## In Memory of Don Reckmann

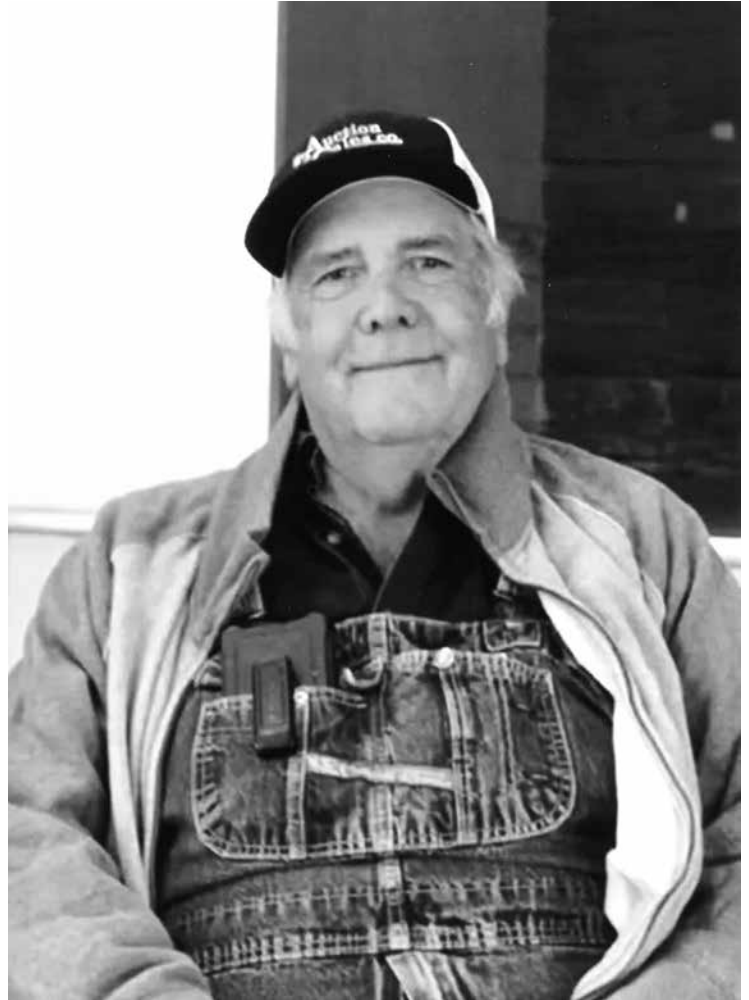
Don Reckmann had a lifelong love for the county fair. His passion began in childhood at the Sherman County Fair, and after moving to Wasco County in 1974, he dedicated himself to supporting youth. He started by assisting younger children in pushing heavy wheelbarrows up the steep ramp to the waiting truck and later took on the responsibility of clearing barn debris from the fairgrounds.

In his younger years, Don actively contributed to the rodeo, helping at the stripping chutes and assisting with slack events after the rodeo. He took pride in teaching two of his nephews how to perform these tasks safely.

Don was a steadfast supporter of his family's activities at the Wasco County Fair. His wife, DeAnna, devoted long hours assisting the Open Class clerk, while his daughters, Katrina and Rachel, participated in 4-H swine showing. His interest in livestock expanded to meat goats when his daughter, Charity, raised Boer goats for her 4-H projects. This passion led to a herd of high-quality Boer goats, which Charity and his granddaughter, Samantha, exhibited at county and state fairs. Meanwhile, his other grandchildren showed goats in Michigan if they were old enough to participate. Don was always there for his nieces and nephews, offering help with transporting animals or stepping in when they needed assistance.

Supporting youth was Don's greatest passion. He was a dedicated spectator at South Wasco School ballgames, always offering encouraging words to young athletes. During Maupin Daze, a beloved community event, he delighted in entertaining the crowd with his Boer goat, "Mustang Sally," who eagerly begged for treats from both young children and senior citizens.

