#### WASCO COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR SESSION FEBRUARY 6, 2013

PRESENT: Rod L. Runyon, Chair of Commission

Scott C. Hege, County Commissioner Steve Kramer, County Commissioner Tyler Stone, County Administrator Kathy White, Executive Assistant

At 9:00 a.m. Chair Runyon opened the Regular Session of the Board of Commissioners with the Pledge of Allegiance. The following items were added to the Discussion List:

- Emergency Management Budget Analysis added by Sheriff Eiesland & Emergency Manager Mike Davidson.
- Budget Adjustment Order #13-069 \$1,610 to cover the unbudgeted overage for the Sheriff's vehicle purchase. Added by Finance Manager Monica Morris
- 3. Organizational Chart added by Administrative Officer Tyler Stone
- Holding BOCC sessions at different times and different venues added by Chair Runyon
- 5. Creating a process to allow partners/private citizens to participate in road maintenance added by Chair Runyon
- 6. Delegating authority to Administrative Officer to conduct department head performance reviews added by Chair Runyon

#### Discussion List - Liquor License

Sheriff Eiesland came forward to explain that businesses serving and/or producing liquor outside of city limits apply to for their OLCC license through the County who can or not recommend the issuance of a license. In the past, the

Wasco County Sheriff has reviewed and signed the application; Sheriff Eiesland is asking if the Board wants to be involved in the process.

After some discussion, the Board concluded that they want to be aware of new businesses serving/producing liquor in the area and that it should come before the Board, with input from the Sheriff, in open session so the public also has the opportunity to be aware. In addition, they would like a process that would include notifying the Planning Department and Public Health as they may have some oversight responsibilities.

Further discussion ensued regarding the application before the Board. Sheriff Eiesland reported that the owners have assured him they do not intend to have a tasting room. He reminded the Board that when liquor licenses come up for renewal, the OLCC contacts him to discover if his department has experienced any problems with the licensee.

\*\*\*It was the consensus of the Board to approve the liquor license application submitted by Hood River Cidery, Inc.\*\*\*

#### Discussion List - Emergency Management Budget Analysis

Mike Davidson, Emergency Manager, came forward to explain that due to restoration of Office of Emergency Management funding, there is an opportunity for an additional \$4,000 in funding if the County is willing to match that amount. Sheriff Eiesland suggested that since the Sheriff's department will be receiving income from the Emergency Notification System, the matching funds might come from there. However, he is not comfortable doing so without consulting with partners utilizing that system.

Commissioner Hege asked how the funds would be used. Reminding the Board of Mr. Davidson's upcoming retirement, Sheriff Eiesland explained that he would like to use the funds to hire and start Mr. Davidson's replacement at least a month in advance of his retirement. The funds are not currently available to pay two salaries for that period of time. He would like to use the funds to support a smooth transition by having sufficient training time for the new Emergency Manager.

The Board asked Finance Manager Monica Morris if there were funds available to make the match. Ms. Morris responded she would need some time to explore the possibilities.

Commissioner Hege asked if there was enough time to bring it back before the Board at the next session. Sheriff Eiesland responded that there was plenty of time. The Board directed Ms. Morris to research possibilities for matching funds.

#### Open to Public - Lead Abatement

Chip Wood pointed out that if the Board goes forward with plans under consideration to remove a wall in Room 302, they should be aware that there is certainly lead paint and there will have to be abatement if it is removed.

#### Discussion List - Budget Adjustment

Ms. Morris reminded the Board of discussions at previous sessions regarding the purchase of Sheriff's Department Vehicles which would cost \$1,610 more than had been budgeted for the purchases. She explained that Sheriff Eiesland had directed her to move the money from the Radio Maintenance and Repair Fund to the Vehicle Fund with the approval of the Board. She added that the Sheriff's Department had spent only 8% of their Radio Maintenance budget for the year.

Commissioner Hege made note that the dollar figure for the transfer in the title of the order does not match the dollar amount stated on page 2 of the order.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Order #13-069 transferring \$1,610 from General Fund Radio Maintenance and Repair to General Fund Vehicles during Fiscal Year 2012-2013 with the noted correction to page 2. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

#### Discussion List - Magnet School Grant Letter of Support

\*\*\*After brief discussion of the merits of the program that would be funded by the US Department of Education and its Magnet Schools Assistance Program, the Board was in consensus to sign the letter of support included in the Board Packet.\*\*\*

#### Discussion List - Proposed Emergency Declaration Ordinance

Chair Runyon read the title of the proposed Emergency Ordinance into the record: Ordinance #13-002 IN THE MATTER OF AN ORDINANCE REGULATING LOCAL EMERGENCY DECLARATIONS IN WASCO COUNTY.

Mr. Davidson briefly explained that the purpose of the ordinance is to clearly outline who would have authority to declare and manage a local emergency that does not rise to the level of a state-managed emergency.

The Ordinance will be considered for adoption at the next session of the Board of County Commissioners.

Mr. Davidson provided the Board with copies of the State of Oregon Emergency Declaration Guidelines for Local Elected and Appointed Officials (attached).

Commissioner Hege asked about the NIMS courses for which the Board had been provided links. Mr. Stone and Mr. Davidson encouraged all the members of the Board to take the courses. Mr. Stone advised setting aside a block of time. Teri Thalhofer, North Central Public Health District Director, added that the courses cover basic, common sense information for dealing with emergencies. Mr. Davidson expressed his appreciation for the effort being made by the Board and Administrative Officer to take the courses. He will need a copy of their certificates of completion.

#### Agenda Item - Teven Lien

Planning Director John Roberts explained that he is not seeking eviction, but rather administrative action required by code. He went on to say that this particular issue has been in process since 2004.

Chair Runyon echoed Mr. Roberts, stating that this is a process that began prior to the terms of any of the Commissioners currently holding office and emphasized the fact that no one is being evicted.

Codes Enforcement Officer Kate Foster added that the amount of the lien had been approved previously but not signed. She has contacted Mr. Teven who flatly refuses to do anything to bring his property into compliance. She advised him of the action that would be taken.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Hearings officer Order #13-067 in the case of Thomas Teven. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

#### Discussion List - Customer Success Story

Chair Runyon asked Mr. Roberts to provide some background for the Customer Success Story included in the Board Packet. Mr. Roberts explained that they have been conducting more interdepartmental meetings trying to understand each other's processes and find ways to work collaboratively. The story reflects the result of those efforts and illustrates how both the public and county staff have benefitted.

Chair Runyon pointed out that what might have taken several days was resolved in just one day. Commissioner Hege referenced the previously discussed liquor license and pointed out there may be another opportunity to create efficiencies by collaborating on that process.

Commissioner Kramer added that he had met with the City Codes Enforcement Officer Nikki Lesich who had expressed her pleasure with the relationship Ms. Foster has developed with the City.

#### Discussion List - Veterans Services Advisory Committee

Commissioner Hege asked if all the appointments are supported by the Committee. Chair Runyon responded that they are.

{{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve Order #13-035 appointing Dallas Swafford to the Wasco County Veterans Services Advisory Committee. Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Order #13-036 appointing Donna Lawrence to the Wasco County Veterans Services Advisory Committee. Chair Runyon seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

{{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve Order #13-037 appointing Jim Burres to the Wasco County Veterans Services Advisory Committee.

Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Order #13-038 appointing Gary Pratt to the Wasco County Veterans Services Advisory Committee. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

#### Discussion List - MCCOG Appointment

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Order #13-068 appointing Carolyn Wood to the Mid-Columbia Council of Governments Board of Directors as recommended by the City of The Dalles. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

#### Discussion List - Board of Health Appointment

Discussion ensued around the two candidates who have expressed an interest in serving on the Board of Health – Carri Ramsey-Smith from DHS whose term recently expired and Dr. William Hamilton affiliated with Mid-Columbia Medical Center. Ms. Thalhofer explained that under the current bylaws the Board of Health must have a representative from social services and that Wasco County had verbally agreed to make that one of their appointments. She went on to say that the bylaws have been revised but not adopted; the revisions remove the restrictions placed on appointments regarding the vocation of the appointment will require residence in the County from which they receive the appointment. Once the revised bylaws have been adopted, new appointments can be made.

Mr. Stone stated that he feels it is important that the local hospital have a voice on the Board of Health; Dr. Hamilton will no longer be able to serve as an appointee from Sherman County as he resides in Wasco County. Mr. Stone will notify MCMC that the Board can reconsider Dr. Hamilton's appointment in July if the revised bylaws are adopted.

{{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve Order #13-051 appointing Carri Ramsey-Smith to the North Central Public Health District Board of Health. Chair Runyon seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

#### Agenda Item - Title III Submissions

Ms. White explained that the submissions included in the Board Packet were for search and rescues executed on Federal lands and therefore eligible for reimbursement through the Title III fund obligated by Board for Search and Rescue. Ms. Morris needs the consent of the Board in order to transfer the funds to cover the cost of the search and rescue activities.

\*\*\*The Board was in consensus to have Ms. Morris transfer the funds to cover the cost of the submitted search and rescue activities.\*\*\*

#### Consent Agenda - Minutes and Appointments

Chair Runyon reviewed the items included on the Consent Agenda.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

#### Agenda Item - Vehicle Committee Recommendations

Ms. Morris reported that the purpose of the most recent Vehicle Committee Meeting was to talk about Public Health separating from Wasco County and what impact that would have on the vehicle program. The Committee recommends that Public Health continues in the roll down program and maintains membership on the committee. However, the Committee feels that Public Health should no longer participate in the new vehicle purchases.

Ms. Thalhofer interjected that it would not be an issue for Public Health.

\*\*\*Following a brief discussion, the Board was in consensus to follow the recommendations of the Vehicle Committee.\*\*\*

### Discussion List – Holding BOCC Sessions at Different Times & Locations

Chair Runyon explained that although sessions held in other locations have not always been well-attended, it is important to create opportunities for citizens outside The Dalles to attend sessions without travel or missed work hours. He has asked Ms. White to look for opportunities to have sessions outside The Dalles when there is an item on the agenda that might be of particular interest to residents in other parts of the county. He asked that members of the Board as well as department heads work with Ms. White in discovering those opportunities.

Commissioner Hege proposed that the Road Advisory Committee might provide a linchpin for meetings outside The Dalles. He also encouraged occasional evening meetings in The Dalles.

Youth Services Director Molly Rogers suggested that the Board might reach out to outlying areas to have presentations before the Board highlighting activities, events or programs that are occurring in their local communities. She pointed out that Maupin would be a good candidate and that other departments may have similar suggestions. She added that Tygh Valley would also be a good candidate for a presentation.

Chair Runyon asked Ms. Rogers to work with Ms. White to develop that idea.

### Discussion List – Creating a Process to Allow Partners/Private Citizens to Participate in Road Maintenance

Chair Runyon opened the discussion by saying that there are liability and legal issues in regard to roads that are not heavily traveled; private citizens want to help maintain these roads but face restrictions. The Road Advisory Committee will be looking at this issue.

