From the Principal

We have had a great start to the 2019/20 school year! WITS PARENT PORTAL ACCOUNT

All parents and legal guardians are eligible to have their own WITS account. If you have not set up your WITS parent account, you are strongly encouraged to do so at this time.

For those unfamiliar with our WITS system, WITS is a place where you can easily navigate your child's schedule, attendance and grades.

The benefit of a WITS parent portal:

- Secure electronic communication between parents and teachers
- Access to parent specific information
- One log-on used to access all of your children attending school within the District
- Printable report cards and progress reports
- Online parent conference sign-ups
- Additional enhancements as the portal grows

In order to register for a parent account in WITS you will need to obtain an activation code. You can obtain your activation code by calling the Help Desk at 626-8058 between the hours of 9 am and 3 pm. We hope you find this WITS feature beneficial and easy to use.

Any student needing an official transcript sent to a college or for a scholarship must come to the Guidance Office and fill out a Transcript Request form or request it through commonapp.

SENIORS: During the month of October, seniors who are planning to continue their education should do the following:

- Make arrangements to take/retake the SAT I, SAT II or ACT.

NAVIANCE/FAMILY CONNECTION

All students will have access **Naviance/Family Connection** – a comprehensive website that you and your student can use to make plans about colleges, and careers. Family Connection is linked with Naviance, a service that we use in our office to track and analyze data about college and career plans, so it provides up-to-date information that's specific to our school.

Family Connection allows your student to:

- **Get involved in the planning and advising process** – Build a resume, complete online surveys, and manage timelines and deadlines for making decisions about colleges and careers
- **Research colleges** – Compare GPA, standardized test scores, and other statistics to actual historical data from our school for students who have applied and been admitted in the past
- **Research careers** – Research hundreds of careers and career clusters, and take career assessments
- **Create plans for the future** – Create goals and to-dos, and complete tasks assigned by the school to better prepare your student for future college and career goals.

Family Connection also lets us share information with you and your student about upcoming college visits and events, local scholarship opportunities, and other resources for college and career information.

When you visit the site for the first time, you will need a unique registration code that will link you to your child and their account. To receive this access code please email Phil Miller at pmiller@williamsvillek12.org from the email address that you want linked to Naviance.

Note: You and your student have separate accounts that will be linked. Once you have your own account, you will sign in using the username and password you chose during the registration process. The students already have access with predetermined logins and passwords. The **student username** is their WITS id (first initial, middle initial and last 5 letters of your last name) and **student password** is their birth date (2 digits for month, day and year - no spaces) and the last 4 of their student number:

Now that we are settled into a new school year, I'd like to feature health related information on current issues in adolescent health each month. If you have any specific concerns, please contact me at 626-8525 during the school day.

ASTHMA FACTS

According to the American Lung Association, your child's **asthma is out of control if:**

1. He/She uses their short acting inhaler (i.e. albuterol) more than **twice a week.**
2. He/She refills their short acting inhaler more than **twice a year.**
3. He/She wakes up **twice a month** with asthma symptoms.

If your child experiences any of the above, you should talk to your health care provider. They may want to consider adding to or changing your current medication regimen. If your child carries an inhaler in school, including sports teams, be sure to have the necessary paperwork on file with the nurse.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG ABUSE

Prescription and over-the-counter drugs are fast becoming the new "party" drug for many teenagers. Parents must be diligent as one in five teens have used powerful narcotic pain relievers to get high. Talk to your children about the dangers of using prescription and OTC medications to get high. Keep your medications out of reach and sight. Dispose of old prescriptions properly. Monitor pill quantities if necessary. Let's all do our part to keep our children safe.

FLU SEASON

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends the flu shot for all children up to 18 years of age every year. It is especially important if you have a history of asthma or other chronic illness. Please check with your health care provider today and have your child immunized against the Flu.

Finally, please remember that if your child is sick they should NOT be texting you that they want to go home! If they are ill they should report to the Health Office. If they make prior arrangements to go home without seeing the nurse they will NOT be given a pass to go home from the health office

WINTER SPORTS VERIFICATION

Winter sports verification will start Tuesday October 18, 2019. Please have the blue sports booklet and "green sheet" filled out for your child's sport. Forms are available in the Athletic Office and are not available to download. You must go on WITS and select your child's sport, make sure their physical is dated 11/01/2018 or after and all medication self-carry orders are up to date.