At the Wasco County Fair, Don made every child feel valued. He believed that a high placing was less important than maintaining a positive attitude. He guided 4-H participants in their tasks, ensuring they learned by doing rather than having the work done for them. More than anything, Don loved to engage in conversation, always ready with a kind word and a listening ear. His presence at the Wasco County fair will be greatly missed.

## Wasco County 4-H

4-H is the largest youth development organization in the nation, with over 6 million members and 25 million alumni nationally. Youth who participate in 4-H are four times more likely to contribute to their communities, two times more likely to make healthier lifestyle choices, and two times more likely to be civically active when compared to their peers (Source: Lerner, R. M., et. al. (2005). *4-H Study of Positive Youth Development*).

Wasco County 4-H and the Wasco County Fair board work as *community partners* to provide a quality fair to residents of Wasco County. To participate in 4-H Classes, youth must be an enrolled 4-H member. Open classes are separate from 4-H, and open to all ages. Animals or exhibits that are exhibited in 4-H may not be exhibited in Open Classes, and vice-a-versa.

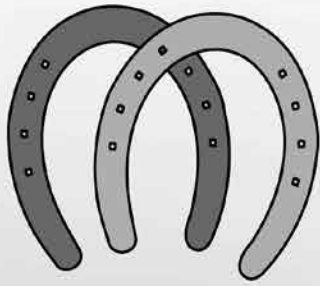

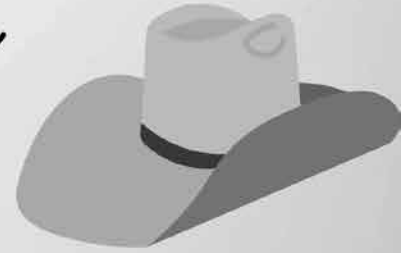

### **WASCO COUNTY FAIRGROUND CAMPING AND RV RULES**

1. Quiet Hours are between 11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
2. Fees for staying in the campground must be paid on arrival. Camping will be in assigned spaces only.
3. All garbage is to be placed in designated containers.
4. No discharging of fireworks or any firearms allowed.
5. No beer kegs allowed.
6. **ONE vehicle** per campsite allowed during the Fair.
7. Outdoor fires will be restricted to portable stoves and BBQ's.
8. All dogs must be leashed on the fairgrounds.
9. Aggressive behavior will not be tolerated. Violators will be asked to leave.
10. Do NOT erect, replace, post or maintain any advertising matter, signs or printed material other than legal notices without prior approval by the Fair Board.
11. Refusal of Service-The Wasco County Fair Board reserves the right to refuse camping privileges to anyone who disobeys the rules or commits acts of vandalism, violence or engages in unlawful activities.
12. Liability-The Wasco County Fair Board and Wasco County will NOT be responsible for articles lost or stolen on the premises. The Wasco County Fair Board and Wasco County are not responsible for accidents, injuries or damages resulting from actions of occupants. Every effort will be made by the campground host and law enforcement to monitor and prevent such occurrences.

## Open Class General Rules

### PRE-ENTRY IS ENCOURAGED

Pre-entry may be made by email (fairoce@co.wasco.or.us) or mailed to Wasco County Fair & Rodeo; 401 E 3rd St., Ste. 200, The Dalles OR 97058. Residents of Wasco County and the Warm Springs Reservation or grandchildren of said residents living outside of Wasco County are eligible to enter exhibits.

The Wasco County Fair will not be liable for any loss or damage to the exhibit(s); however, every reasonable precaution will be taken to ensure its safety. Entry implies acceptance of these rules. The Wasco County Fair Board reserves the final and absolute right to interpret rules and settle all matters, questions and differences.

