worse for a Clerk than to turn away a voter because they're not registered.

So, with fall upon us, where we see trees change to brilliant hues of yellow, orange and red, days get cooler and for whatever reason life seems to slow down a little, I hope you make some time to relax and experience what our great State has to offer.

The cold weather is on the way therefore it's time to get prepared. You may need to get your chimney inspected or possibly your furnace. An annual furnace inspection will be checking for many small things, but they will also check for a possible carbon monoxide leak from the heat exchanger which can be deadly. It's also very important if you're going to be burning wood, you keep your chimney cleaned periodically to prevent chimney fires. It also may be time to replace your furnace filter for the heating season. Keeping your furnace filter clean or replaced will allow your furnace to perform better and more efficient.



On November 5th we will be changing our clocks back remember to change your smoke detector batteries.

In December, many of us will be putting up our Christmas Trees therefore remember to keep the real trees watered and inspect the lights for shorts or bare spots. We don't want to make a house call to anyone's home, especially during the holiday season.
