1st Order of Business: Roll Call of Members

2nd Order of Business: To approve the minutes of Meeting 2-19/20 held August 15, 2019 and Special Meeting 3-19/20 held September 5, 2019.

3rd Order of Business: To open the meeting to a public comment period.

Item No. 20: To hear the reports of the Council Chair, committees, delegates, liaisons and the Town Manager.

Item No. 21: To consider issuance of a malt, spirituous and vinous liquor license and Special Amusements Permit to Romeo's.

Item No. 22: To consider a resolution requesting that the Maine CDC declare a public health nuisance in the Town of Yarmouth (and region) due to brown tail moth infestations.

Background: The Town must seek a Public Health Nuisance declaration from the Maine CDC, in order to have the option of aerial spraying on private lands next spring. The proposed action is simply to request that declaration. If it is approved, the Town will have the option, but not the obligation to spray for Browntail Moth. If the Town is denied, the Council can consider alternative actions, including aerial spray on Town-owned lands and roadways.

At This Meeting: The Council will vote on this issue.

Item No. 23: To consider annual amendments to the General Assistance schedules, Appendices A-F of Chapter 504 of the Yarmouth Town Code and to schedule a public hearing thereon.

Background: The Council is obligated to update these schedules each October.

At This Meeting: Council will vote on this issue.

Item No. 24:

To consider an appropriation request from the Fire-Rescue Reserve for the Fire Training facility.

Background: The Town's Fire-Rescue Department received a \$443,800 grant to build a new regional fire training building along with the existing one at the Transfer Station. There are some additional costs of development not covered by the grant for items like site preparation and construction of a Tower. The Department is requesting \$85,000 to cover these costs.