Open class exhibits will be displayed for public viewing between 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. daily of the fair. Community volunteers will be at the doorways to assist with security. Entries will be accepted on Tuesday of the fair between 1:00 p.m. -6:00 p.m., and on Wednesday of fair between 9:00 a.m. -12:00 p.m. Items are to be picked up from 3:00-5:00 p.m. on Sunday of the fair. Unclaimed items will be held at the fair office. If the exhibitor is unable to pick up exhibit(s), written permission may be granted by:

- 1-Informing the Superintendent upon entering exhibit to be written on back of entry tag.
- 2-Sending written permission authorizing another person to pick up.

Open class premiums will be paid on Sunday of the fair at the clerk's office between 1:00-5:00 p.m. **Exhibitors with 10 or more exhibits are to be entered by 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday of the Fair.**

Exhibits must be created by the exhibitor within the past two years. Each open class department will determine how many entries can be made in each class. Refer to each department page.

Each exhibit must have the name, address, and phone number on the item. **NO GLASS IS ALLOWED IN ANY FRAME.**

When there is only one exhibit in the class, the judge will score on merit, not because of lack of competition. The Judges' decision is final. Sticker placings will be used for all adult exhibitors, but can be submitted to the clerk for actual ribbons. Youth exhibitors will receive ribbons.

If an exhibit does not meet the required criteria, the department superintendent or open class coordinator can choose to have it displayed only with no judging taking place. Every attempt will be made to accept entries.

Any exhibitor interfering with the judge or judging will be disqualified from receiving any premiums. All disputes against the fair must be presented within 10 days of fair closing.

## Open Class Livestock General Rules

**Pre-entry deadline is July 28, 2025**

All livestock exhibits/exhibitors must be residents of Wasco County or Warm Springs Reservation, or grandchildren of said residents living outside the county.

All livestock is shown at the risk of the owner. All animals may be screened by barn superintendent or on sight veterinarian for quality and/or illness which could determine the removal from the fairgrounds. Wasco County Fair has developed a protocol for anyone to report sick animals to the superintendents.

Livestock shall have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 30 days prior to the fair. FFA and 4-H exhibitors cannot at the same time exhibit the same animal or article in open class as in FFA and 4-H. Any exhibitor attempting to show under false or irregular registration papers, or refusing to show the registration papers, will be barred from exhibiting.

Fees are as follows: Cattle, hogs, goats, and sheep \$10.00 per pen. Rabbits and poultry: \$5.00 per species. **Horse stalls:** \$40.00 plus \$25.00 deposit and must be paid in advance by depositing funds at Wasco County Fair & Rodeo, 511 Washington St, #207, The Dalles, OR. Open class livestock requiring daily care will be issued a gate pass and if the exhibitor is a child, 2 passes will be issued. All stalls, pens and aisles must be kept in a clean and safe condition. All manure and waste must be placed in designated receptacles. The Fair Board forbids anyone to take any animal known to have a contagious disease onto the fairgrounds.

Every person who is subject to these rules will exempt and discharge the Wasco County Fair, its agents or employees, from liability for any loss, damage or injury to self or his/her property, whether caused by said management, agents, employees or by any other cause.

Every exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may happen to any person or the property of any person by any animal owned or exhibited by said exhibitor and shall indemnify the Wasco County Fair against all claims for injury occurred by any animal owned or exhibited by them or arising from the acts of negligence of any employee of such exhibitor.

Not adhering to the rules listed may result in forfeiture of premiums and/or awards and could result in dismissal from the fair with a possibility of losing the privilege to show at the following years county fair at the discretion of the Wasco County Fair Board.

Mail or deliver entry form and fees to Wasco County Fair & Rodeo, 401 E 3rd St. Ste 200 The Dalles, OR 97058 Award monies may be picked up at clerk's office the Sunday of Fair between 12:00-5:00 p.m.

**Animals must be in place by 2:00 p.m. but, not before 8:00 a.m., on the Wednesday of fair.**

**No more than 3 open class animals per exhibitor.** There will be health inspections upon arrival at the fairgrounds. All animals may be entered in the same class, but premiums will only be paid for two placings. Individual animals shown in classes may be used in Get-of-Sire or Produce-of-Dam classes.