Mr. Stone reported that the newly-formed Road Advisory Committee has met twice, spending most of their time educating members with the second meeting focusing on budget issues. They are considering adding four or five members to bring in other parts of the County.

Commissioner Kramer interjected that he did not think the Committee would actually be expanding; rather they would be replacing members who have discovered that they do not have the necessary time to participate in the Committee. He added that Jon Oshel from the Association of Oregon Counties will be coming in to talk to the Committee about funding and the legislative environment.

Mr. Wood, a member of the Wasco County Budget Committee, asked if they have a timeline for presenting to the Budget Committee.

Mr. Stone replied that he is not confident there is time for that. The County has 2-2.5 years before we are out of money; we need to develop solutions now.

Commissioner Hege added that any information they can provide will help them to have impact on the budget process.

Chair Runyon asked Ms. Morris if she should have a role in that. Ms. Morris responded that there should be input from Finance.

Commissioner Hege stated that he would like to see something come out of this to help the County pare back in the upcoming budget in preparation for cutbacks. For the last two years we have said well we are still working on it and we are hoping the solution comes; he believes we need to take some action in this next budget and not just say we are going to blow through another year and spend

another extra million dollars taking the beginning funds balance down. He went on to say that unless something happens in the next couple of months that suggests there will be some other funding for roads, it is inappropriate to spend blindly. He stated that something needs to happen in this next budget year that at least stems some of the bleeding.

#### Agenda Item - Mediation Resolution

Ms. White explained that she has just recently become aware of the biennial grant process which has historically been coordinated by Wasco County for Wasco, Wheeler, Gilliam, Hood River and Sherman Counties. The resolution before the Board declares the five counties' intent to participate in the RFA process to secure funding for a Community Dispute Resolution Program which is currently Six Rivers Mediation for all five counties. She went on to say that all five counties will apply for funding separately but the funding will go to one program accessed by all five.

The Board asked who uses the program. Ms. White replied that the schools and juvenile department among others access their services. Mr. Stone added that the County has recently used them.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve the Joint Resolution In the Matter of Participation in Funding Activities of the Oregon Office for Community Dispute Resolution. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

Chair Runyon recessed the session at 10:18 a.m.

The session reconvened at 10:21 a.m.

## Agenda Item – Public Health Contract: National Association of County and City Health Officials Agreement

Ms. Thalhofer explained that this is the first time they have applied for this funding which supports the Medical Reserve Corps facilitated by Public Health. The \$4,000 in funding would be used for recruitment and non-emergency training events for the volunteers who can be activated by the Emergency Manager in the case of an emergency. She added that this is the third year and last year Public Health has had an AmeriCorps volunteer to coordinate this program.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve the National Association of County and City Health Officials Agreement Contract MRC 13-24664. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously. }}}

## Discussion List – Delegating Authority to the Administrative Officer to Conduct Department Head Performance Reviews

Chair Runyon stated that although some of the department heads are elected officials and therefore not under the authority of the Administrative Officer, he would like to designate and authorize the Administrative Officer to conduct performance reviews for all non-elected department heads and make it available to elected department heads. He asked for the opinions of the other members of the Board.

Commissioner Hege agreed that it would be appropriate to authorize the Administrative Officer to conduct the reviews adding that using the 360 degree review system, the Board would still have the opportunity to participate in the process. He went on to say that even though elected officials are not subject to review by the Administrative Officer, he would like to offer them the opportunity to participate in the feedback portion of a 360 degree review system as they could gain valuable insights that could help them improve systems and policies within their departments.

\*\*\*The Board was in consensus to authorize Mr. Stone to conduct performance reviews for non-elected department heads.\*\*\*

#### Discussion List - Organizational Chart

Chair Runyon remarked that this is an ongoing discussion and highlighted the County's need for a clear organizational chart. He suggested that a line be added to connect the staff of elected officials to the Administrative Officer to make it clear that department staff are employees of the County and fall under the authority of the Administrative Officer.

Ms. Thalhofer suggested that the County needed a clear policy to support that so that employees understand the chain of authority in the County.

Chair Runyon responded that the policy may come; the organizational chart is the first step towards creating that policy. Commissioner Hege agreed that the chart is a good place to start.

Mr. Stone added that throughout the state other counties face the same dilemma; for example, in some counties the Sheriff has authority over staff while others feel it is the county administration that should hold that responsibility.

Ms. Thalhofer pointed out that the current county personnel policy is out of date. Ms. Morris agreed saying that when it was written, Public Works and Planning were housed in the Courthouse and covered by a policy that indicates "Courthouse staff." Now that they are in a separate building it is no longer clear that the policy applies to them.

Chair Runyon also suggested that names be removed from those positions beneath elected officials so that it encompasses all staff rather than designated staff.

Ms. Morris stated that it will be useful to know what the reporting structure is when creating job descriptions.

#### Commission Call

Commissioner Kramer reported he would be meeting in open forum with the new acting Regional Forester for the Barlow District along with the Fire/Fuel and Aviation Management. They discussed will be discussing what is and is not working and talked about planning for the future.

Chair Runyon reported being on a conference call with the Veterans subcommittee for the AOC. They reviewed the many bills related to veterans' issues. He asserted to the group that anything going forward toward the building of the Veterans home in Lebanon should include some compensation for Wasco County since the home here had to be built without state funding; acknowledging that Representative Huffman has already pursued this issue to no avail. He also supported VSO officers located on college campuses and reminded the group that it is also important at community colleges located in rural areas.

Mr. Wood asked if a conversation had been started with City Manager Nolan Young regarding the Google money which he suggested could be used for veterans' services.

Mr. Stone responded that they had not; Chair Runyon added that they would like to enter those discussions soon.

Chair Runyon adjourned the session at 10:45 a.m.

#### **Proposed STEM Magnet School**

North Wasco School District #21 is preparing a proposal in response to an RFP from the U.S. Department of Education and its Magnet Schools Assistance Program. If awarded a grant, it would allow us to open a grades 7-12 Magnet School based upon STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), incorporating the Arts and Place Based Education as vital components in the program, in the fall of 2013. The school would physically reside at the former Wahtonka High School site, and would relocate and enhance the Project Endeavor Research and Development Lab Program started at The Dalles Wahtonka High School in the fall of 2012. This program combines math and science concepts, technology tools, working in teams and with mentors on real-world sustainability challenges.

Student entrance into the program would be by parent choice, followed by a lottery process if there was more interest than the 50 slots per grade level would accommodate. 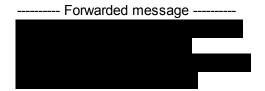

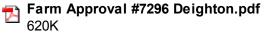

203.0451 (Follow this link to read the ORS in full)

#### Procedure for adopting ordinance

- (3) Except as subsections (4) and (5)(a) of this section provide to the contrary, every ordinance of a county governing body shall, before being put upon its final adoption, be read fully and distinctly in open meeting of that body on two days at least 13 days apart.
  - (5) Any reading required by subsection (3) or (4) of this section may be by title only:
- (a) If no member of the governing body present at the meeting requests that the ordinance be read in full;

Although the Board did discuss this proposed ordinance at the 1.16.2013 session, I am not confident that the Title was read verbatim. That needs to be done at this session.

The ORS does not require the Ordinance to be published, but I will post it to the web and would like to place a notice in the paper that it exists and where it can be found (both on-line and hard copy) to give the public the opportunity to review and comment if they wish.

The proposed Ordinance will come before the BOCC for adoption at the 2.20.2013 session.

WHEREAS, ORS 401.032(2) states, "It is declared to be the policy and intent of the Legislative Assembly that preparations for emergencies and governmental responsibility for responding to emergencies be placed at the local level. The state shall prepare for emergencies, but shall not assume authority or responsibility for responding to an emergency unless the appropriate response is beyond the capability of the city and county in which the emergency occurs, the city or county fails to act, or the emergency involves two or more counties; and

WHEREAS, Wasco County will, to the extent practicable, prepare for, respond to, recover from and mitigate emergencies that occur in Wasco County with local resources; and

WHEREAS, when an emergency condition exists that is beyond the County's ability to effectively respond and recover from with local resources, the County will 1 - ORDINANCE

submit a request for Emergency Declaration to the Governor as provided for in ORS 401.165(1) and (2).

NOW THEREFORE, the Commission ordains that in order to effectively respond to and recover from a locally declared emergency, the following provisions are established under the authority of ORS 401.039 to assist the Board of Commissioners with local emergency response activities:

#### Sections:

- 1. Definitions
- 2. Authority of County
- 3. Declarations of Local Emergency
- 4. Authority of County Administrator
- 5. Emergency Measures
- 6. Succession of Authority
- 7. Penalty

#### Section 1 – Definitions

- A. "Board" means the Wasco County Board of Commissioners.
- B. "Chair" means the Chairperson of the Wasco County Board of Commissioners.
- C. "County Administrator" means the Wasco County administrator.
- D. "Sheriff" Means the chief law enforcement officer of Wasco County.
- E. "Emergency" has the same meaning as ORS Chapter 401.025 (1):
  - "1) "Emergency" means a human created or natural event or circumstance that causes or threatens widespread loss of life, injury to person or property, human suffering or financial loss, including but not limited to:

#### 2 - ORDINANCE

- (a) Fire, explosion, flood, severe weather, landslides or mud slides, drought, earthquake, volcanic activity, tsunamis or other oceanic phenomena, spills or releases of oil or hazardous material as defined in ORS 466.605, contamination, utility or transportation emergencies, disease, blight, infestation, civil disturbance, riot, sabotage, acts or terrorism and war; and
- (b) A rapid influx of individuals from outside this state, a rapid migration of individuals from one part of this state to another or a rapid displacement of individuals if the influx, migration or displacement results from the type of event or circumstance described in paragraph (a) of this subsection.
- F. "Emergency Area" means the geographical area, as identified by the County through an Emergency Declaration, where an emergency exists.
- G. "Emergency management functions" has the same meaning as that found in ORS 401.305(5):
  - 5) The emergency management functions shall include, as a minimum:
    - a. Coordination of the planning activities necessary to prepare
       and maintain a current emergency operations plan,
       management and maintenance of emergency operating
       facilities from which elected and appointed officials can direct emergency and disaster response activities;

- b. Establishment of an incident command structure for management of a coordinated response by all local emergency service agencies; and
- c. Coordination with the Office of Emergency Management to integrate effective practices in emergency preparedness and response as provided in the National Incident Management System established by the Homeland and Security Presidential Directive 5 of February 28, 2003."
- H. "Unavailable" means for any reason rendering the individual unable to perform official acts.

### Section 2 – Authority of County

In accordance with ORS Chapter 401 the County shall have the authority and responsibility to respond to emergencies.

### <u>Section 3 – Declaration of Local Emergency</u>

- A. The Board may declare that a local state of emergency exists; such declarations shall:
  - Be in writing and limit the duration of the state of emergency to the period of time during which the conditions giving rise to the declaration exist or are likely to remain in existence.
  - State the factors which give rise to the emergency and shall designate all emergency areas covered by the declaration.
  - 3) Be immediately communicated to the public at large.

