




FIGURE 2: Site Plan Spear Farm Boardwalk Project

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


FIGURE 3: BOARDWALK WETLAND CROSSING TYPICAL FOR WETLAND CROSSING #'s 1, 2, 4, and 5 Spear Farm Boardwalk Project

2. All proposed improvements and resource crossing locations are on existing established trails. Proposed improvements to WC-1, 2, 4, and 5 are 4-foot-wide pipe support boardwalks (Figure 3). WC-3 and WC-8 are located on the maintenance/emergency access route and proposed for upgrade to gravel hardened trail (Figure 4) and raised 7-foot-wide bridge (Figure 5) respectively.

3. Zoning: Low Density Residential, Resource Protection District, and Shoreland Overlay District

4. Waivers Requested: No waivers requested. The trail and associated structures are considered a Functionally Water Dependent Use as the primary purpose of the trails is to provide public access, visually and directly, to the Royal River Estuary and impounded freshwater pond.






