The deadline for paying 2018 summer taxes (without penalty) was September 17, 2018. The Township will accept payment, with applicable penalties, until 5:00 pm on February 28, 2019. 2018 winter tax statements will be mailed out the first week of December with payment due February 14, 2019. Any 2018 real property tax payments made after February 28, 2019, <u>MUST</u> be made at the Genesee County Treasurer's office at 1101 Beach Street, Flint, Michigan, phone 877-805-2856. There are special links at <u>www.viennatwp.com</u> to make online Tax and Sewer/Water payments, additional fees will be added for online payments.

There are some new laws coming from our State legislature which may effect assessing property throughout the entire State. These laws may increase property values which in turn can make noticeable changes in your real property tax. If you have any questions concerning your property assessment, please contact Kevin in our assessor's office at 810-686-7676. He is in the office on Tuesday and Thursday. When he is not in the office I suggest you leave a voicemail and he will return your call.

The Board is unified in making Vienna Township the best possible place to live in, do business in, and visit. Home sales continue to be very good. In order to comply with Michigan State Tax Commission recommendations, the Vienna Township Assessment department will be reviewing 20% of the parcels located within Vienna Township each year. Starting April 1<sup>st</sup>, Kevin MacDermaid and/or Ryan MacDermaid will be conducting physical inspections of properties in the Township. This includes measuring the exterior of the house and other structures on the property, taking pictures and interviewing owners to obtain interior characteristics of the structures. At no time will they request to enter your house or any buildings on your property. They will be displaying Vienna Township ID badges, which has their name and picture on them. You may also request to view their Michigan Driver's License to aid in identifying them. Please direct any questions or concerns to the Vienna Township Office.

It has been a very busy election season with recertifying all our Election Inspectors, the first time use of our new election equipment, the first major election with all 5 precincts at the new polling location, the Clio Area Senior Center, and a larger than normal turnout for the Primary. We heard many compliments throughout the day on both the new equipment and the utilization of the Senior Center for the Township's new polling location for voters. The Senior Center received many compliments as well. There were several Township residents that had never visited the Center and were impressed with the building and the many activities they saw posted on the bulletin board and planned on returning, definitely a win-win situation. There were a few suggestions made for improvements to the election flow that will be implemented for the next election, but, all in all we were pleased with this new change. The State reported that voter numbers were up for the August Primary, the biggest turnout that's been seen in four decades! My hope is we will experience a great turnout again in November. As of now I expect another long ballot for November and the best way for you to prepare and to give yourself ample time to make a decision is to visit the State of Michigan website www.mi.gov/vote to preview your ballot before coming to the polls. At a minimum, there will be Federal, State and Local offices along with State proposals to be voted for. As a reminder, if you aren't registered to vote yet, you have until October 8th to do so to vote in November. If you have moved and need to update your voter registration address, you can accomplish this by visiting www.expresssos.com. As winter approaches we often think about getting those last minute projects done like new roofing, new windows or siding. Remember all these require a Building permit. If you are planning on any remodeling, repair or doing any miscellaneous building projects please call the Vienna Township Building Department at 810-686-7676 to verify if any permits are required in order to avoid a \$1500 fine for work done without a permit.

I am working with Fire Chief, Kerry Paulson to inform business owners and homeowners
about the Knox Box. Only the Fire Department can access this box and inside will be a key
to the business or home and phone numbers of who to contact if an incident occurs at

Time to get prepared for the winter season. You may need to get your chimney inspected or possibly your furnace. An annual furnace inspection will be checking for many small things, but they will also check for a possible carbon monoxide leak from the heat exchanger which can be deadly. It's also very important if you're going to be burning wood, you keep your chimney cleaned periodically to prevent chimney fires. It also may be time to replace your furnace filter for the heating season. Keeping your furnace filter clean or replaced will allow your furnace to perform better and more efficient. Also, while it is still nice outside take the time to clean out your dryer vent. Make sure you get a supply of ice melt for those icy areas and get the snow shovel out. Also be sure to put a few items in your car, a blanket, snacks, gloves, a hat and a bag of kitty litter or floor dry for traction under your tires, in case you get stuck.

Everyone is invited to Station #1 for Halloween night, October 31, 2018 from 5pm - 8pm. There will be two lines set up to hand out candy, cider, cotton candy, donuts, coffee and popcorn. This is all free for the public and is paid for by the money collected at our homecoming. Last year we had almost 1500 people come by.

The Clio Area Fire Department is asking all businesses in Vienna Township to purchase a Knox Box. This is like a tiny safe that mounts on the outside of your business that will be locked by the Fire Department. Inside the Knox Box will be the key to your building and phone numbers of whom to contact if we have an incident at your location. This allows us to quickly access your building without damaging any windows or doors. It also saves us valuable time gaining access and allows us to lock back up when we leave, but also gives us someone to contact to let you know you have a situation and you can then meet us there if you're available. We have been using these boxes for the last (18) eighteen years without any issues. The key that opens the Knox Box is locked in the engine at the station, this is controlled by a small computer that records when it is removed and replaced and requires a code be entered to remove it. The cost is about \$325 to \$400. Please contact the Fire Department 810-687-8506 for more information and to place an order.

We are now offering a model for homeowners. So if your on vacation and you have a fire alarm or fire at your home, or your have an elderly relative that needs to be checked on. The Fire Department would be able to get in quickly to asses the situation or get someone out to go to the hospital. The cost for these are about \$200.