#### 4 - ORDINANCE

B. If time is of the essence the Chair, or County Commissioner by seniority in the absence of the Chair, or successor pursuant to Section 6 or this Ordinance, may declare a local state of emergency; however, a majority of the Board must adopt the declaration at the first available opportunity.

### Section 4 – Authority of County Administrator

- A. If authorized by the Commission, the County Administrator shall be responsible for emergency management functions within the County under an emergency declaration;
- B. If a local state of emergency has been declared and if authorized by the declaration, the County administrator may exercise control over all departments, divisions, and officers of Wasco County for the purpose of addressing the emergency.

### <u>Section 5 – Emergency Measures</u>

- A. Upon a declaration of a local state of emergency, the Board, its designated representative, or successor authorized under Section 6 of this Ordinance, may:
  - 1) Establish a curfew for emergency areas;
  - 2) Prohibit or limit public gatherings within the emergency area;
  - Prohibit or restrict vehicular and pedestrian traffic within in an emergency area;
  - Restrict access to, or expel persons from, emergency areas;
  - 5) Order mandatory evacuations of residents within an emergency area;
  - 6) Implement mutual aid agreements;

### 5 - ORDINANCE

- Suspend competitive bidding procedures in obtaining necessary goods, services and equipment during the emergency;
- 8) Redirect county funds for emergency use;
- Order all other measures reasonably necessary to protect life, property and the environment, and;
- Petition the Governor of the State of Oregon to declare a state of emergency.

### <u>Section 6 – Succession of Authority</u>

- A. If during a state of emergency no members of the Board are available; the powers vested in the Board under this Ordinance shall pass as follow:
  - 1) To the County Administrator; or
- B. If the County Administrator is unavailable, the authority granted in this section shall pass as follows:
  - 1) To the County Sheriff; or
  - 2) If the Sheriff is unavailable, to the Sheriff's Chief Deputy; or
  - If the Sheriff's Chief Deputy is unavailable, to the County Emergency Manager.
- C. The line of succession set forth in this section shall apply to all provisions of this Ordinance except as otherwise provided in Section 3.
- D. Authority granted to county officials under this section shall be limited exclusively to the provisions of this Ordinance.
- E. Authority granted to county officials under this section shall apply only if and when no person holding a higher place in the line of succession is available.

### 6 - ORDINANCE

### Section 7 – Penalty

Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance is guilty of a violation.

Violation of the provisions of this Ordinance is punishable, upon conviction, by a fine of not more than \$500.00 for each violation.

THIS ORDINANCE shall take effect on May 21, 2013.

## WASCO COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR SESSION JANUARY 9, 2013

PRESENT: Rod L. Runyon, Chair of Commission

Scott C. Hege, County Commissioner Steve Kramer, County Commissioner Tyler Stone, County Administrator Kathy White, Executive Assistant

At 9:00 a.m. Chair Runyon opened the Regular Session of the Board of Commissioners with the Pledge of Allegiance and welcomed Steve Kramer to the Wasco County Board of Commissioners. Mr. Stone asked to add the Security Camera Contract to the Discussion List.

### **Discussion List - Election of Chair**

Chair Runyon opened the floor to nominations for Commission Chair.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to nominate Rod Runyon as Chair for the 2013 calendar year. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion. Commissioners Hege and Kramer voted yea, Chair Runyon abstained; motion carried.}}}

### **Discussion List – Security Camera Contract**

Mr. Stone requested a contracting rules exemption for the Milestone support contract which is over the \$5,000 threshold. He explained that Milestone is the only source for their software support. He cited Section 23(1) of the Wasco County Local Contract Review Board Rules:

"As authorized by ORS 279B.075, a contracting agency may award a contract for goods or services when the local contract review board determines in writing that the goods or services, or classes of goods or services, are available from only one source."

{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve the purchase and Milestone Software Support Contract based on the cited exemption. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

### Open to Departments/Public – Sheriff's Office Retirements

Chief Deputy Lane Magill came forward to announce the retirements of Emergency Manager Mike Davidson (3.31.2013) and Civil Deputy Sunny Talatzko (2.28.2013). He outlined plans to reclassify the Civil Deputy position to a Civil Technician which better reflects the duties of the position and will also save money. He went on to say they would like to advertise the position in the next two or three weeks in order to allow some training time before Ms. Talatzko leaves. Ms. Talatzdo has been with the Sheriff's Department for 13 years.

Chair Runyon asked that Ms. Talatzdo be scheduled to appear at the last Board session in February and Mr. Davidson at the last session in March to give the Board the opportunity to thank them for their years of service. Chief Deputy Magill agreed, adding that he would not be able to attend as he is leaving for the FBI National Academy. The Board commended him for his selection, recognizing it as an honor.

### **Discussion List - STOP Grant**

Prevention Coordinator Debby Jones came forward to ask approval to apply for the STOP (Sober Truth on Preventing Underage Drinking Act) Grant. She explained that Youth Think had missed obtaining the grant last year by only two points. The grant is for \$50,000 per year for up to three years with no match requirements. She is reviewing a winning grant application from Multnomah County to discover how she might improve her application this year. She will review the application with Finance Manager Monica Morris for accuracy before submitting it electronically. She went on to say she is working with Center for Living and local physicians on a screening process for detecting abuse.

\*\*\*After brief discussion, the Board was in consensus for Ms. Jones to move forward with the STOP Grant application.\*\*\*

Ms. White pointed out that Ms. Jones was recently appointed to the Governor's Addictions and Mental Health Advisory Committee to represent the unique issues

associated with rural drug abuse. The Board applauded her hard work and dedication. Ms. Jones explained she would begin the three year appointment next week; the Committee will be coordinating with CCO's to keep prevention on the table.

### **Discussion List - Commissioners' Committee Appointments**

Chair Runyon stated that although not a requirement, the City of Maupin, would prefer to have a County Commissioner sit on the Deschutes River Management Committee and have asked that the Board of County Commissioners select which of their members should be appointed.

{{After brief discussion, Chair Runyon moved to recommend the appointment of Commissioner Hege to the Deschutes River Management Advisory Committee. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion. Chair Runyon and Commissioner Kramer voted yea; Commissioner Hege abstained – motion carried.}}}

Commissioner Hege explained that the County has two positions on the QLife Board of Directors. Commissioner Hege holds one of those positions. Dan Erickson, who holds the second seat, has submitted his resignation. Commissioner Hege recommends Brian Ahier, who had been the City of the Dalles representative to QLife, be appointed to fill Dan Erickson's position.

{{Chair Runyon moved to appoint Brian Ahier to replace Dan Erickson on the QLife Board of Directors. Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously}}}

Consent Agenda – 12.19.2012 Minutes, NORCOR Appointments, MCCOG appointments, Crates Point Appointment, ADA Coordinator Appointment

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve the Consent Agenda.

Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

### Discussion List - Mid-Columbia Fire and Rescue Forum

Chair Runyon explained that he would not be available to attend the Forum. Commissioner Hege said he would attend; Commissioner Kramer may attend.

### Discussion List - Lewis & Clark Fountain Letter of Support

Commissioner Hege explained that the City has plans to commission a bronze Lewis & Clark statue to be placed at the end of Court Street. They are applying for a grant to fund the project.

{{Chair Runyon moved to provide a letter to the City of The Dalles in support of their efforts to obtain funding for the statue. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}

### Agenda Item - Wasco County Audit

Carol Friend, C.P.A., came forward to present the 2011-2012 Fiscal Year Audit Report. She began by saying there had been no significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. She mentioned that resolutions should be identified separately in the minutes of Commission Sessions. She also stated that the revised LB forms used for filing the budget with the State are much more summarized; therefore, the budget resolution will need to be amended to include more detail. Lastly, she recommended that there be more internal control over cash deposits. Currently, the process is completed entirely by the County Treasurer; she suggested that someone else be added to the process to provide that control.

Chair Runyon asked Chad Krause, County Treasurer, what statute says regarding the process. Mr. Krause responded that he is not aware of anything in statute covering this. The Board asked that Mr. Krause work with Finance Manager, Monica Morris to define a process and notify the Board of their final plan.

Commissioner Hege asked Ms. Friend why they have not commented on this in previous audits. She responded that during the audit they discovered some

undated reconciliations which caused them to examine the process more deeply. That examination uncovered the cash deposit process.

Ms. Friend went on to review the Audit Report included in the Board Packet. She pointed out notes on page 33 of the Audit. Note #1 addresses changes in accounting policies in response to changes in the Governmental Accounting Standards. Note #2: Budget Stewardship - there was a deficit fund balance in the Parks fund at the end of the year.

Ms. Friend explained that they had found a large difference between what was received in Federal awards from the previous year; that was due to Schools to Roads fund reductions. She also identified Wasco County as a low-risk auditee. Their only comment is the deficit fund balance which is a violation of budget law.

The Board commended Ms. Morris for her work which resulted in such a good audit.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to accept the Auditor's Report for the 2011-2012 Fiscal Year. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

### Agenda Item – Budget Adjustments

Ms. Morris came forward to explain the budget adjustments included in the Board Packet. She stated that when the budget was adopted, the County was not aware that The City of The Dalles would not be contributing to the payment of the Crates Point debt. The County needs to cover that shortage by moving funds to the Transfers Out line item and then adjust the expenditure by increasing payments due and decreasing the City account.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Order 13-002 In the Matter of Transferring \$25,000 from General Fund Contingency to General Fund Non-Department Expenditures, Transfer to Crates Point Debt Service Fund During Fiscal Year 2012-2013. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}

**{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Resolution 13-002 In the Matter of Increasing the Transfer from the General Fund to the Crates Point Debt** 

Service Fund by \$25,000 During the Fiscal Year 2012-2013. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}

Ms. Morris reminded the Board of the discussion at a previous Board Session regarding the opportunity to save money on the purchase of IS equipment which resulted in the decision to use unexpended IS personnel funds to purchase the discounted equipment. Order #13-003 will allow for that transfer of funds.

{{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve Order 13-003 In the Matter of Transferring \$11,340 from General Fund Information Services Analyst Fund to Computer Replacements Fund During Fiscal Year 2012-2013.

Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}

### Agenda Item – Adoption of the Update to the Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan

Planning Director John Roberts came forward and outlined the process used to create the plan included in the Board Packet. He reminded the Board that the planning department had presented progress reports to them throughout the process. Much of the work was accomplished by RARE Intern Will Clark. The plan has been submitted to and approved by FEMA. The Board needs to approve the plan before the plan is officially recognized by FEMA. He went on to say that not only is the development of the plan a useful exercise, but the plan itself opens doors to three funding sources for the mitigation of natural hazard occurrences. Mr. Davidson added that although the plan is not often used, it is critical when needed and must be updated every five years.

Commissioner Hege inquired about the Pre-disaster Mitigation Program Grant. Mr. Davidson explained that those funds are used in places like Tillamook to get houses on stilts putting them out of flood danger. Although he checks every year for eligibility, in seven years he has never found anything for which Wasco County could apply.