**Replacement Heifer from a Wasco County Herd**-A heifer produced from a herd in Wasco County and between the ages of 12-24 months of age and has not calved.

Open class market steers will not be sold at the Wasco County Youth Auction.

No animals with horns longer than 12" will be allowed, measured hairline to tip. Please describe the breed of Beef or Dairy animal on the entry sheet.

Dairy will be judged together against their individual breed standards and ribbons awarded to each breed.

All breeds of beef will be judged together against their individual breed standards and ribbons awarded to each breed.

Judging will be Friday following 4-H Showmanship.



- Flower stems should be cut cleanly at an angle with a sharp knife or scissors.
- If the stem grows with foliage attached, the exhibit should retain enough to balance stem and flowers. Plunge the cut flower into a clean container with tepid water. Remove any foliage below the water level. Groom carefully before exhibiting.

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Line muffin tins with 12-14 muffin paper liners
2. In a large mixing bowl beat eggs
3. Gradually add sugar
4. While beating, slowly pour in oil; add vanilla.
5. Combine the next 4 dry ingredients (flour, salt, baking soda and baking powder) in a completely mixed. Don't overmix.
6. Very gently fold in the blueberries
7. Fill 12-14 muffin cups ¾ full
8. Press a few extra blueberries into the top of each muffin.
9. Bake for 18-20 minutes until lightly browned and a toothpick inserted comes clean
10. Cool at least 10 minutes before transferring to wire racks.
11. Store leftovers in an airtight container for up to 3 days. Freeze if desired.

**Adults entry: (Class 2400) Honey Wheat Bread - 1 loaf Honey Wheat Bread**

Servings 2 loaves (8 ½" x 4 ½" pans)

**Ingredients:**

2 ½ teaspoons active dry yeast or instant yeast

3/8 cup lukewarm water (98-105 degrees)

our 1 ½ cup whole wheat flour

1/3 cup uncooked steel cut oats

½ cup instant non-fat milk

2 teaspoons table salt

1/3 cup honey

6 tablespoons butter (cut into very small pieces)

1 ½ cups water (very hot-boiling)

1 egg, (at room temperature) beaten with a fork

4 – 4 ½ cups flour (all-purpose or bread flour)

1 teaspoon melted butter (for loaf top)

**Additional Note:** This recipe is also good for making rolls or hamburger buns.

**Directions:**

1. Put lukewarm water in a small bowl and sprinkle yeast in it; set aside.
2. In a large mixing bowl, combine whole wheat flour, steel cut oats, powdered milk and salt together,
3. Add butter pieces and honey
4. Pour hot water over the mixture
5. Beat on medium speed until all the butter is melted and well mixed.
6. Let mixture cool for 5 minutes until lukewarm.
7. Add beaten egg and yeast mixture, mix well
8. Gradually add in up to 4 cups of flour. At this point, dough should be pulling away from the sides of the bowl to form a shaggy ball.
9. Put dough on a lightly floured board, and add knead in just enough of the remaining flour to make a nice smooth ball of dough.
10. Spray or oil a large bowl with non-stick cooking spray. Roll the dough ball to coat.  
Set aside to rise in a warm place until doubled in bulk-about one hour.
11. Punch down the dough and transfer to a lightly oiled work surface. Divide into two equal parts and shape into two 8-inch loaves; put them into greased or parchment lined 8 ½" x 4 ½" bread pans.
12. Let dough rise 1-2 hours – until it has crowned 1- 1 ½" above the edge of the pan.  
Toward the end of the rising time, preheat oven to 350 degrees.
13. Bake for 30-35 minutes until golden brown. (If a digital thermometer is inserted in the center, it should reach at least 190 degrees).
14. Remove bread from the oven, turn it out of the pan onto a rack to cool. Then brush top with melted butter and cover with a paper towel to keep the top soft.
15. Store the bread well-wrapped at room temperature or freeze for longer storage.
