Update – DPW Ruetten –

- Slow Park Operations due to Winter
- The returning seasonal letters have been sent out for lifeguards and laborers with several already filling out applications.
- The YMCA Rec baseball signup is linked to the Village website if anyone has asked.

Old Business

Park CIP Long term planning – DPW reviewed and is looking for input either electronic or paper, he will compile all the information from the committee.

- Discussion DPW added that the CORP plan does have priorities and suggestions from resident surveys about the parks and facilities in the plan if members wanted to review.
- Recommendation None at this time

Boating Slow No Wake Concerns/Signs - DPW reviewed price proposals and discussed locations for signs. DOT will not allow signage on the bridge.

- Discussion On location of signs and how to get the message out there
 - o Winnebago County Sheriff is likely to implement a no wake ban, similar to last year, due to higher than normal water this year already. These signs were out at the launches and sport shops and it was not effective.
 - O Committee feels that a news article may be effective before the boating season.
- Recommendation Motion by Foster and Seconded by Stanek to purchase and install Slow No Wake signs as presented. Carried by voice vote 4-0.

- Discussion There was two questions that arose from the Village Board after the discussion on the Pins. First would the fishing daily and seasonal pass apply to all Parks or just the fishing piers? Second what would the Pin include besides fishing to attract non-fishermen to purchase the pins, ultimately increasing the number of pins sold.
 - The Seasonal Park Pin would be a benefit for all Parks with the donations being restricted to Parks for maintenance. Therefore, will the fishing daily and seasonal pass apply to all Village facilities.
 - What other amenities would be included for the Seasonal Park Pass?
 - DPW commented that the Board thought seasonal discounts on shelter rental, pool pass, or launch. This might increase sales.
 - Discussion from Committee thought discounts could hurt current Pool revenue.
 - Discussion on Seasonal Launch pass at \$30 which would include pin, this would get revenue from the fishermen in boats.
 - Discussion about contacting the Chamber to see if they wanted to include benefits or options with the pin.
- Recommendation Table the discussion on Seasonal Park Pass Pin inclusions and Benefits.
 - Motion by Foster to have the fishing fee included for all Village owned properties Seconded by Stanek. Carried by voice vote 3/0.



Northwestern Article / Outdoor Hub Report 2012

The DOT mounted signs reading, "Do Not Attach Poles to Bridge Rails." Well, the locals said that could not stand. But rather than stop and fight the DOT, the anglers adopted a trusty, time-honored legal maneuver: They ran for it, gambling that no cop, sheriff, or game warden would bother tackling them.

Sure enough, village elders winked and the state looked away as anglers mounted custom-designed rod-holders to the railings and kept fishing. This launched a cottage industry for local

craftsmen, who build wood and aluminum rod-holders custom-fit for the railings. Nelson and Boucher sell the holders for about \$10 each or two for \$18.

So, they're outlaws and accomplices, right?

"The fishermen aren't attaching rods to the bridge," Boucher said with a shrug. "They're attaching rod-holders, and rod-holders don't scratch the bridge. If the guys attached their rods with a bungee cord, they'd scratch it. They don't want the state spending money for repainting."

Boucher said this cooperative spirit makes the Winneconne bridge a great place to fish. Litter is seldom a problem, and squabbles are rare because most anglers quickly learn "bridge etiquette."

What does that entail? "Don't hog space, don't cast into boats, and if a guy nearby is fighting a fish, move your line out of the way," Boucher said. "When lifting your fish over the rail, don't fling it. I've seen fish fly off the hook and hit passing cars. If you use a landing net, watch the traffic as you swing the net over the rail. Some guys look the wrong way and almost hit passing vehicles."