{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Resolution 13-003 Adopting updates to the Wasco County Multi-Jurisdictional Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

### **Agenda Item – Planning Commission Appointments**

Mr. Roberts outlined the discussion from a previous Board session where it was determined that it would be beneficial to have two alternates to the Planning Commission. The bylaws have been evaluated and revised to include that change. The Planning Commission received five applications and interviewed four of the applicants; they recommend the re-appointment of Vicki Ashley to the Planning Commission, the appointment of Andrew Myers as first alternate and Taner Elliot as second alternate. He added that all the interviewed candidates were qualified and enthusiastic; the decision was difficult.

Chair Runyon added that he was on the advisory committee and found that the decision process was fair – everyone had a vote and an opportunity to express their opinion.

{{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve Order #13-008 reappointing Vicki Ashley to the Planning Commission. Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

Commissioner Hege asked why Brad DeHart was not selected as an alternate since he has been applying to the Commission for years. Mr. Roberts responded that that decision was especially challenging.

{{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve Order #13-009 appointing Andrew Myers as First Alternate to the Planning Commission.

Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

{{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve Order #13-010 appointing Taner Elliot as Second Alternate to the Planning Commission.

Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

Chair Runyon recessed the session at 10:30 a.m.

The session reconvened at 10:35 a.m.

### Agenda Item - Codes Enforcement Order

Mr. Roberts explained that the order being presented is the result of a success. Complaints were received from numerous neighbors regarding the accumulation of "junk" on someone's property in Tygh Valley. The owner built a shed to house the "junk." All but one neighbor wrote letters to express their satisfaction with the action taken to mitigate the issue. One neighbor filed a complaint based on code that states an accessory structure cannot be larger than three-quarters the size of the main living structure. The owner has a very small, 8-foot wide trailer and the shed built to house "junk" is larger than the trailer. The purpose of the order is not to force the owner to remove the shed, but to notify prospective buyers that the structure is out-of-compliance.

Commissioner Hege stated that the issue will need to be addressed in future LUDO revisions. Mr. Roberts agreed, adding that if LUDO were to be revised, removing that item, then future owners would not be in violation. Instead of asking the owner to tear down the structure, this is just a notice of non-compliance.

Codes Compliance Officer Kate Foster added that the owner has already advised his children, the likely future owners of the property, of the violation. They are aware that, unless codes change, they will be responsible for bringing the property back to code when they take possession of the property. She also pointed out that the two documents presented to the Board for signature are redundant and she will work to condense it to one document for future violations.

{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Hearings Officer Order #13-001. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

Chair Runyon stated that he appreciates that Ms. Foster works with citizens to find solutions that can work for everyone. Commissioner Hege echoed Chair Runyon, adding that he was impressed with the Planning Department's strategic plan as presented at a recent Planning Commission meeting.

### Agenda Item – Washington Surveying & Rating Bureau Fee Waiver Request

GIS Coordinator Tycho Granville came forward to continue the discussion which began at the 12.19.2012 Board Session. Since that time he has contacted community partners to ask for their feedback which is included in the Board Packet. In summary, two partners are not in favor of waiving the fee, one supports the waiver and the fourth did not respond.

{{Chair Runyon moved to reject the request to waive the fee with the County's thanks. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion. Discussion: Commissioner Hege pointed out that this is important to the community; when ratings change, everyone in the community is affected by impact those ratings have on insurance premiums. The County's premium increased by thousands when ratings went up. While he is not in favor of waiving the fee, he would like to promote a more competitive market by encouraging them to operate in our County. Chair Runyon added that communities and districts have recourse to appeal ratings and have them reduced; he is not aware if the local district appealed the last ratings. The motion passed unanimously.}}

### **Open Discussion – Community Outreach Team**

Chair Runyon opened the discussion regarding the upcoming plan for members of the Community Outreach Team to travel to Washington DC in March to meet with members of Congress regarding local issues. Commissioner Hege is a member of that team and has encouraged them to be proactive in working with Oregon State government. He pointed out that Congressman Walden stated at a recent town hall meeting that they are working on a plan to help counties impacted by the loss of forest dollars. Commissioner Hege believes we need to show support for that plan. He also feels it is important to have a voice in economic development and Federal regulations that hinder that process. In addition he hopes to secure money to clean up the armory site being vacated by the Oregon military.

Mr. Stone stated that there is between \$1,200 and \$1,300 dollars available for travel; the trip will cost approximately \$2,500. He believes that the remaining funds can be made available.

### Agenda Item - Wamic Market Grade Resolution

Public Works Director Marty Matherly explained that the call list for projects through a federal program has changed. The requirements have been redefined and in order to receive the funding, the County will need to reapply. He added that he has already filed his intent to reapply; applications are due January 25, 2013. He is seeking Board support for the application through a resolution (included in Board Packet). The resolution will support two applications that will be made for funding.

He went on to explain that the initial funding was supported by work that had already been done by the County. The new application will not recognize that work and requires a 10.27% match which can be materials and labor. The cost of the project has risen from \$1.3 to \$1.5 million.

Chair Runyon asked that if successful, what will the County's match be? Mr. Matherly responded that as the project gets closer, they will have engineering done that will more clearly identify match.

{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve Resolution 13-001Supporting the Wasco County Public Works Department Wamic Market Grade Reconstruction Grant Project. Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}

Chair Runyon asked for a status report on the Roads Advisory Committee. Mr. Matherly announced that he had emailed to Board members a roster of eight volunteers who are interested in working on the newly formed Roads Advisory Committee: Sherry Holliday, Chuck Covert, Paul Keuhnl, Dennis James, Phil Kaser, John Fulton, Dave Cooper, and Keith Mobley. It is also possible that Stacey Cooper would like to serve alongside her father on the committee. He plans to accept all applicants with a first meeting set for January 22<sup>nd</sup> at 3:00 p.m. at the PUD. Chair Runyon encouraged Mr. Matherly to publicly notice at least the first few meetings in case any members of the public were interested in the process or perhaps might be candidates as future additions to the team.

### Agenda Item – Road Vacation Hearing Order

Mr. Matherly explained that not all impacted residents have signed the petition and therefore a hearing is required to allow for comment before a decision can be made. The Fire and Water Districts have not yet responded with an opinion on the proposed vacation.

{{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve Order #13-004 calling for a hearing in the matter of the proposed vacation of a portion of St. Charles Avenue, a public road located in Wasco County. Commissioner Hege seconded the motion noting that "property" is misspelled on page two and should be corrected. With that correction the motion passed unanimously.}}}

### **Commission Call**

Mr. Stone reported that the County would be receiving a scholarship to cover Commissioner Kramer's County College tuition. He also disclosed that the department management meeting scheduled for tomorrow would focus on the updating of contract rules.

Chair Runyon reported that Patrick Wilbern, newly hired as Intake Coordinator at the Veterans' Services Office, is working out very well. The current challenge is that in order to be VA certified he will be short 25 hours. The VA does not recognize the hours he works on work-study and giving him more hours through the County triggers expensive benefits. They are working on a solution; Veterans' Service Officer Russell Jones will report on progress at a future Board session.

Chair Runyon stated he has been taking note of security measures when visiting other counties. He was recently in Klickitat County and noted that staff is behind bullet-proof glass and doors have narrow or non-existent windows for their Sheriff's Department. He went on to say that although currently there are not funds in Court Security to address these issues, he feels it needs to be a priority. He feels that a first step might be to replace the door with a solid metal door. Mr. Stone agreed, adding that the concern is really Courthouse- wide. Chair Runyon followed up by saying that perhaps they can take on the project in pieces, making improvements as funds become available.

### **Agenda Item – Public Health Contracts**

Public Health Business Manager Kathi Hall came forward to review the contracts included in the Board Packet. She explained that local attorneys were contacted before the Board of Health made the decision to contract with BEH for legal services. Commissioner Hege added that this comes out of the transition budget. Mr. Stone pointed out that the engagement letter is with NCPHD which is Wasco County; it is important that the attorneys understand that they are working for both entities.

Commissioner Hege stated for the record that the committee did not go out to local attorneys until he voiced his concern that they had not offered the opportunity to local business. He expressed disappointment that a local attorney was not engaged for this process. While he understands that the District Attorney's recommendations were all for firms outside the region, local attorneys were given less than a week to respond. He added that BEH has been engaged only for the transition process and not as the attorney for Public Health going forward.

Ms. Hall explained that the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment to Agreement #135575 updates program descriptions and adds some new forms but has no financial changes.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment to Oregon Health Authority 2011-2013 Intergovernmental Agreement #135575 for the Financing of Public Health Services. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}

{{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve the Letter of Engagement for BEH Attorneys at Law. Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

Ms. Hall reported that the new nurse practitioner is working out well. She added that LaClinica is planning to change their name to attract a more diversified clientele.

### **Commission Call - Continued**

Chair Runyon opened a discussion regarding the renovation of Room 302 to make it more useful. The room is being is being well-used by not only the Commission but by many other groups in the County including the District Attorney's office, Emergency Food and Shelter and Assessment & Taxation. If the wall is removed, the space will be as large as Court Room 202 which was previously used for Commission meetings. He believes the first step is to get quotes on the project and asked Mr. Stone how to best approach that step. Mr. Stone responded that if that is the Board's direction, Administrative Services can move forward to create a scope of work and obtain quotes without cost or commitment. Bid thresholds are \$5,000 and \$25,000 and Mr. Stone is confident that the work would come in under that amount.

### \*\*\*The consensus of the Board was to direct Mr. Stone to go forward to create a scope of work and obtain quotes.\*\*\*

A brief discussion ensued regarding the Local Public Safety Coordinating Council. Chair Runyon had asked Ms. Rogers to determine if a County Commissioner is supposed to be appointed and if so, does the Commissioner have a vote. Former Commissioner Sherry Holliday was appointed as a Commissioner. Chair Runyon will take her place on that Council.

Commissioner Hege had to leave at 11:54 p.m. to attend another meeting.

Chair Runyon announced that the Cutting Edge Community Symposium would be held in Bend on January 22. He plans to attend and has asked Planning Director John Roberts to attend as well.

Chair Runyon recessed the session at noon for lunch.

The regular session reconvened at 1:31 p.m. and entered into Executive Session pursuant to ORS 1912.660(2)(i) – Performance Evaluation of Public Employee – at 1:33 p.m.

The regular session reconvened at 3:50 p.m.

The Board revisited the issue of the Community Outreach Team trip to Washington DC. Commissioner Hege highlighted the need to notify the Team of

his plans for attending. Chair Runyon stated that although he is not sure we can affect the Schools to Roads issue, he is interested in the possibility of obtaining funds to help raze the armory.

{{Chair Runyon moved that if funding can be found to attend the trip to Washington DC, the County should be represented there. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion. Commissioners Kramer and Hege voted yea; Chair Runyon voted no – motion passed.}}}

Session adjourned at 3:55 p.m.

## WASCO COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR SESSION JANUARY 16, 2013

PRESENT: Rod L. Runyon, Chair of Commission

Scott C. Hege, County Commissioner Steve Kramer, County Commissioner Tyler Stone, County Administrator Kathy White, Executive Assistant

At 9:00 a.m. Chair Runyon opened the Regular Session of the Board of Commissioners with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Stone asked to add the IGA for City Work Crew Compensation Coverage to the Discussion List.

