I have worked in the district for over 20 years. I spent the majority of that time at Transit Middle, which is where I met my husband. He still works at Transit.





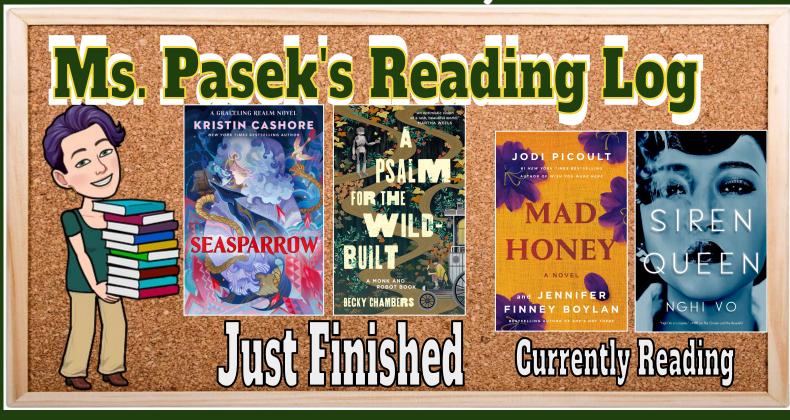

Photography

- Must be a single image (no collages)
- Photo size range: 3"x5" 8"x10"
- Submit as .jpeg, .tiff, .gif, .png file type

Dance Choreography

- Must be the choreography work of 1 student, but can feature multiple dancers
- Must be less than 5 min in length, and not exceed 1 GB in size
- Submit as .avi, .mov, .mp4, .wmv, or .flv file type
- If music accompanies the dance, it must be cited

Film Production

- Must be the production work of 1 student, but may feature others
- Must be less than 5 min in length and not exceed 1 GB in size
- Must be submitted as an .avi, .mov, .mp4, .wmv, or .flv file type.
- If music is featured, it must be cited

Visual Arts

- Maximum size for 2-D is 24" x 30"
- Maximum size for 3-D is 20" x 20" x 24"
- Do NOT sign front
- · Submit as .jpeg, .tiff, .gif, .png file type

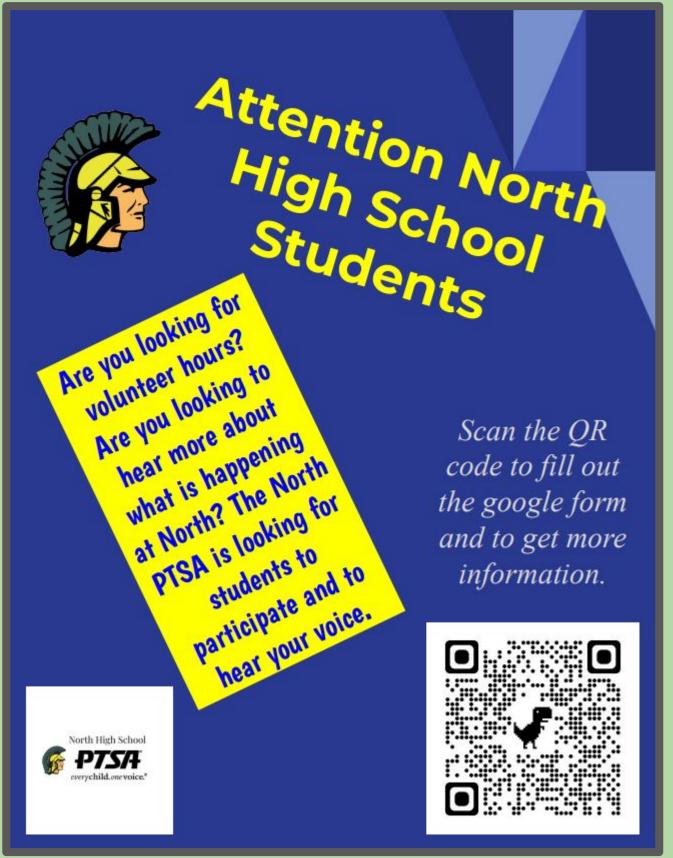

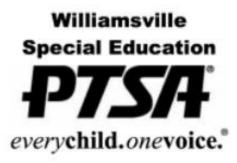

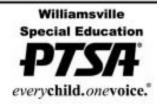
