WHEREAS, Wasco County, Oregon, does not currently have a Social Gaming Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, ORS 167.121 allows Counties to adopt an Ordinance authorizing the playing or conducting of social games in private businesses, private clubs, or in places of public accommodations.

THE COUNTY COURT OF WASCO COUNTY, OREGON, ORDAINS  
AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Ordinance shall be known as the Social Gaming Ordinance.

SECTION 2. AUTHORITY.

ORS 167.121 allows Counties to authorize the playing or conducting of social games, as defined in ORS 167.117, in private businesses, private clubs, or in places of public accommodations.

1 SECTION 3. AUTHORIZATION.

2 Pursuant to ORS 167.121 social games, as defined in ORS 167.117,  
3 are hereby authorized to be played in the unincorporated areas of the County  
4 in private businesses, private clubs, and in places of public accommodations.

5 SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.

6 If any portion of this Ordinance is held invalid by a Court of competent  
7 jurisdiction, such decision shall apply only with respect to the specific portion  
8 held invalid by the decision. It is the intent of Wasco County that the  
9 remaining portions of this Ordinance continue in full force and effect.

10 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.

11 This Ordinance being immediately necessary for the preservation of  
12 the public well being, an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance  
13 shall take effect on August 19, 2009.

14 Regularly passed and adopted by a unanimous vote of the County  
15 Court of the County of Wasco, State of Oregon, this 19th day of August,  
16 2009.