### **Discussion List - Work Crew IGA**

Mr. Stone explained that this contract is to provide workers' compensation coverage for inmates assigned to the Sheriff's work crew by the City of The Dalles. The contract will protect both the County and the inmates.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement between City of The Dalles and Wasco County concerning provision of workers compensation coverage for municipal court defendants participating in work crew program. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}

### **Discussion List – Emergency Notification System MOUs**

Ms. White explained that the MOUs required no action on the part of the Board, but that Emergency Manager Mike Davidson wanted them to be aware of who had signed on to use the system.

Chair Runyon briefly reviewed the MOUs included in the Board Packet.

### **Discussion List – Treasurer's Report**

Chair Runyon briefly reviewed the Treasurer's report included in the Board Packet.

### **Consent Agenda – LPSCC Appointments**

Chair Runyon briefly reviewed the Local Public Safety Coordinating Council appointments.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve the Consent Agenda.

Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

### Open to Departments/Public - CCO & ELC Updates

Youth Services Director Molly Rogers attended a CCO Transformation Conference on January 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>. She found some interesting innovations that might work in Wasco County. For example, "Take-out Doctors" see patients through Skype and in some cases can prescribe over Skype. Another innovation is color coding for patients and teaching them important trigger words that illicit specific response from medical office staff. She announced a listening circle scheduled for January 28<sup>th</sup> at Zion Lutheran Church; Pacific Source will be on site to listen to local providers.

Ms. Rogers reported on the ELC Retreat that was held on Friday and facilitated by a Portland group. They discovered that there are really two layers of discussion: care delivery and administration. They plan to separate the two so each may progress. She added that they may be a possibility for the school district to manage the Hub; Sherman County has also expressed some interest in management.

Commissioner Hege stated that he had had a conversation with Commissioner Smith from Sherman County. Commissioner Smith made a reasonable argument as to how using Sherman County will have some financial advantage. They have resources they are willing to commit. Commissioner Hege believes it is worth a discussion. Ms. Rogers agreed and committed to having that conversation with Mr. Stone and Sherman County.

Ms. Rogers announced there will be a Youth Services meeting with Dick Withnell from the State. MCCOG, CGCC and business leaders will be in attendance to work on solutions for youth in transition – how to make sure kids coming out of the "system" have the skills to compete.

Chair Runyon inquired about the status of the Wasco County Commission on Children and Families. Ms. Rogers responded that the WCCCF is still moving forward. The CCF system is in statute until 12.31.2013 but will not be funded after 6.30.2013. Ms. Rogers believes the County needs to be an early adopter – ready to go in May.

Chair Runyon agreed saying that the WCCCF is a great group and the County does not want to lose that expertise. Ms. Rogers added that the ELC and P-3 can be critical advisers – the WCCCF could bring that to the BOCC or Hub.

### **Discussion List – Uncollectible Personal Property Taxes**

Tax Collector Tim Lynn explained that the owner or the personal property died with no heirs, no land, no bank account – nothing from which to collect.

Chair Runyon stated that the Board would like to see Department Heads or their representatives when they have something on the agenda. Mr. Lynn responded that he could arrange that.

Brief discussion ensued regarding the process for collecting personal property taxes.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Order #13-015 cancelling certain uncollectible personal property taxes. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion. Commissioner Hege noted that the order only mentions taxes; he would like to hear from Mr. Lynn regarding the fees and interest. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.}}

Chair Runyon called a recess at 9:29 a.m. to convene meetings of the Library Service District and the 4-H Extension Service District.

The session was reconvened at 10:01 a.m. at which time Chair Runyon called a recess.

The session reconvened at 10:05 a.m.

### Agenda Item – Special Transportation Funds Advisory Committee Appointments & Funding Proposals

Dan Schwanz, Transportation Network Manager, and Scott Turnoy, MCCOG & MCEDD Project and Mobility Manager, came forward to support their recommendations for appointments and funding proposals. Mr. Schwanz explained that the State requires the Advisory Committee to manage Special Transportation Funds. Babara Pashek has a lot of enthusiasm; Valerie Manning is new to the area and has a good background. Both attended the most recent meeting.

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Order #13-029 appointing Barbara Pashek to the Wasco County Special Transportation Funds Advisory Committee. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve Order #13-030 appointing Valerie Manning to the Wasco County Special Transportation Funds Advisory Committee. Commissioner Kramer seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

Mr. Schwanz stated that funding was complex this year as they have split the funding process. What he is presenting today is an Federal Transit Administration program that supports capital projects. The match rates are good and the program makes good use of local funds. The match funds come entirely from MCCOG which contracts with the County to provide services. Wasco County acts as a pass-through agent; MCCOG provides the service and 10.27% match.

Mr. Stone asked if there are any obligations or requirements if MCCOG doesn't do its work. Mr. Schwanz replied that the MCCOG contract with the County takes on that responsibility and he believes it indemnifies the County.

Mr. Schwanz went on to explain that the second funding proposal is from MCCOG to ODOT. It is a two-year application and provides for maintenance. The third is through MCEDD to ODOT and has to be approved by Wasco County. He has been told that these will be old funds that have gone unused by others in Region 4, but he has not seen a dollar amount. He is going forward with the

assumption that the funding will become available; he does not know how much that will be.

Commissioner Hege asked why both MCCOG and MCEDD are making applications. Mr. Turnoy responded that MCEDD has the ability to work in both Washington and Oregon – MCCOG does not. MCEDD can bring in Klickitat and Skamania Counties; it has been quite successful.

Commissioner Hege asked if this is Oregon funding. Mr. Turnoy replied that MCEDD also applies in Washington State to support the transportation, that money is spent in Washington. The rest of the funding is Oregon and is spent here.

{{Chair Runyon moved to approve FTA Section 5310 Application for Funding – Fiscal Year 2013-2015 for MCEDD. Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}

{{Commissioner Kramer moved to approve FTA Section 5310 Application for Funding – Fiscal Year 2013-2015 for MCCOG. Commissioner Hege seconded the motion which passed unanimously.}}}

{{{Commissioner Hege moved to approve FTA Section 5310 Application for Funding – Fiscal Year 2013-2015 for Wasco County. Chair Runyon seconded the motion. Commissioner Hege asked why there is a discrepancy between what was being applied for and what was needed to cover costs. Mr. Schwanz replied that the difference is the MCCOG match. Commissioner Hege asked how this gets into the Wasco County Budget. Mr. Stone responded that it is deposited into Wasco County and then sent to MCCOG. Commissioner Hege asked if we take administrative costs out. Mr. Stone replied that we do not take them directly out of the STF monies but the City does pay us \$10,000 per year. The motion passed unanimously.}}

### Agenda Item - VSO Report

Veterans' Service Officer Russell Jones and Intake Coordinator Patrick Wilbern came forward to report on their office's activities over the last quarter.

Mr. Stone reminded the Board that Mr. Wilbern has been working at the VSO through a work study program and continues to do so along with his part-time hours with the County.

Mr. Jones explained that the accreditation process requires training hours and a minimum of 1,000 hours of work for the County. Mr. Wilbern's 18.75 hours per week will leave him 25 hours short. Mr. Jones has contacted the VA to see if overtime hours would be counted; he has not yet gotten a reply.

Mr. Jones reviewed his report which is included in the Board Packet. He also reported that the Flag Pole has been installed and was purchased with money raised through donations.

Mr. Jones explained that the national average for processing a VA claim is 282.4 days; in Portland it is 340.7 days. Most of that time is spent in gathering evidence. He pointed out that that is where they can speed up the process.

Chip Wood, a member of the audience, referencing a recent article regarding the rates of suicide among military members, asked if Mr. Jones or his staff received any special training to deal with depressed/suicidal veterans. Mr. Jones replied that they do not, but noted that the have had one call from a suicidal veteran and were able to get that veteran into a care facility.

Chair Runyon asked about the progress of digitizing veterans' files. Mr. Jones responded that in December the VA is going paperless. Eventually local VSO's will be able to access the system and they already have an electronic signature pad. He said they are trying to scan the thousands of files and are making them searchable. Some files are over 600 pages and it is time consuming to search them by hand; searchable electronic files will greatly aid in that process.

### **Agenda Item – Emergency Declaration Ordinance Proposal**

Emergency Manager Mike Davidson came forward requesting the Board's opinion as to whether or not to proceed toward the adoption of the proposed ordinance.

\*\*\*The consensus of the Board was that Mr. Davidson should go forward with the adoption process.\*\*\*

Mr. Davidson explained that the ordinance would give authority to non-elected officials – the Emergency Manager, Administrative Officer and Chief Deputy. That vests the authority in people who understand the issues of an emergency.

Chair Runyon pointed out that Section 6A states that it only applies if members of the Board are not available. He went on to say that he would want one or all of the listed officials by his side when having to make decisions about how to respond to an emergency.

Commissioner Hege asked Mr. Davidson to explain the difference between this and the 2006 Response to Emergency and Disaster Conditions Policy included in the Board Packet. Mr. Davidson replied that when he came on board there was nothing in place. The 2006 document is simply a policy statement rather than an instructional document.

Commissioner Hege asked what kind of emergency might we experience that would not escalate to the State level. Mr. Davidson responded that a localized flash flood might qualify; he said there have been no localized emergencies during his tenure. Were we to experience one, this ordinance would consolidate many pieces that we already have in place.

Mr. Stone said that the ordinance looks good and Mike can work with Ms. White to schedule public hearings.

Commissioner Hege asked if the City Fire Department will be involved. Mr. Davidson stated he is notifying County agencies since it is a County Ordinance, but was not involving them in the process. Chair Runyon interjected that it would probably be useful to at least have them review it and provide feedback. Mr. Davidson said that he would pursue that.

Chair Runyon adjourned the session at 11:02 a.m.

**Summary:** 

- The Planning Department received a complaint in the summer of 2004 about the construction of a home without permits on property owned by Thomas Teven at 7655 Skyline Road. The owner had applied for building permits, but was denied by the Department, because the land use was and is not permitted on property in this zoning district (F-2 (80)).
- The Department sent letters in 2004 and 2005 prior to the establishment of the compliance program as it is today, without resolution. In 2009, Keith Cleveland resumed the compliance process and Mr. Teven appealed the "Order to Correct" notice and was heard by the Hearings Officers in December of 2010. The Hearings Officers affirmed the violation as valid as stated in the notices.
- An agreement between the County and Mr. Teven was approved by the BoC allowing him to remain in the home under certain conditions, provided it remained his residence for at least 9 months out of the year and he remains the property owner.
- Keith sent out the "Notice of Failure to Comply/Administrative Civil Penalties" notice on May 4, 2011 and the Hearings Officers affirmed the penalty amount of \$2,000 per day up to \$34,310 which results in a property lien if the violation remains unresolved. The violation remains unresolved so we now ask the Hearings Officers to place the property lien that was previously approved.

