 WCSD offers a number of courses in which high school students are dually enrolled (in a high school course that is also considered a college credit course) or enrolled directly in a college/university course (e.g., Syracuse University Project Advance)

 These courses afford students the opportunity to engage in challenging coursework that meets their needs and interests and they are able to earn college credit (or have in hand a college transcript) prior to exiting high school

 This opportunity is provided at a fraction of the cost of a college class taken posthigh school

Steps Taken and Continued Efforts

- Collaborate with teachers and administrators to examine data, identify strengths and areas for refinement based on a multitude of information (qualitative and quantitative)
 - Analyze on a granular level (student-specific)
 - Address the needs of all learners and continue to offer a variety of supports (e.g., Response to Intervention)
 - Examine and make needed refinements with regard to structures, programs, and resources to maximize learning
- Use a facilitation model where teachers from across the District learn, share, make decisions/recommendations, and create resources collaboratively
 - Provide opportunities for reflection, curriculum development and refinement, and best practices sharing
- Offer focused and varied professional development and learning opportunities
- Focus on the whole student and prepare each student for life post high school

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