**Staff Recommendation:** Approve and sign the Hearing's Officer Order authorizing the placement of a property lien in the amount of \$34,310 and the accompanying Recorded Property Lien document.

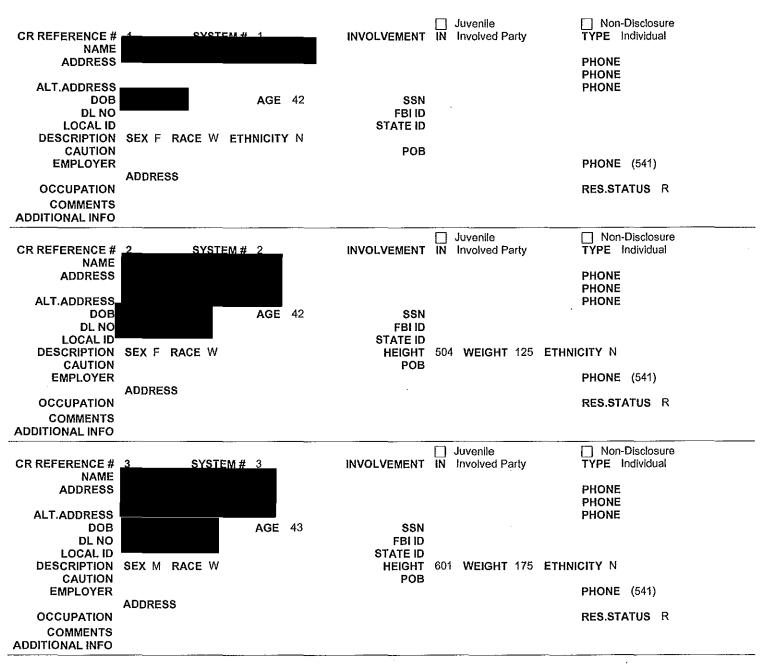

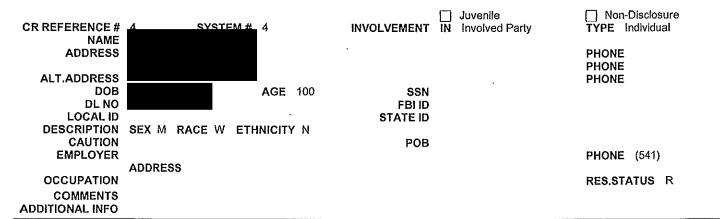

On 01/28/12, I was told by Central Dispatch that they received a call that Jeffery Mills had gone snow shoeing at Frog Lake and had not returned home. Mills had left his home in Tualatin at about 8:30 am and was going to Frog Lake. It was reported that he may be hiking on the Twin lakes loop and/or 9 mile loop. Mills was supposed to have returned home before dark near 5 pm. Phone calls were made to Mills with no response. Texts were also attempted with no response.

Oregon State Trooper Sgt Larson had located Mills 2000 Nissan Extera at the Frog Lake trail head and Mills was not with it. Larson stayed with the vehicle and spoke with snowmobilers who had been in the area. He reported no one had seen him.

We did an exigent circumstances form for Verizon (his carrier) and they indicated Mills hadn't used his phone since about 9am. They could not give a location of his phone only the tower it had hit off of. This tower was reported to have a 20 mile range.

I activated Search and Rescue (SAR). Prior to arriving at the vehicle to start the search Larson reported he had located Mills. Mills had taken the wrong turn on a trail and had since made it to a main road and caught a ride back to his vehicle. SAR units were told to stand down. Mills family was notified.

Action Recommended: Nothing further case closed, fwd to SAR, USFS LEO

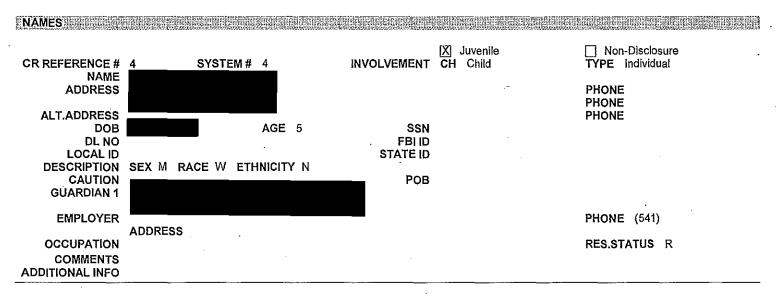

On Sunday, 01/06/13, I was called to respond with Search and Rescue to the Skyline Snow Park off Hwy 26. It was reported from Matt Tool that he and 6 other people to include 3 children were snowmobiling in the area of Frog Lake Buttes when Mickey Thompson had wrecked his snowmobile and had an apparent broken leg. Tool had gotten in contact with a family member who had gone to the area on a snowmobile and located the subjects. We were given GPS coordinates for the 911 call at 045.214480 -121.656353. I google earthed these coordinates, see attached. This placed them on Frog Lake Butte just south of Green Lake. These images were consistent with what we were told.

While en route to the call we were told to meet a snowmobiler at Frog Lake Snow park and he would lead us to the stranded snowmobilers. Hood River County assisted with a snow cat and an ATV with tracks. AMR Medics were on scene when we arrived. Incident Command was set up at Frog Lake Snow Park. WSCO SAR responded with 4 snowmobiles as well. The subjects were located at about 1900 hrs. It took several hours to get them back to the trail as they were down an incline slope that was not accessible by ATV's or snowmobiles. Thompson was taken back to Incident Command and transported by AMR to Emanuel Hospital due to having a broken leg. Tool told me that they were just riding snowmobiles when he turned around and Thompson was on the ground with a broken leg.

This Agreement is entered into, effective as of the date of the later signature indicated below (the "Effective Date"), by and between the National Association of County and City Health Officials ("NACCHO"), with its principal place of business at 1100 17<sup>th</sup> St., N.W., 7<sup>th</sup> Floor, Washington, DC 20036, and County of Wasco ("Organization"), with its principal place of business at 419 East 7th Street, The Dalles, Oregon 97058

WHEREAS, NACCHO has received a grant from the Department of Health and Human Services (Grant Number: 5MRCSG101005-03, CFDA Number: 93.008) (the "Grant") to build the capacity of local Medical Reserve Corps ("MRC") units;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the Grant, NACCHO has agreed, among other things, to provide support to MRC units and to encourage these units to provide certain information to the Office of the Surgeon General's Division of the Civilian Volunteer Medical Reserve Corps ("OSG/DCVMRC");

WHEREAS, Organization either houses or is itself an MRC unit that is registered in good standing with the OSG/DCVMRC;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the Grant, NACCHO desires to provide funding to Organization in exchange for Organization agreeing, among other things, to undertake the activities indicated in their capacity building application or oversee such activities and to provide certain information to the OSG/DCVMRC.

The arbitration award shall be final and binding upon the parties and judgment may be entered in any court of competent jurisdiction.

RE: Guidance on Emergency Declarations

Oregon Emergency Management (OEM) is providing the guidance in this booklet in order to assist and expedite the emergency and disaster declaration process. We have included descriptions of the types of information necessary for the Governor when considering a request for a state of emergency declaration or a request for federal assistance. You will also find legal references that authorize response to requests for disaster assistance.

County and city governing bodies should clearly identify who is authorized to declare a local emergency. It is recommended that each jurisdiction prepare a local draft "declaration of emergency" that need only be supplemented with essential information on actual impacts should a disaster occur. Appropriate documentation of the initial and projected impacts of an event are required in order to support a request to the Governor for state or federal assistance.

Local Emergency Program Managers and Coordinators are provided extensive training and are generally familiar with the appropriate processes to be followed. They also have access to OEM policy-level staff for questions you may have about the process.

A basic *County Request for State Assistance* document is included as Appendix A of this booklet to serve as a model for the format and information to include in a declaration request to the Governor.

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## INTRODUCTION

Important questions include:

- What does a declaration do?
- What is the benefit to community leaders in declaring a local emergency?
- What kind of a declaration should be made?
- What should be requested of the Governor?

The answers to these questions depend on a number of factors, such as:

- Scope and magnitude of the event:
- Impact of damage and losses;
- Ability of local jurisdictions to respond:
- Economic health of the area affected:
- Current status of the local government budget:
- Timeframe before the next budget cycle;
- Outlook for known threats to the community until the new budget cycle begins; and
- Number and magnitude of emergencies the jurisdiction has already experienced since the beginning of the last budget period.

### TYPES OF DECLARATIONS

#### **Local Declarations**

Based on local ordinances and state statutes, a local declaration can allow a city or county governing body flexibility in managing resources under emergency conditions such as:

- Diverting funds and resources appropriated for other purposes in order to meet immediate needs.
- Authorizing activation of local emergency operations plans and implementation of extraordinary protective measures.
- Initiating mutual aid and cooperative assistance agreements, and receiving resources from other organizations or individuals.
- Providing specific legal protection for actions initiated under emergency conditions.
- Setting the stage for requesting state and/or federal assistance to augment local resources and capabilities.
- Raising public awareness and encouraging the community to become involved in protecting their resources.

The declaration of a local emergency can be the first step in requesting state resources from the Governor. Local requests for state assistance must include:

- The type of emergency or disaster;
- The location(s) affected;
- Deaths, injuries, population still at risk;
- The current emergency conditions or threat;
- An initial estimate of the damage and impacts;
- Specific information about the assistance being requested; and
- Actions taken and resources committed by local governments (city and county).

OEM will assist local officials in developing and reviewing declarations and requests that would provide appropriate essential assistance in a timely manner.

#### State Declarations

## State of Emergency

The Governor can declare a state of emergency under authority granted in Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) Chapter 401. Under a "declaration," the Governor has complete authority over all state agencies and has the right to exercise, within the area designated in the proclamation, all police powers vested in the state by the *Oregon Constitution*.

Under extreme circumstances, a Governor's declaration provides authority for the Governor to suspend provisions of any order or rule of any state agency if the Governor determines and declares that strict compliance with the provisions of the order or rule would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay mitigation of the effects of the emergency.

It also provides for the authority to direct state agencies to utilize and employ state personnel, equipment, and facilities for activities designated to prevent or alleviate actual or threatened damage due to the emergency. This includes the National Guard. It specifies that the Governor may direct the agencies to provide supplemental services and equipment to local governments to restore any services in order to provide for the health and safety of citizens of the affected area.

A state of emergency is usually enacted by a Governor's Executive Order, which establishes directions to, and expectations of state agencies to use available resources to assist local communities and alleviate disaster conditions.

## **Conflagration Act**

The Office of State Fire Marshal assists and supports Oregon fire services during major emergency operations through the Conflagration Act (ORS 476.510), which can be invoked only by the Governor. The act allows the State Fire Marshal to mobilize firefighters and equipment from around the state and provides for the funding of resources through state funds. It is used only for fires that involve or threaten life and structures.

To determine if the Conflagration Act should be invoked, the local fire chief and county fire defense chief assess incident status with the following questions in mind:

- Are there structure fires not controlled due to sheer size and/or speed of the fire?
- Is a wildland fire threatening structures?
- Have all local and mutual aid resources been depleted?
- Would mobile support resources be effective?

If the answers are yes, then the county fire defense chief notifies the State Fire Marshal through the Oregon Emergency Response System. The State Fire Marshal discusses the situation with the county fire defense chief, and then decides if the situation warrants implementation of the Conflagration Act. Once decided, the State Fire Marshal notifies the Governor, who authorizes the act to be invoked.

#### **Federal Declarations**

#### Presidential Declarations

Probably the most familiar, but not the most common disaster assistance programs are those provided under a Presidential declaration of "emergency" or "major disaster" via the Robert T. Stafford Emergency Relief and Disaster Assistance Act, P.L. 93-288, as amended. These Presidential declarations can provide funding and/or technical assistance from numerous federal agencies under the coordination of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

The Stafford Act provides resources to assist states in expediting aid, assistance, and emergency services, and reconstructing and rehabilitating devastated areas.

The process for implementing federal emergency response under the Stafford Act is outlined in the *National Response Framework*. Legal details for implementing the provisions of the Stafford Act are contained in the *Code of Federal Regulations*, *Title 44*.

Some Stafford Act disaster assistance programs have a cost-share, often 75% federal and 25% non-federal.

## U.S. Secretary of Agriculture

The Farm Service Agency (FSA) uses the terms natural disaster determination, designation, or declaration almost interchangeably. A request for the Secretary of Agriculture to declare a disaster for a natural hazard event is a fairly simple process.

At the request of county officials, the Governor asks the Secretary to make a natural disaster determination, usually following these steps:

- If it has not already occurred, Oregon Department Agriculture (ODA) asks the FSA to convene the County Emergency Board (CEB), which is a county organization comprised of state and federal agricultural agencies and local producers.
- The CEB convenes and produces a *Flash Situation Report*, which is the first assessment of damage and impacts caused by a natural disaster on the agricultural sector of the economy.
- The FSA State Emergency Board (SEB), which is equivalent to the CEB at the state level, reviews and analyzes one or more county *Flash Situation Reports* and notifies the Governor and ODA of its findings.
- If the findings appear to be favorable to requesting federal assistance, the Governor must within 90 days of occurrence, in writing, notify the Secretary of Agriculture that a natural disaster has occurred and request a "determination" for the event in one or more counties.
- The FSA, through the SEB, then has one or more CEBs develop a *Damage*Assessment Report as a means of better demonstrating the total disaster impact on agriculture in one or more counties.
- The U.S. Secretary of Agriculture reviews the *Damage Assessment Report* and makes a determination regarding which FSA disaster programs to activate in the affected counties. The Governor, ODA, SEB, and CEBs are all notified of the decision.

This process will take several weeks to complete and does not require a Presidential declaration.

Some FSA programs can be made available *without* a determination by the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture. For example, the FSA Administrator may make emergency loans available to farmers with qualifying physical (not production) losses without an action by county or state government.

The following programs can also be activated by the FSA without a disaster declaration:

- Noninsured Assistance Program
- Emergency Conservation Program
- Emergency Haying and Grazing Assistance

The FSA has local offices throughout the state, usually co-located with the Oregon State University (OSU) Extension Service, and often with the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and/or the local soil and water conservation district office. Encourage your Local Emergency Program Manager to develop a relationship with the local office of the FSA, NRCS, and OSU Extension.

## U.S. Small Business Administration

Small Business Administration (SBA) disaster loans can be made available to homeowners, renters, and businesses by means of a declaration by the SBA Administrator or the President. These low-interest loans are made to help disaster-affected persons and businesses recover. The interest rate varies depending on the availability of loans and other economic factors. Types of loans available are:

- Physical Disaster Loans homeowners, renters, and businesses
- Economic Injury Disaster Loans small businesses only

These loans are not automatic; they require data gathering by the local jurisdiction to support the request:

- Criteria for a physical disaster declaration are that in any county, a combination of at least 25 homes and businesses have each sustained uninsured losses of 40% or more of their pre-disaster fair market value;
- Criteria for an economic injury declaration are that at least five small businesses in the state have suffered substantial economic injury due to a sudden physical event, and there is not reasonable financial assistance available in the area.

SBA loans may also involve restructuring debt load at a lower interest rate. To be approved for an SBA loan, applicants must show the ability to repay the loan. More information on Small Business Administration disaster programs may be found via:

# U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE)

USACE can assist state and local governments without a Presidential declaration to accomplish mitigation, response, and recovery, especially for the flood hazard. With the exception of the rehabilitation program, any other request from local officials for USACE assistance should be made through the OEM Director to the Governor. OEM will work with appropriate USACE officials and advise the Governor on how to proceed with the request.

Most assistance requires a written request from the Governor. USACE resources noted here are supplemental to local and state resources. For Indian tribal lands, the Bureau of Indian Affairs will normally submit the request for assistance.

Assistance to individual homeowners and businesses, including agricultural businesses, is not authorized. Also, USACE has no authority to reimburse local governments for the costs of local emergency response and recovery actions.

The authority for the USACE "emergency operations" resources described as follows is granted via Public Law 84-99, as amended. These resources are directed at flood and coastal storm response such as:

- Temporarily raising the elevation of existing levees with sandbags or by other means:
- Strengthening and providing emergency repairs to levees and other flood control projects:
- Evacuating people and assisting in search and rescue operations:
- Providing materials and equipment, such as sandbags<sup>1</sup>, plastic sheeting, lumber, rock, and pumps, if USACE is actively participating in a flood fight<sup>2</sup>;
- Providing twenty-four hour technical assistance during the event; and
- Loaning equipment or emergency contracting of equipment.

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<sup>1</sup> Sandbags are only available to communities which have made a good faith effort to stock a supply prior to a flood, and only after mutual aid and/or state resources have been engaged.

<sup>2</sup> If USACE is not actively participating in a flood fight, federal supplies may be furnished only if local resources are exhausted or will be exhausted; under such circumstances, supplies must be replaced in-kind or paid by local interests. All unused stock should be returned or reimbursed to the federal government at replacement cost.

Under post-flood response, also known as "Ten Day Authority," USACE can assist in:

- Removing logs, debris, and ice jams from drainage channels, bridge openings, water supply intakes, and sewer outfalls;
- Removing debris as necessary to reopen vital transportation routes;
- Assisting in the temporary restoration of critical public services or facilities:
- Providing emergency water-this is limited to 30 days or up to the date of the Presidential declaration, whichever comes first:
- Providing technical assistance; and
- Assisting in identifying hazard mitigation opportunities.

"Ten Day Authority" requires a Governor's request to both USACE and to FEMA. The ten days begin with the Governor's request to FEMA for a joint Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) and ends after ten days or with receipt of a Presidential major disaster or emergency declaration, whichever comes first. Once the declaration has been made, USACE resources can continue to assist, but a non-federal cost-share begins, usually at a rate of 25%.

## Rehabilitation Program

This program is an exception in that local governments such as diking and drainage districts have a direct relationship with USACE. This program assists local governments to repair flood control structures damaged or destroyed by wind, wave, or water action to their pre-disaster condition if:

- The structure has a public sponsor;
- Has been properly maintained by the sponsor; and
- The proposed rehabilitation is cost-effective.

USACE can provide 100% federal funding if the water control structure, usually a levee, was built by USACE, and has since been properly maintained. It is an 80% federal and 20% non-federal cost-share if the levee or other structure meets USACE standards, but was locally built. The sponsor has 30 days to request rehabilitation assistance following a flood or coastal storm.

#### **Advanced Measures**

Under this program USACE can conduct preventative work prior to predicted unusual flooding. This may have applications for ice jam removal, snowmelt flooding, unusual flooding on the lower reaches of larger watersheds, etc. There must be an imminent threat to life or improved property. There must also be a reasonable assurance that the work can be completed in time to prevent or reduce damages, and the proposed work must be both technically feasible and cost-effective.

Types of assistance can include:

- Strengthening of federal and non-federal flood control structures;
- Construction of temporary levees to protect life and improved property;
- Channel clearance and/or dredging of federal projects to restore original design capacity; and
- Relieving the threat of flooding from possible dam failures by de-watering the impoundment, controlled breaching, or strengthening the structure.

Costs associated with removing a measure, or upgrading it to a permanent facility are generally borne by the local or state government sponsor.

Conditions of USACE Assistance

In many circumstances USACE assistance requires that the public sponsor agree to conditions similar to the following:

- Provide without cost to the United States all lands, easements, and rights-of-way necessary;
- Hold and save the United States free from damages due to the authorized work, exclusive of damages due to the fault or negligence of the Unites States or its contractor; and
- If feasible, operate and maintain the emergency work or remove temporary work constructed by USACE or its contractor.

## Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)

The FHWA Program called Emergency Relief (ER) helps pay for the repair of roads and bridges on federal aid highways and on non-federal aid roads on federal lands, which have been damaged by a natural disaster or catastrophic failure. Assistance through the ER Program can be rendered with or without a Presidential major disaster declaration. Authority for providing ER to states can be found at Title 23, USC, Section 125.

Highways are eligible for ER funds if:

- The highway is classed a major collector or above;
- The Governor declares a state of emergency in the affected county or counties-occasionally the Governor will make a state of emergency declaration strictly in order to request FHWA Emergency Relief;
- Estimated cost of repairs to FHWA eligible highways statewide due the disaster total at least \$700,000; and
- There is a favorable finding of eligibility by FHWA.

Local government application for Emergency Relief is made through the Highway Division of the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT); it assists local road departments and public works agencies with application, preparation of necessary documentation, and in establishing funding and reimbursement mechanisms.

One important early step in a local government request for ER is the damage survey conducted by local public works, ODOT, and FHWA staff. This usually involves onthe-ground visits to damaged areas.

## PROCESS FOR REQUESTING ASSISTANCE

These guidelines are provided in accordance with provisions in ORS Chapter 401. They are intended as guidance related to situations that occur in local jurisdictions which require state or federal assistance.

Governor's state of emergency declarations are made at the request of a *county* governing body after determining that an emergency has occurred or is imminent. Cities must submit requests for assistance through the governing body of the county in which the majority of the city's property is located with the expectation that the county will first try to assist the city before asking the state for assistance.

Each event that is likely to result in a request for state or federal assistance must be evaluated to determine the nature and magnitude of the losses that have occurred or are imminent and to identify what local and state resources have been expended or applied to alleviate disaster conditions.

If it appears that state or federal assistance may be needed to augment local resources, it is essential that the jurisdiction conduct a quick but accurate Initial Damage Assessment.

The Local Emergency Program Manager or their designee coordinates this effort with OEM. It is recognized that circumstances may preclude the inclusion of all of the information listed below. However, an effort should be made to include as much as possible prior to requesting a Governor's declaration.

- Specify the area(s) of impact and describe the emergency situation as it exists within the impacted area(s).
- Describe the severity of the situation and the effect on lives, public health and safety, and property. Particular attention should be paid to special populations such as elderly or handicapped, that may be less able to manage on their own.
- Identify and evaluate the severity and magnitude of impacts that have or are expected to occur in the following areas:
  - Public safety and emergency services, such as firefighting, law enforcement, hazardous materials response, emergency medical services and hospitals
  - Communication resources
  - Health and mental health services

- Public infrastructure, including debris clearance, emergency response costs, transportation systems, dams and levees, public buildings and equipment, and public utilities such as water, sewer, electricity, etc.
- Vital community businesses and private nonprofit organizations which provide essential services to the general public
- Housing
- Agriculture
- ► To the extent possible, provide supporting documentation of damage, losses, costs, and impacts.
- Identify the efforts local jurisdictions have taken to resolve the situation:
  - ► Has the local jurisdiction's governing body declared an emergency and implemented their emergency operations plan?
  - Has the local jurisdiction's emergency operations center been activated?
  - ► Has the local jurisdiction committed all available local resources to alleviate the emergency, such as mutual aid/cooperative assistance agreements?
- Describe in as much specificity as possible disaster related unmet needs:
  - What local government resources or assets have been expended, resulting in shortfalls?
  - What situations exist that require assistance from state or federal resources?

Once the local jurisdiction has conducted an Initial Damage Assessment (IDA) and a request for federal assistance is anticipated, the Director of Oregon Emergency Management may request the FEMA regional office to conduct a joint Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA). This involves a team of local, state, and federal personnel jointly validating the local IDA. Such an assessment will assist the Governor in determining whether federal assistance is necessary, and it could serve to support a request for a Presidential emergency or major disaster declaration.

The request and supporting information from local officials must be submitted to the Governor through the Director of Oregon Emergency Management as prescribed under ORS 401.055. If it is determined that local and state resources are insufficient to meet the needs of the area impacted, the Governor may submit a request to the President through the FEMA Regional Director or directly to a federal agency for assistance.

# PRESIDENTIAL DECLARATION EVALUATION FACTORS

For all requests under the Stafford Act, FEMA will evaluate the severity, magnitude, and impact of the event, and will evaluate whether the impact appears to exceed state and local capabilities, and whether there are federal resources which may be appropriate to address severe, disaster related needs.

Some agencies may provide specific resources without the need for a Presidential declaration through existing emergency authorities. Considering all factors, FEMA will make a recommendation to the President.

## Federal evaluation will focus on the following factors:

# Threat to Life, Health, or Safety

If there are significant threats to the lives, health, or safety of individuals that cannot be met with state, local, and /or voluntary organization resources, federal assistance may be warranted. For example, if critical facilities are affected such as water treatment or distribution, federal assistance might be necessary if state and local government cannot meet the emergency needs.

# Special Populations and Considerations

Attention will be paid to special populations, such as the elderly or disabled, that might be more likely to face threats to life, health, and safety.

#### **Critical Facilities**

If critical facilities, such as hospitals, fire and police stations, water or sewage treatment facilities, etc. are seriously affected, and state and local government cannot adequately correct the problem or address the impacts, federal assistance may be warranted.

### Large Scale Disruptions of Normal Community Functions and Services

If disruptions of normal community functions and services occur that threaten the well being of an economic base of the community, and cannot be corrected with state or local assistance, federal assistance may be warranted.

#### **Technical Assistance**

There may be situations where there are not significant impacts, but states may need technical assistance, such as that provided by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

# APPENDIX B: Disaster Recovery Checklist for Public Officials

# Actions to consider taking before the disaster: Keep a copy of this checklist handy; work on its implementation. Work with your Local Emergency Program Manager (LEPM) to determine which departments and individuals have a disaster recovery role. Then work with your LEPM to develop (or refine an existing) recovery organizational model. This model can be expanded into a recovery plan. At a minimum, the organizational model should include a list of personnel and their roles and responsibilities post-disaster. Some local jurisdictions in Oregon already have a recovery plan; if your jurisdiction does, review it and work with your LEPM to improve it. Impact and damage assessments will be a huge job during and immediately following the disaster; work with your LEPM to designate a person to take the lead on these assessments, and to organize and train the needed teams in advance. Have trained alternates for members of the teams, and for their leader (the impact and damage assessment coordinator). The LEPM may or may not be the best person for the job of coordinating these teams. There are many factors in favor of the LEPM, but those not in favor are the fact that this work may occur while response is still underway, or may occur after days of very little rest for the LEPM and his or her staff. Talk with your legal counsel, LEPM, and others about the extent to which the jurisdiction has ordinances in place which will facilitate recovery. Examples might include ordinances regarding disaster area security such as restricting entry and curfew, debris removal, condemnation, streamlining permit processes to the extent allowed by law, waiving permit fees, etc. Talk with legal counsel, LEPM, public works, and others regarding the extent to which the jurisdiction has codes and standards in place which require that buildings and infrastructure built or repaired post-disaster are built in a more disaster resistant way. FEMA's infrastructure repair program ("Public Assistance") can help fund rebuilding public facilities to a higher standard in some circumstances. Talk with your LEPM and other public safety officials to determine whether additional cooperative

underway, and can last weeks, months, or years. Prepare for the long haul.

assistance agreements (ORS Chapter 401.480) are needed with neighboring jurisdictions. These agreements can provide many resources to assist with recovery, including building officials. These

agreements may also provide well-rested people with needed expertise who can give your exhausted staff an opportunity to get some needed rest. Disaster recovery typically begins while disaster response is still

_	Have your LEPM participate in Oregon Emergency Management's Disaster Response and Recovery Course (DRRC) the next time it is offered (if your LEPM hasn't taken this course recently - he or she may have). Identify and train your key accounting and finance staff in the documentation requirements of disaster recovery programs.
	People will want to return to their damaged buildings after the event. In some cases, for their own safety, they should not be allowed, or should be allowed only under certain conditions. Learn from your lead building official what procedures are in place for restricting access to, and for the post-disaster safety evaluation and posting of buildings.
	Have your building officials take the class "ATC-20" on post-disaster safety evaluation of buildings. ATC is Applied Technology Council. The ATC-20 process includes a well accepted process for "tagging" buildings with the following designations; "inspected" (green tag), "restricted use" (yellow tag), and "unsafe" (red tag)
	Have sufficient copies of the ATC-20 placards (tags) printed and widely distributed throughout the jurisdiction prior to the event; you may not be able to make color copies after the event, and you may not be able to enter the building official's office. Some jurisdictions have building officials store these placards at their homes. See:

	Work with your LEPM and others to develop a strategy for effectively using volunteers post-disaster. Your community will find itself with both organized volunteers (e.g., the American Red Cross and similar organizations) and "emergent" volunteers. Poorly managed, emergent volunteers will be ineffective, probably time-consuming, and possibly a liability. Well managed, they may be an asset in recovery. Have a pre-designated volunteer coordinator, and a plan to screen and assign volunteers who approach local government with offers of assistance following a disaster.
	Likewise, work with your LEPM before the disaster to develop a plan for the management of donated goods, which can become a huge problem rather than a potential asset. Related: if private monetary donations are made to your jurisdiction, do you have a mechanism for accepting them? OEM has written guidance available on development of donated goods plans.
	Engage your land use planners in a discussion about community redevelopment post-disaster. While having a disaster is awful, stressful, damaging, even devastating; disaster recovery oftentimes does provide a community with an opportunity to rebuild in a safer, less hazardous way. (Even better, of course is hazard mitigation planning and implementation prior to the disaster!)

# Actions to consider taking after the disaster:

	If you have not already done so, consider designating a person to coordinate the jurisdiction's recovery.
	Depending on the organization of your jurisdiction, needed skills, training, workload, and other factors, this may or may not be the Local Emergency Program Manager (LEPM). Examples: in Washington County
	following the flood and landslides of February 1996, the recovery manager worked for the Department of
	Land Use and Transportation; in Crook County and Prineville following the May and June 1998 flood, these
	two jurisdictions jointly hired a private sector consultant to manage the recovery for both jurisdictions.
_	Impress upon your managers and staff that they may not be able to go back to doing their "normal" jobs for
	a long time. Sometimes people think that when the "response" is over, the disaster is over. This is
	seldom, if ever true. Prepare your people for the long haul.
	Take care of your staff. Some of your staff or their families may have been directly impacted by the event.
	Some of your staff will try to work too many hours or without proper meals and breaks. Some of your staff
	will eventually face burnout, and possibly physical and/or mental health effects from stress and lack of rest
	or proper nutrition. Counseling can be made available for both disaster victims and disaster workers.
	Make sure your managers and staff take a day or two off every once in a while during disaster recovery.
	Consider establishing regular meetings with your key staff to discuss the day's events and the day ahead.
	Begin documentation and financial record-keeping immediately; have accounting and finance staff involved
	in disaster recovery as soon as possible.
	You may want to establish a recovery committee consisting not only of the involved government agencies,
	but also some representatives of key outside organizations to guide overall policy and recovery decisions.
	It may be helpful to modify or expand an existing structure to provide continuity. If you establish such a
	committee, clearly define its authority and responsibilities, and whom it takes direction from and reports to.
_	Identify a volunteer staging area where people can be screened, trained, and assigned to assistance roles.
	See also the notes on volunteer coordination.
	Assess the kinds of donated goods that are needed and issue a press release describing them; state a
	preference for money and indicate the organizations that can use it. Establish a warehouse for receiving,
	sorting, and disbursing donated goods. Decide how to distribute donated funds and/or goods. Set-up a
	coalition of voluntary organization leaders (or, better yet, tap into an existing one) to decide who is most in
	need and what kinds of needs will be your highest priority. Please also review the notes on donated goods.

	Coordinate the work of your public information officers (PIOs) to avoid conflicting information.
	Consider establishing an information "hotline" regarding office closures, relocations, new hours, and so on. Also keep this information updated on your website.
	Do a series of outreach efforts devoted to a single topic, e.g., insurance, mental health, erosion control, the permitting and rebuilding process, etc. These may be covered in a multimedia way such as local newspapers, community access television, website, etc.
	Via newspapers and your website, publish a list of recovery resource telephone numbers.
	During recovery efforts for which federal resources are being made available (FEMA, SBA, etc.) and in which there are many individuals and families impacted by the event, if you are concerned that other outreach efforts aren't working or won't work, consider asking OEM to work with you to set-up disaster recovery centers (DRC). In addition to the federal agencies providing information at these centers, other organizations involved in recovery can provide information; e.g., voluntary agencies, your departments such as planning/development, building, and health departments, organizations providing crisis counseling or legal assistance, etc.
	Following catastrophic disasters (for example, a large earthquake), some people may assume new roles; for example, property owners with no previous development experience may suddenly try to become developers; or alternatively, a jurisdiction with a regulatory orientation towards development may find itself needing to court and solicit new development.
	The process of recovery may uncover philosophical difference about the "proper roles" of the private and public sectors in rebuilding; development of a common understanding may be needed to move forward.
	Keep in mind that the major recovery decisions hinge on the choice between trying to recreate the jurisdiction as it was, or recognizing the inevitability of change and managing it to create a safer community a disaster resistant community.
_	Be prepared to respond to media requests for updated information prior to important anniversaries; six months, one year, and so on.
